MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, November 8, 1895.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 2, 1895.

Present :--Mr. F. H. Price, Acting Chairman and Mayor of Colombo; Hon. Sir John J. Grinlinton; Captain F. Bailey; Hon. R. K. MacBride, C.M.G.; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alvis. The Minutes of October 11, 18, and 22, 1895, having been printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each

Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,-That the Minutes of October 11, 18, and 22, 1895, be confirmed.

A Supplemental Budget, approved by the Standing Committee on October 29, 1895, was laid before 1. the Council.

Mr. Alvis moved the sanction of the Supplemental Budget.

Sir John J. Grinlinton seconded.-Carried.

2. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to October 31, 1895, and a Progress Report of Work done during October, 1895, were laid on the table. PART V.-Page 11

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3. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of October 10 and 26, 1895, were laid before the Council :---

October 10.

(12) Papers relating to a proposal for removal of existing market and latrine at Kollupitiya.

Resolved, on the recommendation of the Member for the Ward, that the Council be advised to remove the Kollupitiya market.

October 26.

(6) Tenders for the lease of the boutiques in St. John's road.

Resolved that the tenders of S. Slema, A. A. Fernando, and Badameah, of Rs. 35 each, be accepted, on condition that the lessees undertake to keep the buildings in repair.

Mr. Alvis moved "that the recommendation of October 10, relating to the removal of the Kollupitiya market, be not adopted."

Mr. C. M. Fernando seconded.

Sir John J. Grinlinton moved as an amendment "that when a suitable site for another market in some other part of the Ward has been selected, the question of the removal of the present market be then considered.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The original motion having been withdrawn by leave of Council in favour of the amendment, the amendment was carried.

Resolved,-That the recommendation of October 26, with reference to the lease of the boutiques in St. John's road, be adopted.

4. A letter No. 151 of October 23, 1895, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the proposal to form a street along the approach road to the Victoria bridge, and a memorandum from the Chairman on the subject, were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the papers be referred for consideration and report to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Captain F. Bailey, Hon. R. K. MacBride, C.M.G., Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna, and Mr. C. Perera three Members to form a quorum."

Mr. Alvis seconded.-Carried.

5. A letter dated October 29, 1895, from Messrs. Boustead Brothers, submitting a proposal to construct and operate tramways in Colombo, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the proposal be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Captain F. Bailey, Hon. R. K. MacBride, C.M.G., Mr. C. Perera, Mr. C. M. Fernando, and Mr. A. Alvis - three Members to form a quorum."

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna seconded.

Mr. Dias moved as an amendment "that it is premature to consider Messrs. Boustead Brothers' proposal." Mr. C. M. Fernando seconded.

The amendment was, by leave of Council, withdrawn, and the original motion was carried.

6. A letter dated October 31, 1895, from the Commanding Royal Engineer, and connected papers with reference to the bathing-place near the Echelon Barracks, were laid before the Council.

Sir John J. Grinlinton moved "that the papers be referred to the Committee appointed on October 11, 1895, to consider the general question of bathing places in the lake, and that Mr. MacBride be added to the Committee.'

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.-Carried.

A letter dated October 21, 1895, from the Shroff, applying for six or twelve months' leave in consequence of ill-health, and proposing that his assistant, Mr. F. X. Adaman, be allowed to act for him on his furnishing fresh security on his own account, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that six months' leave be granted to the Shroff."

Mr. Alvis seconded.-Carried.

8. The City Analyst's report, dated November 6, 1895, on the town water for October, 1895, was laid on the •table, having been previously printed and circulated.

9. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages and kerosine, poison, and gunpowder shops for November, 1895, were laid on the table.
