GALLE MUNICIPALITY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on August 10, 1895, at 3.30 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; Dr. J. Attygalle; R. L. Symes, Esq.; and C. P. Hayley, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on July 27 last, pursuant to notice dated July 22.
2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved "that the Chairman be appointed a Member of the Committee appointed for improving the sanitation of the Fort."

Seconded by Dr. Anthonisz.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle asked, "What are the actual duties at present performed by the Sanitary Officer of the Municipality?"

The Chairman replied that he inspected the town; that he inquired into the causes, origin, and distribution of diseases, and advised the Council in matters relating to the public health; that he took the necessary action on the outbreak of an epidemic; that he inspected and reported on any nuisance brought to his notice by Inspectors; that he inspected every morning cattle intended for slaughter; that he inspected articles of food exposed for sale reported to him to be unwholesome, and caused them to be seized and dealt with according to law; that he furnishes quarterly reports to the Council; and that he examines the Inspectors' daily reports and make remarks on them.

4. In view of this explanation Dr. Attygalle, by leave of Council, withdrew the motion, notice of which he had given.

Resolved,—That the Sanitary Officer be requested to inspect meat exposed for sale in the public markets.

5. Submitted statement of works asked for by the Member of the Fort Ward at a Meeting held on the 27th ultimo.

6. Submitted report of the Special Committee appointed to inquire into the sanitary defects of the town, and to advise the Council as to the best means of remedying them.

The Chairman moved "that the report now submitted be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to apply to Government for the loan recommended chargeable on the rates and taxes of the Municipal Council, and for the acquisition of the lands required to carry out the proposals contained in the report."

Seconded by Mr. C. P. Hayley.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on September 4, 1895, at 3 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman and all the Members.

1. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked, "Why householders who have privies communicating with open side drains are not prosecuted, and if the matter has not been brought to the notice of the Executive Officers of the Council."

The Chairman replied that he was not aware of any privies communicating with side drains. He had inspected the privies to which reference had been made, and found that no such communication existed.

2. Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, No. 26 of August 29, in reply to the Council's application for a loan for sanitary improvements.

3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "that the motion for a Government loan of Rs. 30,000 be rescinded, as the Council considers that the works for which the loan is intended (not being of a pressing nature) could be executed from time to time from the Municipal funds as hitherto ; and that at present the pressing need is to stamp out the epidemic of malarial fever, which requires the active efforts of the executive Municipal Officers with a liberal expenditure of Municipal funds."

Seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonewardena.

The Chairman, Dr. Anthonisz, Messrs. Goonewardena, Hayley, and Symes addressed the Meeting.

The motion was put to the vote, with the following result :—

The votes being equal, the Chairman by his casting vote negatived the motion.

4. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "that it is desirable that the sanitary work should be entrusted to the Sanitary Officer and Sanitary Overseer with staff of coolies, and not, as it is at present, to the Superintendent of Works, who could not be expected to be acquainted with the causes of the spread of epidemic diseases, nor the mode of their propagation."

Dr. Attygalle seconded.

The Chairman ruled the motion out of order, as it trenchd on the executive power and responsibility vested on him by the 47th clause of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance of 1887. At the same time the Chairman pointed out that by a resolution of the Council passed on January 14, 1882, the duties of Head Inspector were thrown on the Superintendent of Works, and that it was in this capacity he supervised the sanitary works with overseers specially employed therein on salaries of Rs. 25 to Rs. 20. A temporary departure from this arrangement last year in regard to latrines had worked unsatisfactorily, and it is necessary to have a more highly paid officer immediately responsible for the quality of the work done, leaving to the Sanitary Officer the duty of inspection and suggestion, which he does most satisfactorily, but it is undesirable to make him responsible for the oversight of the coolies.

5. By leave of Council Dr. Anthonisz withdrew the next motion, notice of which he had given.
