Bay of Bengal-Orissa Coast.-Balasore River-Iron Barrel Buoy gone adrift.

The Port Officer, Chandbally and Balasore, has given notice that the iron barrel buoy on the inner bay entrance to the approaches of the Burrabulong river and Balasore having broken adrift, a buoy will be placed there instead as early as practicable. The transit marks are in position and intact, which will be a guide to vessels in the absence of the lost buoy, which will be replaced immediately it is recovered.


