#### BENGAL.-No. 68.

China, East Coast—Amoy Harbour—Sunken Rock Eastward of South End of Kulangsen.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 103 of 1896) of the existence of a rock, on which the German vessel-of-war Kaiser recently touched, in the fairway of Amoy inner harbour.

This rock, now named Kaiser rock, is a pinnacle with a depth of 21 ft. on it at low water springs and 4 to 5 fathoms close around, lying with the centre of the English Consulate, bearing W. 4 N. (N. 87° W.), distant 5½ cables; and Pillar rock, N. § E. (N. 7° E.).

Approximate position, lat. 24° 26′ 35″ N.; long, 118° 4′ 25″ E.

## Bengal.—No. 69.

Pacific Ocean—Sandwich Islands—Adoption of Standard Time.

The following Notice to Mariners (No. 105 of 1896) assued by the British Admiralty is re-published:—

Information has been received that on January 13, 1896, standard mean time of the meridian of 157° 30′ W., equivalent to 10h. 30m. slow of Greenwich mean time, was adopted throughout the Sandwich Islands.

The time signals at Honolulu are now given at noon and 1h. 20m., standard mean tine, equivalent to 10h. 30m. and midnight Greenwich mean time on the same day.

(2) Kauai (Atooi)—Sunken Rock near Wahiawa Harbour.

Also, of the existence of a rock, with a depth of 7 ft. on it, reported to lie about one mile offshore, near Wahiawa harbour, or approximately in lat. 21° 52′ 30″ N., long. 159° 31′ 30″ W.

#### Bengal.—No. 70.

Africa, North-East-Red Sea, Western Shore-Amarat Islands-Shoal Northward of Diamond Shoal.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 114 of 1893), with reference to a shoal previously reported to exist northward of Diamond shoal, that information has been received from H.M.S. Melita that on passing the locality a crescent-shaped shoal was observed, trending north-west and south-east, convex to north-east, with north-west and south-east, convex to north-east, with apparently depths of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  to  $3\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms on it, over a sand and coral bottom, lying N. by W.  $\frac{2}{4}$  W. (N. 19° W.), distant one to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile from Diamond shoal.

Approximate position, lat.  $18^{\circ}23\frac{1}{2}$  N., long.  $38^{\circ}13\frac{1}{4}$  E. The words "foul ground reported north of Diamond shoal" have been expunged from the Admiralty Charts,

and the symbol for a rock, with less than 6 ft. water on it, has been inserted in the above position.
