## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### GALLE MUNICIPALITY.

N terms of section 4 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1893, and section 5 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1889, notice is hereby given L that licenses, as enumerated below, for the retail sale of opium for the year commencing January 1, 1899, will be put up for sale by public auction at the Municipal Office, Galle, on Monday, October 17, 1898, at 1 o'clock P.M., and they will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinance :-

#### Conditions of Sale.

That the place licensed shall not be open to the public before 6 A.M. or after 9 P.M. 1.

That the place licensed shall be subject to inspection, and that no disorderly conduct be permitted therein. 2. 3. That the place licensed be always kept clean.

That the place licensed have no internal communication with other rooms or passages, and that the interior thereof be open to public view.

That no opium be sold to any woman or any child under the age of 15, or to any intoxicated person. That no opium be consumed on the premises, whether by swallowing, chewing, smoking, or in any other 6. manner whatsoever.

7. That the licensee shall affix in some conspicuous part of his shop a board with his name, the number of the shop, and the words "Licensed to Sell Opium by Retail " painted on it.

8. That no person other than the licensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium under his license, either as agent or servant of the licensee, unless the name of such agent or servant be first registered in the Municipal Office. Wholesale licenses will be issued only to retail dealers.

#### COLOMBO MUNICIPALITY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, August 12, 1898.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 6, 1898.

Present:—Mr. W. E. Davidson, Chairman; Mr. H. van Cuylenburg; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. Stanley Bois; Mr. P. D. Warren; the Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. Arthur Alvis; and Mr. James Peiris.

The Minutes of July 8, 1898, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,-That the Minutes of July 8, 1898, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Walter Percira moved "that professional opinion be taken, as to whether the width of the groove of the tram lines now being laid in Colombo is in accordance with the terms of the concession granted by the Council."

By leave of Council the words " and that the replies of those Engineers for whose opinion the Chairman has applied be laid on the table at the next Meeting " were added to this motion.

Mr. C. Perera seconded - Carried.

2. The following motion standing in the name of Mr. Walter Pereira was withdrawn by leave of Council :----That the attention of Government be invited to section 11 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887, and to the necessity of amending it so as to restrict the right of graduates of universities to vote at elections of Councillors for those divisions only in which such graduates reside.

3. Notice was given of the following question by Mr. R. H. Morgan, but in his absence it was not put to the Council :-- To ask the Chairman whether he received a petition dated December 6, 1897, from one Gregory Perera, and what reply was given thereto.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—Whether a letter had been received from the Rector of St. Joseph's College applying for permission to bury night soil in the premises. The Chairman replied in the affirmative.

5. Mr. C. Perera then moved "that the letter be laid on the table and considered, in terms of section 2 of the by-laws published in the Government Gazette of December 31, 1897.

Mr. James Peiris seconded.

The letter and connected correspondence having been laid on the table and considered, Mr. A. Alvis moved " that the Council confirm, in review, the decision of the Chairman with regard to the application from the Rector of St. Joseph's College.'

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.-Motion carried unanimously.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-What measures have been adopted during the last two months 6. to prevent the spread of cattle disease within the town, and if the Chairman is aware of any steps taken by Government in regard to the same in the suburbs of the town.

The Chairman, in reply, read his letter No. 144 to the Government, and laid on the table statistics showing, wards, the number of cases and deaths from cattle disease which had occurred between July 10 and August 10. He laid on the table copies of the various departmental orders issued by him, and explained the preventive measures taken within Municipal limits, and drew attention to the Government Agent's letter No. 2,498 of July 20, in which the Government Agent states that he proposes to leave the matter in the hands of the Chairman, as he has no machinery within Municipal limits to enable him to deal with the case. He was unable to furnish information as to the action taken by the Government outside Municipal limits.

7. The following motion standing in the name of Mr. C. Perera was, by leave of Council, withdrawn :-That the papers in connection with cattle disease be laid on the table.

[The Chairman undertook to circulate the papers.]

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. James Peiris moved "that a public latrine be erected on some suitable spot in the vicinity of the Municipal market in Slave Island in place of the one lately removed."

By leave of Council the motion was amended as follows :--- " That a public latrine be erected on some suitable spot convenient to the public who frequent the Municipal market at Slave Island." Mr. C Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

It was further resolved by the Council that a Committee consisting of the Chairman, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Mr. C. Perera, and the mover-three to form a quorum-be appointed to select a site and to report to the Council.

At this stage the Council adjourned till the 13th instant, at 8 A.M.

#### Adjourned Meeting.

In terms of the motion for adjournment the Council resumed this day at 8 A.M., when the following Members were present :--Mr. W. E. Davidson, Chairman; Dr.J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. P. D. Warren; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. Arthur Alvis; and Mr. James Peiris.

9. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of July 6, 13, 20, and 27, and August 1 and 5, 1898, were laid before the Council :--

Extract from Minutes of Standing Committee.-Wednesday, July 6, 1898.

Present:-W. E. Davidson, Esq., Chairman; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Chas. Perera, Esq.; Chas. P. Dias, Esq.; and Arthur Alvis, Esq.

- (11) Application from the Chief Clerk, Mr. Raffel, for increase of salary.
- (11) Recommended to Council that the salary of the post of the Chief Clerk be raised to Rs. 2,500 per annum; and that the Chairman be authorized to revise the salaries attached to the other senior clerks at a total additional cost not to exceed Rs. 500.
  - Mr. C. Perera adds that, while he supports the recommendation that the salary of the post of the Chief Clerk should be raised to Rs. 2,500, he considers that the duties of the post should be discharged by the officer who draws the salary.

Wednesday, July 13, 1898.

- (16) Letter from R. Ponniah, Supervisor for 3rd and 4th Divisions of the Health Department, for increase of jinricksha allowance.
- (17) Papers with reference to encroachment on De Waas' lane.
- (18) Papers relating to land for a recreation ground at Bambalapitiya.
- (16) A 4th Supervisor should be appointed for the 4th Division. The pay of all four Supervisors should be raised to Rs. 60 a month, plus the jinricksha allowances.
- (17) Approved Chairman's memorandum of July 5. Recommended that the Municipal Council be advised to adopt the Chairman's suggestions, which should be circulated. The lane should be 16 ft. wide.
- (18) Approved Chairman's memorandum of July 6. Recommended that the papers be printed and laid before the Council with a recommendation that application be made to the Government to allow a portion of 5 acres to be set apart for a recreation ground under lease to the Municipal Council at a nominal rent, the grounds to be improved and maintained by the Municipal Council.

Wednesday, July 20, 1898.

(3) Papers with reference to wall round the Roman Catholic portion of the General Cemetery.

- (4) Letter from Messrs. Boustead Brothers (1) stating that they will not be responsible after six months, from July 13, 1898, for upkeep of the whole road where the tramway tracks have been constructed on the Grandpass route, viz., from the junction of Nagalagam street and Madampitiya road to the junction of Front street and Main street, Pettah, and on the Maradana route from the Police Station at Borella to the Maradana Junction railway bridge; (2) asking the Council to take over the roads in question; (3) undertaking that they will attend to that portion lying between the rails and for 18 in. on either side as specified in clause 13 of the agreement; (4) and adding that they are prepared to carry out their obligations under clause 12, sub-section 9, of the agreement, should it be proved that the Council has been put to any expenditure in excess of what is ordinarily spent in the repair of the roads in question, as a result of the opening or breaking up the same for the tramway lines.
- (3) The Standing Committee recommend to the Municipal Council that permission be granted to the Trustee of the Roman Catholic section of the General Cemetery to erect a dwarf ornamental railing, not to exceed three ft. in height round the portion allotted to them.
  - height, round the portion allotted to them. The railing shall contain at least four gateways, and as many more as the Chairman may from time to time think necessary. These gates should not be locked.
  - The wall already commenced must first be demolished, and this permission is to be dependent on the removal of the wall.
- (4) Resolved that the letter dated July 13 from Messrs. Boustead Brothers for the tramway routes be laid before the Municipal Council, and that the Municipal Council be recommended to acknowledge receipt of the notice under clause 12, section 5, of the contract, with respect to those portions of the tramway routes, viz., on the Grandpass route from the junction of Nagalagam street and Madampitiya road to the Junction of Front street and Main street, Pettah, and on the Maradana route from the Police Station at Borella to the Maradana Junction railway bridge.

- (8) The design is recommended for approval of the Council, after the incorporation of the im-provements suggested by the Superintendent of Works.
  - (17) The Chairman's proposal is recommended for adoption by the Council.
  - (18) The sanction of an increase of Rs. 10 per annum is recommended to the Council.

#### Friday, August 5, 1898.

Present :- W. E. Davidson, Esq., Chairman; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; the Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne; Chas. Perera, Esq.; and Arthur Alvis, Esq.

- (2) Letter from Messrs. Boustead Brothers informing that they have arranged to use Korting and Mathieson lamps on the Fort arc lighting instead of Jandus arc lamp.
- (3) Application from Mr. H. L. Wendt and others to lease a site in the Cinnamon Gardens for use as a lawn tennis and croquet ground.
- (4) Auditor-General's further remarks on query No. 375 on revenue accounts for July, 1897.
- (5) Application from Manager, Health Department, for a travelling or house allowance and for extra clerical assistance.
- (11) Petition from Abdul Majeed, Turkish Consul, and other residents of Old Moor street, New Moor street, Messenger street, and Kuruwe street, praying that a mutton stall be allowed to be opened at No. 87, Messenger street.

- (2) Resolved that the Municipal Council be recommended to approve of the substitution of Korting and Mathieson lamps in lieu of Jandus lamps, subject to the Council's right to reject these lamps if hereafter they should not prove satisfactory.
- (3) The Municipal Council is recommended, subject to the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council, to grant on a lease, at the rate of Rs. 20 per acre per annum, the extent of 4 acres 3 roods 2 perches land in the Victoria park within the boundaries marked A, B, C, D in the annexed tracing, on the conditions that no building, whether temporarily or otherwise, be placed thereon without the sanction of the Council, and that the Council be at liberty to resume possession at any time.
- (4) Resolved that the Municipal Council be recommended to strike off as irrecoverable the item of Rs. 1,397.17 due by I. L. Amala Marikar for arrears of rent and costs of suit.
- (5) Resolved that the Municipal Council be recommended to appoint a separate Accountant for the Health Department at Rs. 600 per annum.
- (11) Resolved that the Municipal Council be recommended to grant, as an exception, a renewal of the license to the mutton butcher at No. 87, Messenger street, until December 31, 1898. (Mr. Seneviratne dissents.)

Mr. Coomaraswamy moved " that items 11 of July 6 and 16, 17, and 18 of July 13 be adopted." . Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.-Carried.

With regard to the second part of item 11, the Council authorized the Chairman to revise the salaries attached to the other senior clerks at a total additional cost not to exceed Rs. 500.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that items 3 and 4 of July 20 and 8, 17, and 18 of July 27, 3 of August 1, 2, 3, 4. S, and 11 of August 5 of the foregoing recommendations of the Standing Committee be also adopted; but that with regard to resolution 3 of the Minutes of the Standing Committee of July 20, 1898, the words 'to be approved by the Chairman' be added after the word 'railing,' and that the height of the railing be fixed at 3½ ft." Mr. A. Alvis seconded.—Carried.

10. The report of the Special Committee appointed to select a site to erect a public latrine at some convenient place in Maradana having been laid on the table, Mr. C. Perera moved "that the report do stand over for consideration with the report of the Special Committee on overcrowding." Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

[The Council desired that the recommendation contained in the fourth paragraph of the above report be put into force at once.]

11. The report of the Special Committee on the organization of the fire brigade and on all points connected therewith having been laid on the table, the Council resolved to go into Committee to consider the report and report to the Council thereon.

The Council in Committee.

The Council having resumed, the Committee brought up the following report :-

(1) That the report of the Special Committee be forwarded to Government, and that Government be moved to introduce an Ordinance on lines similar to those of the Imperial Act 28 and 29, Victoria, Caput 90, requiring Fire Insurance Companies to contribute towards the cost and maintenance of the establishment necessary for the prevention and extinction of fires.

(2) That the Government be moved to make a contribution towards the maintenance of the Municipal fire brigade, and that, pending a reply on these issues by the Government, the further consideration of the report be postponed until the General Meeting of Council in October.

Mr. A. Alvis moved the adoption of the foregoing report of the Committee of the whole Council.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.-Carried unanimously.

12. The report of Special Committee appointed to inquire into the question of the distribution of the water supply in Colombo having been laid on the table, Mr. James Peiris moved "that the report of the Special Committee be adopted, that a copy of it be forwarded to Government, and that the attention of the Government be specially invited to section 6 of the report."

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.-Carried.

13. Papers with reference to the deviation of the main road at Uplands having been laid on the table, the Council resolved to go into Committee to consider the papers. The Council in Committee.

The Council having resumed, Mr. James Peiris moved "that a Committee consisting of the Chairman, the Surveyor-General, the Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, Mr. R. H. Morgan, and Mr. A. Alvis be appointed to consider the correspondence and report upon it to the Council-three to form a quorum

Mr. C. Perera seconded.-Carried.

14. Sanitary Officer's report for second quarter, 1898, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

15. Statements of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to July 30, 1898, and Progress Report of Work done for July, 1898, were laid on the table.

16. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for March, 1898, were laid on the table.

17. The City Analyst's report on the town water for July, 1898, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

18. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on shops used for the sale of kerosine, poison, and gunpowder for July, 1898, were laid on the table.
