## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on July 27, 1895, at 2 p.m.

*Present* :—The Chairman ; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G. ; Dr. J. Attygalle ; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq. ; W. Abeyasundera, Esq. ; D. G. Goonewardena, Esq. ; R. L. Symes, Esq. ; N. Dias Abeyasingha, Esq. ; and C. P. Hayley, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on June 22, 1895, pursuant to notice dated June 17, 1895.
2. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "For a return to June 30, 1895, giving the number of cases of fever and the number of deaths from that cause since the outbreak of malarial fever at Talapitiya and other localities within Municipal limits."  
The Chairman laid on the table a return of the number of persons sick with fever on the 25th instant, and the number of deaths between July 15 and 25 instant.  
Dr. Anthonisz submitted a memorandum containing suggestions of remedial and preventative measures to be adopted during the epidemic.  
Resolved,—That it be translated into Sinhalese and Tamil and be printed in all three languages and circulated
3. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved "That as it is inexpedient to spend money on unproductive works while so much sickness and distress prevail within the Municipal limits, no further money be spent on the Victoria Park, and that moneys which have been already voted for it should be transferred to the relief fund."  
Seconded by Mr. Symes.  
Dr. Anthonisz moved as an amendment, "That the funds of the Municipality be spent on works and for purposes defined in the Ordinance contributing to the health and welfare of the taxpayers, on anything very urgently required."  
Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.  
Mr. D. G. Goonewardena moved as a second amendment, "That the present condition of the Park be maintained, and no money be spent in making improvements beyond the vote already made."  
Seconded by Mr. Abeyasundera.  
The Chairman put Mr. Goonewardena's motion to the vote, which was carried by 7 against 2.

4. Dr. Anthonisz hereupon, by leave of Council, withdrew the motions in his name in reference to the Victoria Park.
5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved, "With reference to the resolution of Council re-appointing the Special Committee on fort sanitation, that Rs. 30 be allowed for necessary experiments on that account."  
Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.—Carried.
6. Dr. Anthonisz, by leave of Council, withdrew the motion relating to the scavenging of the bazaar, notice of which he had given.
7. Dr. Anthonisz moved, pursuant to notice, "That the Municipal Inspectors be desired to visit localities where dhobies wash clothes and see that the water used for the purpose is clean. Where pools of water exist for washing clothes on the boundary of Municipal roads and outside the Municipal limits, the proper authorities be requested to have those pools cleaned out, and clothes not allowed to be washed in water which is saturated with silt. Such a pool exists on the northern side of the Hirimbura road between the 3rd and 4th milestones."  
Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.—Carried.  
Resolved,—That the Inspectors be directed to inspect all places within their respective wards where dhobies wash clothes, and to furnish a report as to their condition.
8. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "That a Special Committee be appointed for the purpose of inquiring into the sanitary defects of the town, and advising the Council as to the best means of remedying them, and also that authority be given to the Committee to incur the necessary expenses, not exceeding Rs. 500, in cases where remedial measures are urgently called for."  
Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.—Carried.  
Resolved,—That the Special Committee be composed of the Chairman, Dr. Anthonisz, Dr. Attygalle, Mr. C. P. Hayley, and Mr. Abdul Carim.
9. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. L. Symes moved "That the fencing of the Pavilion on the esplanade, proposed by me, and seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonewardena, and agreed to by the Council on November 3, 1894, be carried out without further delay."  
Seconded by Mr. Hayley.  
The motion being put to the vote, there were 3 in favour of it and 6 against it. The Chairman declared the motion lost.
10. Mr. Hayley, by leave of Council, withdrew the motion relating to golf playing in the Park, notice of which he had given.
11. Pursuant to notice Mr. Symes asked whether the resolution of Council passed on November 17 last "That the latrine and scavenging carts be housed and protected from the weather within the walled enclosure in Talbot town, and that the attention of the Municipal Inspector be invited to the insanitary state in which the enclosure is kept"—has been given effect to, and if not, why not? Also, whether the enclosure referred to is now used for Municipal purposes, and if not, by whom it is occupied, by whose authority, and what rent is being paid for it.  
The Chairman replied that the enclosure is occupied by the metal contractor, free of rent, and promised to visit the place and see that it is kept in a proper state.
12. By leave of Council Mr. Symes withdrew the motion regarding the above subject, notice of which he had given.
13. Pursuant to notice Mr. Symes asked "Why no commencement has yet been made of the side wall to the Kepu-ela—the subject of a motion by Mr. Abeyesundara on July 21, 1894,—when it was decided that the wall should be built in sections."  
The Chairman replied that there were no available funds for the work, as the vote for "Improvement of Drainage and Sanitation, Suburbs," has been otherwise appropriated by the Standing Committee.
14. Pursuant to notice Mr. Symes moved "That the work be proceeded with as soon as funds are available."  
Seconded by Mr. Goonewardena.—Carried.  
Resolved,—That the China Garden drain work lie over till next year.
15. Pursuant to notice Mr. Symes asked "For a return to be laid on the table of the various works ordered by the Council from June 30, 1894, to June 30, 1895, showing which of them have been completed, and in the case of any not completed, showing what progress has been made with them, and whether the works have been or are to be taken in hand by the Municipal Superintendent of Works or by contractor.  
The Chairman promised to furnish the statement asked for.
16. Read a letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated June 24, 1895, intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to permit the use by the Municipal Council of the piece of ground at Kaluwella, applied for by letter No. 30 of June 10, 1895.
17. Submitted a letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated June 27, 1895, requiring the Council to make a by-law fixing the rates and fares for rickshaws, and to transmit the same for approval or disallowance.  
Resolved,—That the following by-law be approved and forwarded to Government for approval:—  
The following shall be the rates and fares for jinrickshaws licensed to ply for hire within the Municipality of Galle:—

## Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended June 30, 1895.

The general health was very bad. Dysentery was reported in different parts of Ward No. 3. The outbreak of malarial fever mentioned in my last report raged in an epidemic form along the neighbourhood of the Mátara railway line and for some distance on either side, and played sad havoc among the poor, who died chiefly of starvation. Almost every family in Ward No. 3 was fever-stricken, and many of them had about half a dozen relapses or more, and children, old people, and the starved, exhausted by repeated attacks, ultimately succumbed to the disease. The total number of deaths registered during the quarter amounted to 119.

The first cases of fever were reported, I believe, in August, 1894, in different parts of Ward No. 3, near the railway line, while the railway operations and the extensive digging up of the soil on either side of the line were going on. This was due to emanations from the disturbed soil, and subsided in about two months. The present outbreak of fever commenced about the end of February, 1895, in Talapitiya and the neighbourhood along the railway line after the setting in of the hot weather and the consequent drying up of the large number of pools of stagnant water on either side of the line. With the persistence of the drought malarial emanations given off in abundance were carried by the wind to some distance on either side of the railway line and has invaded a very large area now.

These irregular excavations all along the railway line receive the surface water from a large area on either side, where surface pollution by human excrement is extant, and the water stagnating throughout the year pollutes the neighbouring wells and gives off malarial and other unhealthy emanations. These pools of stagnant water, besides being the cause of malaria, may give rise to an epidemic of typhoid fever, dysentery, cholera, &c., with disastrous consequences. These stagnant pools, which have proved a great source of danger to the public health, and which might be the cause of more serious epidemics than the present one, should be filled with virgin soil or sea sand up to

a certain level and connected so as to have a fall and efficiently drain the surface water of the extensive area on either side of the railway line into a neighbouring stream. This will greatly improve the drainage of Ward No. 3, which is very defective. The side drains of the different roads in the neighbourhood of the railway line should be so directed as to discharge into these railway drains and thence into the Pettigala-ela or some other neighbouring stream. The condition of the Pettigala-ela requires immediate attention. This is the most insanitary locality within the Municipality, and a great source of danger to the public health. It is, in fact, an open sewer, and makes matters worse by stagnating through the greater part of the year and polluting the air and the soil. Happily there are no drinking wells in the neighbourhood. The portion of built drain with the road along it is a great improvement, and has added to the health and appearance of the locality. The road and built drain should be continued after filling up the ela with sea sand so that the mud may not be disturbed.

Sanitary Report for June, 1895.

**Health.**—General health good. The return of deaths in the Municipality still shows a large proportion of bowel complaints. I am inclined to think that a factor in the causation of this class of diseases is the overcrowding of the native quarters and the want of proper conservancy.

**Drainage.**—The drains are now well flushed by heavy rains. I hope the Municipality will eventually have all defective drains relaid and cemented or glazed.

**Water.**—The supply is now good and abundant.

**Market.**—Satisfactory.

**Slaughter-House.**—Satisfactory. A large proportion of lean animals are sent for slaughter.

**Municipality of Colombo.**

IN accordance with the requirements of section 3 of the Opium and Bhang Ordinance, No. 9 of 1889, I hereby give notice that the licenses for the sale by retail of opium and bhang within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo, for the year commencing January 1, 1896, will, by resolution of the Municipal Council, be four in number. The said licenses will be put up to sale by public auction at this office at noon on Saturday, October 12, 1895, and they will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance, and under the following conditions, viz. :—

(1) That the place licensed shall be subject to inspection, and that no riotous or disorderly conduct be allowed to occur therein.

(2) That the place licensed shall not be kept open for the sale of opium or bhang at any time before the hour of 6 in the morning or after 9 in the evening.

(3) That the licensee shall cause to be painted or affixed in some conspicuous part of his shop his name, the number of the shop, and the words "Licensed to sell Opium by Retail."

(4) That no person other than the licensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium or bhang under his license either as agent or servant of such licensee, unless the name of such agent or servant be registered in the office of the Municipal Council with the sanction of the Chairman.

(5) Wholesale licenses will be issued only to retail dealers.
