**T**HE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Badulla, under section 14 of the Ordinance No. 27 of 1890, and approved by the Governor in Executive Council, are published for general information.

1. Water shall not be drawn from the public standpipes otherwise than into a vessel or receptacle.
2. The public standpipes shall not be used for the purposes of bathing or washing of persons or animals, or clothes or any other thing.
3. No contrivance of any kind whatever shall be used for fixing the handles of the standpipes in order to secure a continuous flow of water.
4. No person shall lay or have any communication or service pipes for the conveyance of water from any of the mains or branches into any house, land, or premises without the sanction of, or leave of, the Chairman, Local Board, nor shall any such pipes be laid except by the employes of the Board, nor until the Board shall have approved the point or place at or through which the same shall be laid.
5. If any person shall, contrary to the provisions of the preceding by-laws, lay or have any such communication or service pipes, it shall be lawful for the Chairman, Local Board, to direct and order the same to be removed.
6. No owner or occupier of a house or any other person drawing water shall allow water from any cistern, standpost, hydrant, pipe, valve, or stop cock to run to waste, but shall use all ordinary measures to stop the wasteful flow of water.
7. No person shall do anything whereby the water in any standpost, cistern, pipe, or vessel belonging to the Board shall be in any degree polluted, fouled, or corrupted, or shall in any way tamper with, or interfere with, the water in such standposts, cisterns, pipes, or vessels.
8. No person shall bathe or wash any part of his or her body, or any clothes, or any animals, or any articles of whatever description at the standposts, fountains, cisterns, pipes, or vessels belonging to the Local Board, erected and built or to be hereafter erected or built in the public streets, thoroughfares, and other places within the said Local Board.

## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, July 12, 1895.**

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 6, 1895.

*Present*:—Mr. F. H. Price, Acting Chairman and Mayor; Capt. F. Bayley; Mr. M. Finlay; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. E. Creasy; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Hon. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alvis.

The Minutes of June 14, 1895, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of June 14, 1895, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Captain Bayley asked "the reason why such large metal is being used in repairs to roads, and inquired if there is any difference in the cost of the metal now being used and of the smaller metal which was formerly laid down; if so, how much per cubic yard."

The Chairman stated that the Superintendent of Works had explained that he had to put great pressure upon the quarry men to increase their output of metal to the utmost, and that a proportion of the metal delivered had in consequence been larger than his standard; that the cost was the same, the explanation being that the large metal is an improper delivery for the standard, which is 2½ inches.

Captain Bayley moved "that the Superintendent be directed in the future to use metal for repairing roads not larger than 2 inches cube."

Dr. Vanderstraaten seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved "that by-law No. 1 in chapter I. in the schedule attached to Ordinance 16 of 1881 be amended by the substitution of the words 'Superintendent of Works' for the words 'Superintendent of Roads.'"

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved "for a return giving the names of the Members of the Council for each year from 1865 to 1895."

By leave of Council, the following words were added to the motion, "and the attendance of each Member at the Meetings of Council each year."

The motion so amended was seconded by Mr. C. M. Fernando and carried.

The return originally required was laid on the table.

4. A statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to June 30, 1895, and Progress Reports of Works done during May and June, 1895, were laid on the table.

5. The following recommendations made by the Standing Committee, on June 7 and 28 and on July 5, 1895, were laid before the Council:—

*June 7.*

20. Application to lease portion of river frontage made available by removal of bridge-of-boats.

Resolved,—That the matter be left to the Chairman.

*June 28.*

12. Further remark by the Auditor-General on the accounts for January, 1895.

Surcharge noted.

15. Letter from Colonial Secretary, suggesting widening of Queen street and removal of Sir E. Barnes statue.

Resolved,—That an estimate be obtained for the erection of a suitable wall, and that the work be recommended to the Council.

*July 5.*

2. To consider, under section 114 of 7 of 1887, the transfer from vote 27 in Supplemental Budget of the amount required for a wall on the eastern side of the Gordon Gardens.

Resolved,—That the estimate of Rs. 2,530 be passed, and that the transfer of this amount for the purpose from vote 27 in the Supplemental Budget be recommended to the Council.

3. To provide (under section 114 of Ordinance 7 of 1887) a sum of Rs. 27-17 from vote No. 47 in Supplemental Budget to meet excess of vote No. 42 in Supplemental Budget (Estimate No. 278 of 1894).

Resolved,—That the specified transfer be recommended to the Council.

15. Estimate for repair of boundary wall and fence of the Madampitiya Cemetery (Rs. 340).

Resolved,—That the transfer of Rs. 340 for the purpose from vote 27 in Supplemental Budget be recommended to the Council.

Resolved,—That the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council be obtained for the lease of the land referred to in paragraph 20 of the Standing Committee's Minutes of June 7, 1895.

Resolved, with reference to the surcharge referred to in paragraph 12 of the Minutes of June 28, 1895, that the expenditure be sanctioned.

Resolved,—That the recommendations in paragraph 15 of the Minutes of June 28 and paragraphs 2, 3, and 15 of the Minutes of July 5 be approved.

With reference to the question of the removal of General Barnes' statue referred to in paragraph 15, Captain Bayley moved "that His Excellency the Governor be informed that this Council approves of the removal of the statue to the site proposed in the Gordon Gardens."

6. A letter No. 84 of June 26, 1895, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the duplication of the water main, and a memorandum on the subject dated July 3, 1895, from the Chairman, having been previously printed and circulated, were laid before the Council.

Resolved,—That the Council do go into Committee on the question.

The Council having resumed, Mr. C. Perera moved "that it be pointed out to Government, with reference to the second paragraph of the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 84 of June 26, 1895, that the consent of the Municipal Council to contribute towards the cost of duplicating the water main has throughout been contingent on the payment to the Council of either the toll over the Kelani bridge or its equivalent; further, with reference to the third paragraph of the same letter, that the Council adheres to its stipulation that no regulations under section 34 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1886 and section 4 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1891, relating to the supply and control of water, be made, varied, or repealed without a reference to the Municipal Council; further, with reference to the fourth paragraph of the same letter, that the payment in question is made on the condition specified in the first paragraph of the Chairman's letter No. 154 of September 15, 1891.

Mr. Alvis seconded.—Carried.

7. A copy of a letter No. 899/06803 dated May 27, 1895, from the Colonial Secretary to the Director of Public Works, forwarded for the information of the Chairman, with reference to the lighting of the Victoria Bridge, was laid before the Council, after previous circulation.

Resolved,—That the thanks of this Council be conveyed to His Excellency the Governor, and that Government be asked if the sum of Rs. 4,909-25 may be devoted to lighting the bridge with electricity, should the Council prefer it to gas.

8. A letter No. 90 of July 3, 1895, from the Colonial Secretary, about the conversion of the Kachcheri grass garden into a recreation ground, was laid before the Council.

Mr. Dias moved "that the papers be referred to a Committee consisting of the Chairman, Hon. R. K. MacBride, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraeten, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. C. P. Dias, and Mr. C. M. Fernando, to report on the matter—three members to form a quorum."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. A letter No. 91 of July 4, 1895, from the Colonial Secretary, was read, intimating the appointment of Mr. W. H. Moor as Municipal Magistrate.

10. A letter No. 59 of May 29, 1895, from the Colonial Secretary, relating to the site of the new latrine, St. John's road, was laid before the Council with connected papers.

Resolved,—That the Council approves of the site specified in the Chairman's letter No. 123 of June 19, 1895, to the Colonial Secretary.

11. A memorandum dated July 1, 1895, from the Chairman, on tramways, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

A letter dated June 21, 1895, from Mr. Mathews, was also laid before the Council, intimating appointment of Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., Ltd., as his Agents in Colombo, and also letters dated July 9 and 11, 1895, from Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., with reference to their appointment as Agents by Mr. Mathews.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that this Council will consider Mr. Mathews' application for time on his depositing on or before the 31st instant the sum of Rs. 10,000, to be forfeited if the work is not commenced on such terms and conditions as may be imposed and before the expiration of the time, should the Council grant any extension, the Council being of opinion that the contract has lapsed."

Captain Bayley seconded.—Carried.

12. A letter dated June 4, 1895, from Mr. H. Fernando, on the proposed widening of Cramer's lane, was laid before the Council.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne moved, "that the decision of the Chairman, approved by the Standing Committee on the May 31, 1895, be confirmed, except that the width of the road be reduced to 22 feet."

Dr. Vanderstraeten seconded.—Carried.

13. A list of the lands, for the lease of which the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council is required under clause 164 of Ordinance 7 of 1887 and clause 13 of Ordinance 26 of 1890, was laid before the Council.

Resolved,—That the required sanction be applied for, and that the list be circulated.

14. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for February, 1895, received with letter No. 37 of June 15, 1895, were laid on the table.

15. Further remarks by the Auditor-General on the accounts for March and September, 1893, and May and November, 1894, were laid before the Council.
