China Sea—Singapore Strait—Shoal in North Channel.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 167 of 1897) that on February 2, 1897, the British steamvessel Cheang Chew grounded in a position with Horsburg lighthouse bearing S. 41° E., distant 5½ miles; and Large island, Lima islands, S. 55° W.

Approximate position: lat. 1° 24' 15" N., long. 104° 21' E.

A depth of three fathoms has been placed in the Admiralty Charts, and a note written against the words North channel, "Should not be used for sea navigation."

NOTE.—Mariners are warned that the North channel should not be used for navigation, as no advantage is gained by passing through it, and it is possible that more shoals exist there than are shown on the Chart, as already stated in China Sea Directory, Vol. I., 1896, page 238.

Variation, 2° easterly in 1897.

The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.

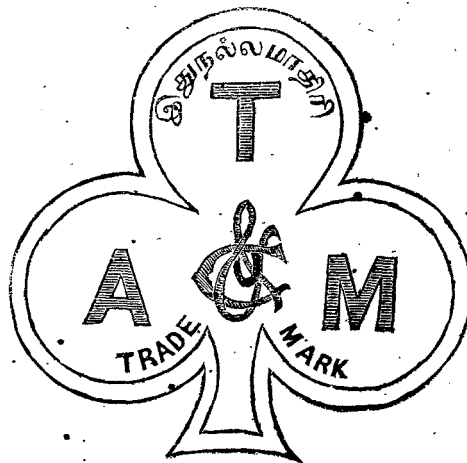

THE following telegrams received from the Government of Bombay are published for general information :—

The British Consul at Alexandria telegraphs :—"Regulations for pilgrimage infected plague as adopted recent. Quarantine conference provisionally enforced against Hedjaz ports on account of suspected case of plague at Jeddah. Twelve days' quarantine for all, and additional three days for Egyptians."

"Measure referred to in above telegram now definitely enforced, plague in Hedjaz having been officially declared."
