Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, May 19, 1900, at 8.30 o'clock A.M., in accordance with Notice dated May 15, 1900.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib; L. Creasy, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 21, 1900, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1899 to April 30, 1900, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of April.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be

forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

Mr. Gibbon drew attention to certain items of receipts under the head Police Assessment, Tax on Vehicles and Animals, Market Rents, Tolls, Removal of Night Soil, to which the Chairman replied.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :-

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during April and the register. With reference to his remarks on laundries, resolved that the Health Officer be asked to furnish further details respecting the premises which are said to be in an unsatisfactory state, in terms of chapter III., Ordinance No. 1 of 1896.

4. In accordance with notice, Mr. Sproule asked—(a) Why there is no adequate police protection afforded to the district of Ampitiya recently brought within the Municipal limits?

Reply.—No provision was made in the Budget for 1900 for payment of police outside the old limits. (b) What is the reason for the delay in levying assessment tax in the Ampitiya district from January, 1899,

up to date. Reply.—No levy could be made till the premises, of which there are 2,700, had been assessed. Assessors were appointed on June 6, 1899, their report was made in October, and adopted by the Council at the Meeting on November 18. The rate of assessment to be levied was fixed by the Council at its Meeting on December 1, approved of by Government on February 20, 1900. Notices of assessment were issued in January.

5. Report by the Special Committee appointed to consider the petition dated January 13 from certain

residents respecting the fixing of meters, and which had been circulated, was read.

Proposed by Mr. J. H. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, that the report just read be adopted (Appendix A).

The motion was carried.

6. A list of premises on which there has been a consumption of water in excess of allowance was submitted. It was resolved that the action of Council in supplying and fixing meters be confirmed as regards the premises detailed (Appendix B) and that recovery be made for water used in excess of the allowance.

7. Considered recommendation of Health Officer that the cesspits connected with premises Nos. 4 to 45, Katugastota road; Nos. 32 A to E. Lady Torrington's road; Nos. 348, 349, 287 to 289, 290, 306, Trincomalee street,

be closed and dry-earth closets substituted.

Resolved,—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owner or occupiers of premises Nos. 32 A to E, Lady Torrington's road; Nos. 348, 349, 287 to 289, 290, and 306, the owner or occupiers of premises Nos. 32 A to E, Lady Torrington's road; Nos. 348, 349, 287 to 289, 290, and 306, and 306 Trincomalee street, to empty and close the cesspits on the said premises and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.

That the Health Officer be asked to revise the lists in connection with premises Nos. 4 to 45, Katugastota road

Health Officer's Report for the Month of April, 1900.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to submit my report for the month of April.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month.

Drains.—The superficial drains were regularly cleaned and kept in order and the deep barrel drains periodically flushed.

Market.—Clean and well kept.

Food Supply.—Ample, and of good quality. 470 cattle, 128 buffaloes, and 376 sheep and goats were slaughtered for food during the month.

Boutiques .- Well stocked with provisions of good quality.

Bakeries .- In order.

Water Supply.—Abundant and pure.

Dairies .- Clean and well kept.

Laundries. - Clean and in order, with the exception of those at Katukele, Trincomalee street, and Talwatta, where the premises are insufficient and badly ventilated.

Alleys. —Unsatisfactory and insanitary. The one at Castle Hill street belonging to Mr. Alwis is being improved, and some improvements have been made in the alley situated in Colombo street.

Latrines.—In good order and clean.

Cooly Lines.—All permanent lines in good order. Temporary lines insanitary.

Filthy Premises.—Ninety cases were instituted under this head and the parties fined.

General Health.—The health of the town has been good. No epidemics reported.

APPENDIX A.

Report of the Committee appointed to consider the Petition dated January 13, 1900, from certain Residents of Kandy, re Water Meters.

The petitioners are right in contending that the fixing of water meters in their premises was illegal. By-law No. 20 of chapter XII. regulates the law on the subject. In no case under consideration did the Council authorize that a meter be fixed. In looking into the proceedings of the Water Committee, we find that this Committee resolved on March 7, 1898, that the Council be recommended to order the necessary supply of meters. This recommendation was adopted by the Council on March 19, 1898. It was presumably on this supposed authority that 275 meters were ordered at a great cost, and some of them fixed in private premises. The fixing of the meters being illegal, it follows that a levy of a charge for meters so fixed is equally illegal. Under the circumstances we recommend (1) that no charge be levied for the use of meters already fixed; (2) that where such charges have been recovered, they be refunded on application; (3) that in future by-law No. 20, chapter XII., be strictly observed, and that each case in which it is proposed to fix a meter be submitted to the Council for its inquiry and order.

As regards meters that may be fixed in future in accordance with the by-law previously referred to, we recommend that the annual charge should not exceed 10 per cent. of the value of the meter, and when the charges paid aggregate the cost of the meter, there should be no further charge; repairs of meters to be borne by the Council, THE petitioners are right in contending that the fixing of water meters in their premises was illegal. By-law

meters are placed.
