PROCLAMATIONS BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

Notification of a Resolution abolishing the Ferry Toll at the Deduru-oya.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is amongst other things enacted that "it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to abolish any existing tolls or any tolls which may hereafter be legally established, anything in 'The Tolls Ordinance, 1867,' to the contrary notwithstanding":

It is hereby notified for general information that the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by virtue of powers conferred on him by the said Ordinance, has, by resolution of the 22nd day of November, 1895, abolished the toll established in respect of the ferry on the Deduru-oya river at Deduru-oya, in the District of Chilaw, as from and after this date.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 5th section of Ordinance No. 14 of 1867 it is amongst other things enacted that "whenever it shall be found necessary to build a bridge other than those specified in schedule C to the said Ordinance, the cost of which shall amount to five hundred pounds or more, it shall be

lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to direct that tolls not exceeding those specified in the 4th clause shall be levied in respect thereof” :

And whereas the bridge over the Deduru-oya river has been built at a cost exceeding five thousand rupees, and it is expedient to declare the tolls to be levied in respect thereof :

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation direct that from and after this date the tolls specified and set forth in the schedule hereto shall be levied in respect of the said bridge over the Deduru-oya river.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-second day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is amongst other things enacted that “it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places toll shall be collected, and to alter such places and other places to appoint for the collection thereof, anything which may be contained in ‘The Tolls Ordinance, 1867,’ to the contrary notwithstanding” :
