#### LOCAL BOARD NOTICES.

TOTICE is hereby given to persons residing within the limits of the Local Board of Negombo that the Board, acting under the provisions of section 3 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1887, has imposed an annual tax, payable in six days' labour, upon all persons residing within the limits of the Local Board who would have been liable under the provisions of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1861 to the performance of labour for the maintenance of the roads or other public means of communication by land or by water if the Ordinance No. 7 of 1876 had not been passed. Such labour may be commuted by a money payment of Rs. 2 in the town of Negombo and the islands of Pitipana and Munnakkara and Re. 1.50 in the island of Duwa, on or before February 28, 1897. After that date the payment will be Rs. 4 and Rs. 3, respectively, per head.

Provincial Road Committee's Office. Badula, December 31, 1896.

TOTICE is hereby given that an application having been made to the Provincial Road Committee that the provisions of the Branch Roads Ordinance, No. 14 of 1896, be extended to the District of Haputale (1) for taking over the upkeep of the existing cart road from the Koslanda bazaars to its terminus at Kittulkele gap, a distance of about 2½ miles more or less; (2) for constructing an extension of this road from the terminus at Kittulkele gap to a point near the Poonagalla factory, a distance of about three-quarters of a mile more or less; (3) for erecting an iron bridge suitable for cart traffic over the Kittulkele-oya near the present ford.
