India, West—Sindh Coast—Changes at the Mouths of the Indus.

The Officer in charge, Marine Survey of India, has given notice, that the spit in the neighbourhood of the Kakaiwari mouth, lat. 23° 51' N., long. 67° 30' E., no longer exists. The edge of the sand and mud dry at low water extends from Hajamro beacon S.E. for 22 miles to lat. 23° 50' N., long. 67° 34' E., then E. by S. 8 miles and E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. 7 miles, to lat. 23° 50' N., long. 67° 49' E. On the southern part of this bank the 5-fathom line is about 1 mile from the breakers. The position of the 10-fathom line has not materially altered.

China—South-East Coast—Hongkong Harbour—Buoyage.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 653 of 1895) that on August 29, 1895, the two buoys (red and white in horizontal stripes) marking the western end of Central Fairway, of the western entrance into Hongkong harbour, would each show a fixed red light.

The southern of these two buoys is situated with the Sailor's Home bearing S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant 4 cables.

China—North-East Coast—Shantung Promontory—Non-existence of reported Rock to the Eastward.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 307 of 1885, on the existence of a rock in approximately lat. 36° 59' N., long. 122° 41' E., on which the barque Comet is reported to have struck, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 656 of 1895) that this rock has recently been unsuccessfully searched for by H.M.S. *Æolus*; and from other information received it seems not improbable that the Comet struck on the reef extending from Cape Macartney.

The rock has therefore been removed from the Admiralty Charts.

Japan—Nipon—North-West Coast—Light at entrance of Sakata Harbour.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 657 of 1895) that a light was exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the southern side of the entrance to Sakata harbour.

Sakata light is a fixed white light, elevated 54 ft. above the sea, and visible from No. 25° E., through east and south, to N. 66° W., a distance of six miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse, 30 ft. high, is hexagonal in shape, constructed of wood and painted white.

Approximate position: lat. 38° 57' 30" N., long. 130° 50' 0" E.

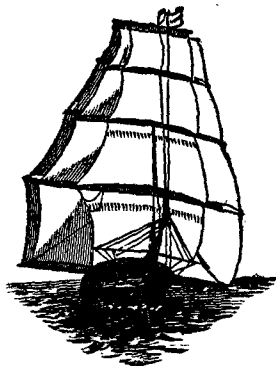
