MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Kachcheri on Friday, December 20, 1895, at 3.30 o'clock p.m., in accordance with notice issued.

Present:—Hon. A. Bailey, Chairman; R. D. Ormsby, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; J. N. d'Esterre, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; B. de Alwis, Esq.; Dr. J. T. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 23, 1895, were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table:—Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1894 to November 30 last; separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, during the month of November; and Health Officer's Report.

Resolved,—That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, be forwarded, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, to the Colonial Secretary, for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Read the following recommendation of the Standing Committee:—That the Council do lease to the proposed Station Hotels Company, as tenants-at-will, the two blocks of land situated at Bogambra, adjoining the site of the proposed hotel, and applied for by Mr. R. W. Jenkins on behalf of the promoters and provisional Directors in his letter of July 1 (5th 95).

Resolved,—That the recommendation be adopted, and that the lease of the land be granted on condition that neither of the blocks be built upon; that the Council's proctor be asked to submit a draft lease for approval.

4. Read letter No. 15055, dated December 3, from the Government Agent, recommending the acceptance of Rs. 9,300 for the Katugastota bridge toll for 1896. The letter had been circulated and approval authorized.

Resolved,—That the acceptance of Rs. 9,300 for the Katugastota bridge toll be confirmed.

The Chairman reported that at a sale held this day Rs. 5,510 was offered for the Gonawatta and Talatu-oya bridge tolls. This was the highest offer that had been made, and he recommended its acceptance.

Resolved,—That the offer of Rs. 5,510 for Gonawatta and Talatu-oya tolls be accepted.

The Chairman, in submitting the Budget for 1896, which had been printed and a copy furnished to each Member, stated that the estimated receipts under the head of "General Revenue" would have to be increased from Rs. 68,219-75 to Rs. 69,035-75; being an increase of Rs. 816, made up as follows, owing to actual amounts realized by sales which had taken place:—

In considering the Budget it was resolved that the item of expenditure of Rs. 550 for clearing outside drains be added to schedule A under head Public Works, thereby increasing the vote to Rs. 32,579.

That under the head Time Charges a sum of Rs. 100 be provided for meeting the cost of painting the dial of the town clock, increasing the vote under this head to Rs. 630, and bringing up the total estimated expenditure to Rs. 67,843-50.
