# NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

SEALED Tenders, marked on the envelopes "Tender for constructing a cart road from the Railway Station Ohiya to Udaveria Gap," will be received up to noon on Monday, February 15, 1897, from persons willing to contract for same.

1. Tenders are to be made in duplicate on forms which will be supplied upon application at the office of the Director of Public Works or the Government Agent, Uva, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form. The originals should be forwarded by the tenderers direct to the Director of Public Works and the duplicates direct to the Hon. the Auditor-General,

both to be forwarded at the same time.

2. A deposit of Rs. 25 should be made either at the Treasury or at the Kachcheri, and the receipt of the Treasurer or the Government Agent produced when applying for forms. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon

signing the contract.

3. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract or cash security at the option of the Director of Public Works. Plan and specification may be seen at the Provincial Engineer's Office, Badulla, or at the District Engineers Office, Koslanda. The amount of the bond, and all necessary information in respect of the contract, can be ascertained upon application at the above offices.

The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of

accepting any portion of a tender.

Persons whose tenders are accepted by Government will be required to bear the expenses of having security bonds prepared for the due performance of their contracts, which bonds will be subject to the approval of the Attorney-General, but may be drawn by the tenderers'

6. When bonds have been drawn by the tenderers' own lawyers, the name or stamp of the Proctor who drafted the bond should be affixed to the document.

7. Every alteration should bear the initials of the tenderers, and all tenders containing alterations not bearing the tenderers' initials will be treated as informal and rejected.
