COUNCIL

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on May 21, 1895, at 3 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; Dr. J. Attygalle; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; William Abeyasundera, Esq.; N. Dias Abeyasinha, Esq.; D. G. Goonewardena, Esq.; F. W. Johnson, Esq.; and R. L. Symes, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. L. Symes asked, "Why only three Meetings of Council have been held-since.

December 14 last, instead of monthly as in terms of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance?"

The Chairman replied that Meetings were not more frequently called as there was not sufficient business to

place before the Council, and that he finds that in previous years the rule as to monthly Meetings was not strictly

Mr. Symes then moved "that Council Meetings in future be held regularly on the second Saturday of each month."

Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardena moved as an amendment "that it is desirable that Council Meetings be held in future on some Saturday of each month."

Seconded by Mr. N. Dias Abeyasinha.

Hereupon Mr. Symes withdrew his motion by leave of Council, and the amendment was carried.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. L. Symes asked "Why the resolution of Council of February 16, 'that the Bikke Reservoir be emptied immediately and cleaned,' was not carried out?"

The Chairman replied that the Standing Committee at a subsequent Meeting recommended that the water of the reservoir be not altogether run off, but that its level be reduced to the mouth of the lower service pipe, and that he waited to obtain the views of the Council on this recommendation before carrying into effect the resolution

Mr. Symes deferred making the motion on this subject, notice of which he had given, until the recommendation of the Standing Committee came up for discussion.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. L. Symes asked, "What reply has been received from the Director of Public Works with reference to the loan of a steam roller?"

In answer, the reply of the Director of Public Works dated February 22, 1895, was read.

-That the attention of the Director be invited to the subject. Resolved.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. L. Symes asked, "Whether Mr. Venign has fulfilled the conditions of his letter with regard to his Band, and also the conditions imposed by the Council with regard to the number of performers. If not, if he has been paid any sum or sums out of Municipal Council Fund, and if so, why?"

The Chirman replied that Mr. Veniga played four times in public in March and three times in April, and that he states that in March the Band consisted of ten men, two being unable to attend from illness.

Resolved, .- That the Fort Inspector be ordered to report the days on which the Band plays in public, and the number of performers on each occasion.

Mr. Symes moved "that he be paid nothing more until the terms of the grant have been complied with."

Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.

Mr. Abeyasun@era moved as an amendment "that Mr. Veniga be paid, provided that his Band consisted of not less than ten musicians, including himself." •

Seconded by Mr. F. W. Johnson.—Carried by seven against two.

6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "that carriages be permitted to drive in the Victoria park on Saturdays and Sundays, and that golf cease to be played there on those days, and that a second entrance for carriages be made by the side of the House of Observation."

Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.

By leave of Council Dr. Anthonisz amended his motion as follows: "That golf be not permitted to be played in the Victoria park on Tuesdays, Fridays, and Sundays, and that a second entrance for carriages be made by the side of the House of Observation."

Seconded by Dr. Attygalle.—Carried.

Considered a letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Government Agent, Southern Province, and forwarded by him for the information of Council on the subject of the inspection of cases of infectious diseases within Municipal limits.

Dr. Anthonisz moved "that Government be asked to explain more fully their intentions with regard to the treatment of cases of infectious diseases occurring within Municipal limits after January 1 next."

Seconded by Mr. W. Abeyasundera,-Carried.

Dr. Attygalle moved "that the Sanitary Officer be required to undertake at once the inspection, disinfection, and transport of all cases of infectious diseases."

Dr. Anthonisz seconded.

Mr. N. Dias Abeyesinha moved as an amendment "that the consideration of the matter be deferred until a reply is received from Government to the request made in Dr. Anthonisz' motion."

Seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonewardena.—Carried by five against two, the Chairman and Mr. R. L. Symes

declining to vote.

moved by Mr. Abdul Carim "that an enclosure is not necessary, and that none be put up, as its effect will be to exclude the public from having free access to the building, except on occasions when specially authorized by the Council."

Seconded by Mr. W. Abeyasundera. Mr. Symes moved as an amendment "that the enclosure to the Pavilion having been decided on at a previous Meeting of Council, and the fence being ready to be put up, the matter be not re-considered, and that the Government be furnished with the information required by their letter No. 12 of April 20, 1895."

Seconded by Mr. F. W. Johnson.

The amendment was put to the wote and lost, two voting for and four against it.

The Chairman declared the original motion carried.

Resolved,—That the application made to Government for permission to erect the fence be withdrawn.

9. Submitted report of the Provincial Engineer, Southern Province, on providing a water sewage system for the Galle Fort.

Resolved,—That the report be referred to the Special Committee on Fort sanitation.

- 10. Submitted the following recommendations of the Standing Committee :-
 - (1) Recommended that the water of the reservoir be not altogether run off, but that its level be reduced. to the mouth of the lower service pipe.

 This recommendation being put to the vote it was approved, five being in favour and four against it.

 (2) Recommended that the Special Committee on Fort sanitation appointed in 1894 be re-appointed.—

- (3) Resolved that application be made to Government to hand over the Crown land at Kaluwella to the Council, and to instruct the Government Agent to ascertain at what price the two houses shown in the sketch can be acquired.

Resolution of Standing Committee approved.

11. Submitted Sanitary Officer's report for first quarter of 1895, and his special report on an outbreak of fever at Talapitiva and Dangedara.

Resolved,—That copies of the reports be forwarded to Government, and that attention be called to the causes.

12. The question of fixing the rates or fares to be paid for jinrickshaws that are let out for hire having been brought up for consideration, it was resolved that Government be asked to make a by-law in terms of section 10 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1873 fixing the fares as follows:—

For the first half hour or portion of half hour 25
For every subsequent half hour or portion thereof ... 10

- 13. Submitted an application from Mr. E. Coates to have the tree overhanging his office cut down. Resolved,—That on Mr. Coates paying the appraised value of the tree an order do issue for its removal.
- 14. Submitted (1) Auditor's Report for first four months of 1895; (2) Superintendent's Reports on Permanent Repair of Roads and Progress of Works for April, 1895.
 - 15. Submitted accounts for April, 1895.
- 16. The Meeting, in terms of section 88 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, elected Mr. F. W. Johnson a Member of the Standing Committee in room of Mr. H. E. H. Hayes, who has left.

Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended March 31, 1895.

The General Health was bad. Measles and chickenpox prevailed in the different wards during the quarter. Few cases of tyhoid fever occurred in Ward No. 4 and the Fort. In the Fort typhoid fever is chiefly due to emanation from foul-smelling cesspits, and cases of this nature will continue to appear until the compits are dispensed with. Outside the Fort typhoid fever is generally due to infected water. The surface washings infected by human excrement find access to wells which are generally situated on low ground unprotected by a wall. I have known instances where whole families were struck down with typhoid fever by drinking water from such infected wells. To prevent such sad mishaps I would suggest :-

(1) To direct the Inspector of each ward to send a list of wells the water of which is used for drinking purposes, marking in each case whether (according to his judgment) the water is good, suspicious, or bad, so that after further examination certain wells may be set apart as having water fit for drinking purposes.

(2) To build a wall round the mouth of each well to prevent direct entrance of contaminated water and other foreign substances. This will prevent the accidental falling in of animals, &c.

(3) To pay periodical visits and remove any other possible sources of contamination of the water, special attention being paid to surface pollution by human excrement. Where cesspits exist they should be at a reasonable

distance from the well, and properly cemented. There was an outbreak of malarial fever among the Moorish community at Talapitiya. This may be attributed to the bad drainage of this locality and the filthy condition of the tank opposite the mosque owing to the absence of

proper drains to carry away the surface water, which saturates the low sandy soil and renders the houses damp and unhealthy. Malarial fever was prevailing in different parts of Ward No. 3 during this quarter. Perhaps the digging up of the soil along the Matara Railway Extension and the stagnation of water in the excavations may have contributed to the outbreak of malarial fever in Ward No. 3. The prevalence of ague in most villages along the Mátara line confirms my suspicions.

Municipal Latrines were kept clean. All the latrines should be improved after the China Garden latrine to ensure better cleanliness.

Street Sweeping and Scavenging were satisfactory.
