WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Opium Ordinance, 1899," it is amongst other things enacted that the number of licenses to be granted for the sale by retail of opium within the limits of any Province, part of a Province, or any town, shall be in the discretion of the "proper authority," but shall in no case exceed the number to be fixed by the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the Gazette, in respect of any Province, part of a Province, or any town:

And whereas it is expedient to fix the number of licenses to be granted in respect of the Provinces, parts of Provinces, and towns set out in the schedule hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby fix the number of licenses to be granted in respect of each Province, part of a Province, and town specified in column 1 of the schedule hereto to be those set out in column 2 of the said schedule.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 11 of Ordinance No. 3 of 1896, it is amongst other things enacted that whenever it shall be found necessary to build a bridge other than those specified in schedule C to the said Ordinance, the cost of which shall amount to Five thousand rupees or more, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to direct that tolls not exceeding those specified in section 4 shall be levied in respect thereof:

And whereas the bridge over the Ritigaha-oya at Mudugomuwa in Dehigampal korale in Three Korales, in the District of Kegalla, has been built at a cost exceeding Five thousand rupees, and it is expedient to declare the tolls to be levied in respect thereof:

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this our Proclamation direct that from and after the First day of November, 1899, the

tolls specified and set forth in the schedule hereto shall be levied in respect of the said bridge over the Ritigaha-oya at Mudugomuwa in Dehigampal korale in Three Korales, in the District of Kegalla.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twentieth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-nine.
