MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on November 16, 1895, at 3.30 p.m.

Present.—The Chairman; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; Dr. J. Attygalle; R. L. Symes, Esq.; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; W. Abeyasundera, Esq.; and N. Dias Abeyasinha, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

2. Mr. C. P. Hayley now brought forward the motion which was deferred to this Meeting from the Meeting held on October 19 last, viz. :—

That the by-laws of the Colombo Municipality on dogs be adopted by this Council, with the alteration that their application be confined to the police limits of the Municipality.

By-laws on Dogs under Section 129 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

(1) That a yearly tax of 75 cents be recovered from the owner of each dog kept within the police limits of the Municipality.

(2) It shall not be lawful for any person to keep any dog within the police limits of the Municipality without a license from the Municipal Council, and such license shall be obtained on or before February 1 every year, or within twenty-one days of acquiring such dog, and shall be issued on payment of the tax leviable thereon, and cease to be in force on December 31 every year. Every person who shall, after February 1, 1896, keep a dog within the police limits of the Municipality without taking out a license shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10.

(3) All dogs found in any street or public place without a collar bearing the stamps of the Municipal Council shall be liable to seizure by the police or any person authorized thereunto by the Chairman of the Municipal Council, and to be conveyed to the Municipal pound, and may be destroyed or sold unless redeemed and furnished with such collar within forty-eight hours of the time of seizure.

(4) Collars of an uniform kind will be issued by the Municipality without charge, except for stamping. A fee of 8 cents will be charged for stamping.

(5) A fee of 50 cents shall be charged for any dog redeemed as aforesaid, and no collar shall be issued except on payment of the tax due and the stamping fee.

(6) It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to require every occupier of a house to furnish a return showing the number of dogs kept in such house and to whom they respectively belong; and any person who shall neglect or refuse to furnish such return when called upon to do so, or shall knowingly insert therein any false information, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10.

3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "that Government be requested to open a temporary hospital or house of refuge beyond the Municipal limits for the relief of persons suffering from malarial fever outside the Municipality."

Seconded by Mr. W. Abeyasundera.

Mr. C. P. Hayley moved the following amendment to this motion: "That in view of the outbreak of fever being admittedly due to the mode in which the railway works were carried on, and the heavy expenditure entailed on the Municipality in the relief of the destitute sick, which it is now ascertained will not be less than Rs. 7,000, that Government be requested to make a suitable grant in aid to enable the Council to carry out some of the public improvements which had to be deferred in consequence of the strain in the resources of the Municipality."

Seconded by Mr. R. L. Symes.—Carried.

4. Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, No. 33 of October 24, intimating that His Excellency the Governor received with much pleasure the expression of thanks conveyed in the resolution of Council passed at the last Meeting.

5. Read letter No. 34 of November 4 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Government will gladly assist the Municipal Council in any way in its power towards securing a good water supply, and asking the Council to state the condition on which, and the expenditure which the Government may incur in obtaining the desired report and estimate.

Resolved,—That in thankfully acknowledging receipt of the letter, the Government be informed that the Council will be content for the present with a report from the Public Works Department on the points indicated in the resolution of Council of October 19 last, and generally as to the means of securing a good water supply for the town of Galle.

6. Read two letters from the Colonial Surgeon, No. 122 of October 16 and No. 125 of November 7, calling the attention of the Council to the insanitary condition of Minnangoda, Talapitiya, Dewature, and adjoining localities.

Moved by Mr. R. L. Symes, "that prosecutions be instituted against the well-to-do householders who keep their gardens and the compounds of their houses in a dirty state."

Seconded by Mr. W. Abeyasundera.—Carried.

7. In terms of section 139 of the Municipal Council's Ordinance the Council decided to adopt the valuation or assessment of property contained in the books for the current year, with such alterations as may, in particular cases, be deemed necessary, as the valuation or assessment for the year 1896, and that the Secretary revise the Reports of the Sub-Inspectors recommending such alterations.

8. Submitted a petition from Cornelis Ranasinghe, of Dangedara, applying for a lease of the fish market for five years for Rs. 4,650, and a lease of the fish auction shed for the like period for Rs. 10,000.

Resolved,—That the application be rejected.

9. Submitted the following recommendations of the Standing Committee:—

Standing Committee's Meeting held on October 29, 1895.

(1) Recommended "that these amendments (proposed by the Standing Committee to be made to the Ordinance now before the Legislative Council to amend Ordinance No. 7 of 1887) be submitted to the Municipal Council for approval."

Resolved,—That the proposed amendments be circulated among the Members of Council, and be brought up for consideration at the next Meeting.

(2) Recommended "that an additional vote of Rs. 1,500 be granted on account "Abating Malarial Fever."

Resolved,—That the recommendation be approved.

Standing Committee's Meeting held on November 7, 1895.

(3) Resolved "that the tender of Sejo Abdul Cader (for permanent repair of roads) be accepted, and that it be recommended to the Council that the contract for the work be given for two years, the charge for metalling 10-ft. road being reduced to Rs. 8 per line."

The Chairman moved the confirmation of the recommendation, and Dr. Attygalle seconded the motion.

Mr. C. P. Hayley moved as an amendment "that the consideration of the tender be deferred to next Meeting of Council."

Seconded by Mr. W. Abeyasundera.

The amendment was put to the vote and was carried by 4 against 3.

10. The following documents were laid on the table:—Accounts for the month of October; Report of Progress of Works for October; Auditor's Report.

Resolved,—That they be circulated.

(a) Metalled 367 lines and gravelled 331 lines of road ; used 427 cubes of metal.

(b) Repaired superficially 1,184 squares of road ; repaired 7 lines of Parawa street, 4 lines of Hirimbure road, 5 lines Quarry road, 6 lines Cripp's road, 4 lines Kong-tree road ; trimmed sides 143 lines ; cleared side drains 301 lines ; used 79 cubes of metal and 73 cubes of gravel.

(c) Removed decayed planks of Wakwella road bridge, Circular road bridge, Bope bridge, Hume road bridge, Kandewatta bridge, Kepu-ela bridge, and Miliduwa bridge ; re-fixed 38 planks of Bope bridge ; renewed abutments of Kepu-ela bridge ; and repaired foot-bridge over the Kepu-ela.

(d) Repaired Balcony latrine, sea bathing-place at Victoria park and near Triton Bastion, sunshades of meat market, fish market roof, refuse meat market, Bataduwe shed, slaughter-house, Pettigalawatta iron latrine, green market, fruit market, and Warawatta latrine.

(e) Clearing Parana-ela and Moragoda-ela, and cleaning and baling water of Pettigala-ela.

(f) Repaired Chando street and Rampart street side drains.

(g) Renewed Pettigala cross drain ; built a portion of the Pettigala-ela with stone and mortar ; repaired China Garden roadside drain ; formed a road on the side of the Pettigala-ela ; filled with sea sand two swamps at Pettigala-ela ; built a drain between Matara road and the sea ; renewed a culvert in Hall's road ; and built side drains to new road, Pettigala.

(h) Repaired garden seats ; built lines for coolies ; cleared sewers ; prepared material for a fence round the Pavilion ; built an office room for the Superintendent.

(j) Cost of repairs new rails.

(k) Built a sea latrine at Kaluwella, and building a new latrine at Pettigala.

(l) Opened a lane at Havelock place ; paid for 7,000 bricks for road on southern boundary of China Garden ; opened a road between Matara road and Talapitiya road, and built a boundary wall to it.

(m) Paid for four iron carts from Walker & Sons.

(n) Improving Fort market and enlarging cart shed in office premises.
