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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, August 28, 1897, at 8.30 a.m.

Present:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; W. W. Pole Fletcher, Esq.; Edwin Beven, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; Alex. Philip, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on July 17, 1897, and of the Special Meeting held on August 4, 1897, were read and confirmed.

2. It having been found that Mr. Gibbon had become disqualified as a Councillor as he had failed to attend three consecutive Meetings, it was resolved, upon the motion of Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Philip, that Mr. Gibbon be restored to office.

3. Copy of a letter dated June 17 from the Colonial Secretary, nominating Mr. W. W. Pole Fletcher to be a Member of the Council, the complaint book, and the usual monthly statements were laid on the table.

Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1896 to July 31, 1897; separate statements of the General Revenue, Police Assessments, and Water-rate accounts during the same period; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of July; Progress Report of work done by the Public Works Officer, and Health Officer's Report for the same month.

Resolved,—That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, be forwarded with the Minutes of this Meeting to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. Mr. Philip, pursuant to notice, asked when the return referred to in the following motion, viz., "that a return be furnished without delay to the Municipal Council showing the latrine accommodation in each and every dwelling-house within Municipal limits, and what arrangements are made by the householders or occupier for the

removal of night soil, for the daily keeping clean and in proper order of the privies, cesspools, and connected drains within the Municipality; also for a return showing in detail the premises (if any) that have, contrary to the provision of the Ordinance or otherwise, any connection with the main sewers or street drains" duly carried at a Meeting of the Municipal Council held on January 22, 1897, would be furnished?

The Chairman replied that owing to imperfect instructions the reports of the Inspectors on their house-to-house inspections did not contain all the information required by the motion. This would be remedied and the return furnished at the next Meeting, if possible.

5. Mr. Philip, pursuant to notice, asked with reference to the motion given in paragraph 9 of the Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council held on February 20, 1897, what recommendation, if any, had been made by the Standing Committee in the matter, as the delay that is taking place would appear to be unnecessary and inconvenient.

The Chairman replied that the metal boxes to be supplied to each Councillor for the purpose of keeping Municipal documents have been ordered through the Secretary, Colonel Byrde, and were expected shortly.

6. Mr. Philip, pursuant to notice, asked, with reference to the motion No. 7 in the Minutes of Proceedings of the Municipal Council of Kandy on March 20, what steps had been taken in the matter; and second, whether the Health Officer had made his report on the question of having latrines, &c., erected within some of the crowded alleys in the town.

The Chairman replied that (1) ten new galvanized iron latrines of five seats each had been ordered from Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., Limited; (2) the Health Officer's report on latrines for alleys had been submitted to the Council, and the question had been referred to a Special Committee (see paragraph No. 4 of the Minutes of the Meeting of Council held on April 24), and that the Special Committee had not yet reported.

7. Mr. Vanderwall, pursuant to notice, asked whether the retired Chief Inspector, Mr. Van Twest, had been allowed a pension, and moved for papers.

The motion for papers was seconded by Mr. Jonklaas.

The Chairman replied that Mr. Van Twest is only 48 years of age, he is not entitled to a pension unless condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The motion was agreed to, and the Chairman stated further that the papers would be laid on the table.

8. Mr. Philip, pursuant to notice, in inviting attention to the report of the Sub-Committee appointed on July 21, 1888, to consider letter No. 19 of June 6, 1888, from Government on the subject of Police Administration, moved "that the town and Government duties be kept as distinct as possible with increased control by the Municipal Council of police employed for Municipal purposes; and that with a view to this end a monthly return be submitted to the Municipal Council showing the number of constables employed on duty for Municipal purposes, and the beats within each and every ward over which such constables are distributed, the hours of duty, and such further details as may be deemed desirable from time to time by the Municipal Council."

Seconded by Mr. Beven and agreed to.

9. Mr. Philip, pursuant to notice, drew attention to the apparent want of regularity in the publication of the Minutes of Proceedings (after confirmation) of the Meetings of the Municipal Council, Kandy, in the *Government Gazette* and circulation to Councillors of printed copies, and moved that the matter be inquired into.

Seconded by Mr. Gibbon and agreed to.

10. Mr. Vanderwall, having with the leave of the Council amended the motion of which he had given notice, moved "that the Health Officer be called upon to furnish a report to the Council monthly of the work done by him commencing from last month (July)."

Seconded by Mr. Jonklaas and agreed to.

11. Mr. Vanderwall, pursuant to notice, moved "that steps be taken to complete the drain of the road on the north side of the esplanade which has been left open for several months."

Seconded by Mr. Beven and agreed to.

The Chairman stated that the Standing Committee had ordered that a vote for this work should be included in the next Supplementary Budget.

12. Mr. Vanderwall, pursuant to notice, moved "that the ceiling of the Council Chamber, which is also used as a Public Hall, be painted white in order to throw light into the room."

Seconded by Mr. Philip. The motion on being put to the Council was negatived without a division.

13. A letter from the Health Officer regarding the impurity of the water in the reservoir was read.

The Chairman stated that the matter was referred to in his Annual Report, which was to be considered at that Meeting.

14. The Annual Report of the Chairman for 1896 was laid on the table. Mr. Philip moved "that the report be referred to a Special Committee for consideration with instructions to append such observations thereto as they think fit, prior to its submission to the Governor in Executive Council."

Seconded by Mr. Jonklaas. The motion was negatived without a division.

Mr. Beven then moved "that the report be referred to a Special Committee with instructions to suggest observations to be appended thereto in terms of section 80 (c) of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887."

Seconded by Mr. Vanderwall.

Mr. Gibbon moved as an amendment "that a Special Meeting of Council be held on the 30th instant to consider the report in Committee."—The amendment was not seconded. Mr. Beven's motion was thereupon put to the Council and agreed to, and the following Councillors were appointed to form the Special Committee, viz., Mr. W. Pole Fletcher, Mr. Beven, Mr. Gibbon, Mr. Philip, Mr. Vanderwall, Mr. Jonklaas.—Three to form a quorum.

15. Letter dated 16th August, 1897, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary was read, intimating that His Excellency the Governor had been pleased to sanction the estimate for Rs. 20,000 submitted by the Director of Public Works for the removal of lake silt.

Health Officer's Report for July, 1897.

THE streets of Kandy are kept much cleaner under the new system, and the night soil is now deposited in a satisfactory manner. The alleys remain in the same filthy and insanitary state as previously reported.

A new slaughter-house for sheep has been built; none of my recommendations concerning it have been carried out; it is close to the public road and railway, from both of which places the slaughtering of sheep and all details connected therewith can be witnessed by passengers and others.

The public latrine accommodation in Kandy is deficient.

Attempts are being made to make bakers, dairymen, &c., carry out the by-laws, but the process is very tedious and slow.

The drainage of Kandy continues as bad as ever; the drains in Colombo street is being slowly repaired.

The water supply of Kandy, in my opinion, is most impure.

No epidemic disease is prevalent.
