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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on July 24, 1897, at 3 p.m.

Present :-- The Chairman ; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; C. P. Hayley, Esq. ; W. E. de Vos, Esq. ; W. Abeyasundera Esq. ; and C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meetings held on May 22 and June 22 last.

2. Read protests from Messrs. W. E. de Vos and C. P. Hayley against the imposition of the water-rate on houses and lands in the Fort.

3. Read memorial dated June 10, 1897, from a Committee appointed by a meeting of the residents of Galle Fort held on May 29 last, praying that the water-rate be not levied until the water intended to be supplied was of good quality, and that a reasonable rate, as in the case of Colombo, where the rate is $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent., be levied when the Council has it in their power to supply pure water.

Read also a letter from Government, No. 16 of June 4, 1897, on the Galle Waterworks. Resolved,—That the reply to the memorial lie over until the reply of Government to the Chairman's letter, No. 37 of the 8th instant, and the report of the Director of Public Works, be received.

4. Read letter from Mr. M. Cochran dated June 24, 1897, giving an analysis of water from the Kottawe stream, whence the Provincial Engineer proposes to supply water to the Bikke reservoir.

Read a memorandum from Dr. Anthonisz on a petition from the Moorish community against the introduction of dry-earth closets into their houses.

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Resolved,---That the memorandum be referred to the Superintendent of Works for report as to the feasibility of carrying out the recommendations contained in the memorandum.

The following recommendations of the Standing Committee were submitted :----6.

- That by-laws on the regulation of bakeries be made.
 That one-half of the estimated cost of carrying out the China Garden drainage scheme, viz., Rs. 4,156:83, be provided by the Council.
 That steps be taken to acquire (a) land at Dewatta for a market; (b) house and land at the southern extremity of the Rope walk at China Garden; (c) the open verandah opposite the Kachcheri.
 That the vote for clearing ramparts be increased by Rs. 100.

Resolved-(1) That the by-laws on bakeries contained in the revised by-laws, chapter XVI., forwarded to Government to be incorporated in an Ordinance, be adopted, and His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council be requested to confirm them.

- (2) That a sum of Rs. 4,156.83 be voted for the work.
 (3) That the properties (a) and (b) be acquired for the respective purposes for which they are required.
 (4) That the vote for clearing ramparts be increased by Rs. 100.

 - 7. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz put the following questions :---

(1) How long is it since the canal at Hirimbure has been cleared out : some portions of it are now overgrown with grass and blocked up? The Chairman replied that the portion of the canal between the Hirimbure cross road bridge and the Millidua

bridge was last cleaned out in January, 1895.

(2) Has any notice been taken of the inundation in Hirimbure and the state of the bridges which are under water; and is it not time that permanent masonry bridges are built over narrow streams?

The Chairman replied that the Superintendent of Works noted the height at which the water stood on the bridges during the inundation on the 29th and 30th May. Data have been collected for an estimate for an arched bridge on the Hirimbure road, but owing to the muddy nature of the ground the work can only be undertaken during the dry weather early next year.

(3) Have the Police Constables any rules given them about regulating the traffic in crowded localities? If so, what are they?

The Chairman replied that the Constables are fairly acquainted with the rule of the road as laid down by law, and that instructions will be issued to secure a more stringent observance of the law.

(4) Who is responsible for regulating the traffic beyond the police limits and within the Municipality?, The Chairman replied that the village headmen are expected to look after this.

(5) When is the general cemetery to be opened? Complaints are made that burials are being made in gardeus

(b) When is the general concern to be opened : Comparing and that burness are being made in gate is graves close to dwelling-houses and drinking wells.
 The Chairman replied that the cemetery will be opened as soon as the Public Works Department have finished the roads inside the cemetery, built a keeper's lodge, and drained the grounds.
 (6) Could no better arrangement be made to keep the China Garden drains clean : as it is they are shamefully

neglected ?

The Chairman replied that keeping the drains clean forms part of the scavenging contractor; but the drains being defective the work of keeping them always in a clean state is one of difficulty. The terms of the contract will be strictly enforced.

(7) Is it not desirable to have a path on the side of the Pitigalla drains so as to enable the latter being properly flushed and cleaned : the land belongs to the Municipality, being reclaimed ground ?

The Chairman replied that he had already given instructions to the Superintendent of Works to define the land on the sides of the drain belonging to the Council with a view of opening a road there.

Protest of W. E. de Vos.

Galle, May 26, 1897.

I, W. E. de Vos, Councillor for the Fort Ward, hereby protest against the imposition of the water-rate decided on by the Council at its last sitting by six against four votes.

Every resident in the Fort is unanimous that no rate should be imposed because the water stinks, and is unfit

for human consumption or for cooking or bathing purposes. The Council has had the water often tested, and the Analyst has on each occasion condemned the water as impure and unfit for human consumption. While the Council is spending largely to prevent the introduction of the bubonic epidemic, it at the same time is endeavouring to compel the use of water of such bad quality that for the very reasons given by the Analyst it may produce an epidemic of a serious character in the Fort, which will easily spread into the other wards.

The motion to impose the water-rate was not introduced by any Unofficial Member, but by the Chief Government official, the Government Agent, and was seconded by another Government official, the Provincial Engineer. It was opposed by Dr. Anthonisz, Member for the Hirimbure Ward, by Mr. Hayley and Mr. Carim, Mudaliyar, Members nominated by Government, and by myself. The only reason given by the mover and seconder and by Dr. Attygalle, Colonial Surgeon, was that the water has been constantly taken away from the standposts and made use of. But there was no evidence that the water was used either for bathing or cooking purposes, or for human consumption. There are various other purposes for which water of this kind can be utilized. The Members of the other wards admitted that the water was unfit for human consumption, but notwithstanding argued for the rate on grounds that

did not justify the imposition of the rate for water that stinks, and is impure and unfit for human consumption. The Ordinance does not fix such a ruinous rate as 7 per cent. as the only rate. It gives power to impose any rate not exceeding 7 per cent. In Colombo the rate levied is only 2½ per cent., and for so low a rate Colombo, where house rents are so high, is provided with good water. The rents in the Galle Fort are, comparatively speaking, miserably low, and this heavy rate of 7 per cent., though a rate on house property and to be paid by the owners, will have to be recovered by them from their tenants. The Fort residents are mainly tenants, and the bulk of them are near and so large a rate as 7 per cent main provided in the result of the mater are and so large a rate as 7 per cent mater processing of the rate bulk of them are poor people of limited means ; and so large a rate as 7 per cent. must necessarily fall heavily on them, especially at the

present day, when scarcity of money and employment is so severely felt. Rents of house property in the Fort have far from improved. So heavy a rate as 7 per cent. can only have the effect of considerably reducing the value of such property. In the Colombo Municipality, where property is increasing in value and rents rising higher, the people pay altogether for taxes at the rate of 11 per cent., while here, in the Fort of Galle, with house property going down in value and rents not rising, we are called upon, with this rate of 7 per cent., to pay so much as 14 per cent taxes cent, taxes.

Protest of Mr. C. P. Hayley.

Galle, June 11, 1897.

I BEG to protest against the imposition of the water-rate upon the inhabitants of the Fort Ward of the Galle Municipality in payment of water which is not fit for human consumption. The Municipality has hitherto admitted that no rate could be levied whilst the water is unfit for use. The

water is not yet fit for drinking purposes.

It is no doubt true that as the standpipes are opened everyday for the use of the public a certain quantity of water is made use of for washing and similar purposes, and probably some of the poorer classes may use it for drinking to some extent; but it would be no hardship were the supply cut off again : it is only used because it is easier to draw off large quantities of water from a standpipe than out of a well.

Until the water supplied is drinkable the inhabitants have no adequate return for the heavy tax which it is now proposed to force them to pay.

The Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended March 31, 1897.

The General Health was good. There is nothing of importance to record, except relapses in old cases of malarial fever along the Matara railway line.

Ward No. 1.-The cesspits, which form the greatest source of danger to the puplic health, are to be closed and the dry-earth system is to be enforced. This is the sanitary improvement most urgently needed. For the efficient working of the dry-earth system and scavenging, as well as to secure better ventilation, roads or lanes should be opened up between every two rows of houses. Most of the houses are built back to back, and every available piece of ground is used for building upon, and there are many obstruction buildings, all interfering with through ventilation.

Notices have been served to provide proper house drainage. which is very defective. All the covered drains

in the streets should be converted into open drains to faciliate cleansing. Wards Nos. 2, 3, 4, and 5.—The want of privy accommodation, the existence of extensive surface pollution by human excrement, and the neglect of house drainage are common to these wards.

The insunitary localities, such as China Garden, Kaluwella, the Bazaar, Pettigala, Dangedara, and Talapitiya, require attention.

The drainage of these wards is very defective. The swamp at Minuwangoda and other places of low elevation require draining and filling up.

A few more roads and cross roads should be opened up in crowded localities like China Garden, Dangedara. Talapitiya, and Magalla.

Scavenging was very much neglected during this quarter. Outside the Fort the scavenging of house refuse is very much neglected for the want of roads and means of access for taking the refuse into the cart, and the residents are obliged to store up accumulations of refuse in their gardens. Boxes should be provided at convenient places for the recention of house refuse in such localities.

The Municipal Latrines were kept clean. There should be separate latrines for males and females at such spots where latrines have been built, otherwise people will commit a nuisance.

Wattle and daub houses with cadjan roofs should not be allowed to exist in crowded localities in the heart of the town. These huts are as a rule overcrowded, very badly ventilated, dark, damp, and unfit for human habitation.

The Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended June 30, 1897.

The General Health was good. Relapses in old cases of malaria continue, and there has been an increase towards the end of the quarter. Relapses seem to be more frequent in the neighbourhood of Circular road, which is a very badly drained area. After my reports about the railway excavations an attempt has been made to drain the storm water that used to stagnate in the excavations between the first and the Circular road gates, but in the extensive excavations further down within the Municipal limits the surface water keeps stagnating and emitting unhealthy gases and vapours. The excavations, which have been the cause of malaria, should be filled in and levelled at an early date.

There was one case of chickenpox at Kaluwella. The patient having returned from Colombo after infection, developed the disease here, to which he succumbed owing to long existing diabetes. A few cases of measles occurred outside the Fort.

Ward No. 1 .- The dry-earth system is worked in 30 houses out of about 400. The want of more roads and lanes is a great drawback to the efficient working of the dry-earth system and scavenging of house refuse. Those who have no back or side entrances object to a daily removal of dry earth tubs through their drawing rooms; and the late hour does not suit every one, especially Moormen, who take late dinner. I do not see any objection to such people engaging private registered coolies to remove the night soil enclosed buckets earlier in the evening to a receptacle near the coal sheds opposite the Pettah police station, where the buckets are emptied and cleansed. Wards Nos. 2, 3, 4, and 5.—The chief sanitary defects common to those wards are insufficiency of privy accommo-

dation, and the consequent existence of extensive surface pollution by human excrement, defective drainage, and the dation, and the consequent existence of extensive surface pollution by numan excrement, derective drainage, and the absence of house drainage. Slops and kitchen washings are thrown about the compounds and pollute the soil, atmosphere, and water in the wells. All swamps and places of low elevation should be drained and levelled. In crowded and insanitary localities, such as China Garden, Kaluwella, Bazaar, Pettigala, Dangedara, and Talapitia, a few more roads and cross roads should be opened up to facilitate scavenging of house refuse, which is at present thrown about the gardens and compounds; large accumulations of such refuse in close proximity to dwellings and wells will contaminate the atmosphere soil and mater in the wells and orderer the public health.

contaminate the atmosphere, soil, and water in the wells and endanger the public health. Scavenging was very unsatisfactory, and the work was performed in an irregular and perfunctory fashion. Outside the Fort scavenging of house refuse is very much neglected, chiefly owing to the absence of roads and means of access for taking the refuse into the cart. Beceptacles should be provided in proper and convenient situations for the temporary deposit and collection of house refuse in crowded localities. The scavenging contractor should daily visit the different localities at fixed hours and take in the refuse.

Municipal Latrines were kept clean. There should be separate latrines for males and females at each spot latrines have been put up. These are appropriated by one sex, while the members of the other sex commit where latrines have been put up. a nuisance on the nearest waste land or seabeach.

Bakeries within the Municipality invariably have the cesspit in close proximity, and their sanitary condition is very bad. The quality of bread manufactured in most places is bad, and the persons employed are not at all clean. A portion of the house is, as a rule, occupied by the wife and children of the baker, and the employed are not at an occupied by the same building. I recommend the registration of these bakeries after inspection and approval of their sanitary condition. Every bakery must be kept in a cleanly state and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, or other nuisance. It must not be so overcrowded while work is going on as to be injurious to the health of the persons other nuisance. It must not be so overcrowded while work is going on as to be injurious to the health of the persons employed therein. It must be ventilated in such a manner as to render harmless, as far as practicable, all the gases, vapours, dust, or other impurities generated in the course of the manufacturing process that may be injurious to health. Limewashing of walls, coilings, &c., must be done once in six months or oftener. The floor and drains must be properly cemented, and washing and cleansing daily attended to. Cesspits must be emptied, disinfected, and filled in, and dry-earth tubs used instead. No sleeping room must be allowed within the bakery. *Eating houses* are as a rule kept in a very insanitary condition. These are resorted to by the poor and wage-earning classes for their meals as well as lodgings. They form fertile sources for the spread of infection and propagation of epidemics, and ought to be registered and kept under strict sanitary supervision. A house must not be registered until it has been inspected and approved for the purpose, and should possess the conditions of wholesomeness needed for dwelling-houses in general. *Galas* (cattle sheds), which daily accommodate a large number of cart bulls, are situated near public thorough-

Galas (cattle sheds), which daily accommodate a large number of cart bulls, are situated near public thorough-fares, with accumulations of dung and filth causing a nuisance, ought to be registered. The "galas" should be properly paved, roofed, and drained. The dung should be removed daily and the floor and drains washed daily.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, August 6, 1897.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 31, 1897.

Present:—Mr. W. E. Davidson, Acting Chairman; Brigade Surgeon Lieut.-Col. A. W. Duke; Mr. F. Bois; Mr. H. van Cuylenburg; Mr. F. H. Griulinton; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; the Hon. Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alvis. The Minutes of July 9, 1897, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,-That the Minutes of July 9, 1897, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice the Hon. Mr. P. Coomaraswamy asked "whether the Chairman of the Municipal Council has written to the Government that the Council desires to dispense with the services of Mr. Skelton, and if so, by what authority he wrote the letter, and moved for papers."

The motion being seconded by Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa, the papers were laid on the table.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved " that the name of the Acting Principal Civil Medical Officer, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, be added to the Special Committee appointed to report upon the scheme for the removal of night soil from private premises."

Mr. A. Alvis seconded.-Carried unanimously.

3. A notification from the Chairman that Major L. F. Knollys, C.M.G., Messrs. A. Forsyth, and R. H. Morgan had vacated their seats as Members of this Council by absence from three consecutive General Meetings, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that Mr. R. H. Morgan be restored to office in accordance with the provisions of clause 32 of Ordinance 7 of 1887."

Mr. A. Alvis seconded.-Carried unanimously.

The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of a Member of the Standing Committee in place of Sir W. R. Kynsey.

The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, who was accordingly elected a Member of the Standing Committee for 1897.

5. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of July 30 and 31, 1897, were laid before the Council :--

July 30, 1897.

(2) Letter from Colonial Secretary with reference to the proposed loan for duplicating the main.

Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary No. 66 of June 14 :-

- Resolved that the offer of the Government to lend to the Municipal Council half the cost of duplicating the main pipe of the water supply between the 23rd and 13th mileposts be accepted. That the Municipal Council agrees to pay four per cent. interest per annum on the loan and one per cent. for Sinking Fund towards the repayment of the loan; and that the interest and Sinking Fund be met (1) out of the funds derived from the stamp duties levied under Ordinance 9 of 1892; and (2)—for the balance—out of the proceeds of the sale of water by the Municipal Council. [Credit balance at Rs. 52,500, annual income Rs. 10,500. Estimated receipts annually Rs. 100,000.]
- (3) The Chairman's recommendation with reference to tenders for lease of river frontage near the late Bridge-of-boats.

Resolved that tender of Mr. J. G. G. Abeysinghe for Rs. 20 per mensem be accepted.

- (4) Applications from Messrs. Boustead Brothers to lease Municipal land known as Dhoby's pond for a
 - generating station for Colombo tramways. Resolved that Brigade Surgeon Lieut. Col. Duke and Dr. Vanderstraaten be requested to favour the Standing Committee with their opinions as to whether the lease of the site, as described in the
 - tracing herewith, would be injurious to the health of the neighbourhood. The Chairman is authorized to lay the papers before Council at its next Meeting, with authority from the Standing Committee to state that the Standing Committee is in favour of the lease if once the question of sanitation is settled.
- (5) Application from Mr. Shamsudeen to retire on pension or gratuity. Resolved that Mr. A. T. Shamsudeen, 4th Clerk, be permitted to retire with a gratuity of three months' full pay, viz., Rs. 165.

July 31, 1897.

(8) Tenders for lease of Slave Island mutton market. The tender of Chappon Ahamat for the five months from August 1 to December 31, 1897, at the rate of Rs. 125 per mensem, is recommended to Council. He is permitted to enter into occupation forthwith.

Mr. Alvis moved "that the recommendations contained in paragraphs 2, 3, 5, and 8 of the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee of July 30 and 31, 1897, be adopted."

The Mr. Hon. P. Coomaraswamy seconded,-Carried unanimously.

With reference to paragraph 4 of the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee of July 30, 1897, the Hon. Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the Conneil do go into Committee."

Mr. C. Perera seconded .--- Carried.

The Council having resumed, Mr. C. M. Fernando moved "that in view of the report of Brigade Surgeon Lieut.-Col. Duke and Dr. Vanderstraaten the Council regret that they are unable to give Messrs. Boustead Brothers the lease of the land known as Dhoby's pond."

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.-Carried.

A letter from the Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne, forwarding the reply which Her Majesty the Queen was graciously pleased to hand to him with reference to the address from the Municipal Council of Colombo, was laid before the Council, having been previously circulated amongst Members.

Brigade Surgeon Lieut.-Col. Duke moved "that the terms of Her Majesty the Queen's gracious reply be entered on record in the Minutes of this Council."

Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa seconded.-Carried unanimously.

Her Majesty's Reply.

I have received with pleasure the address of the Municipal Council of Colombo on the occasion of the 60th anniversary of my accession to the throne, and I thank them for this token of their loyalty and respect and for the tasteful box containing it.

7. A letter No. 78 of July 16, 1897, from the Colonial Secretary, on the subject of the diversion of traffic from the road which runs between "Uplands" and the sea to the road which runs round the back of "Uplands," was laid before the Council, having been previously circulated. Mr. C. Perera moved "that the Council, with the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council, do, in terms of

section 160 of Ordinance 7 of 1887, close to general traffic that portion of the street called Tanque Salgado from the southern entrance to Uplands House to the junction of the roads at Rock House lane, provided that the Government do accept the following conditions :-

"(1) That the alternative road, viz., Alutmawata road and the new road at the back of Uplands Mills, shall be made of a uniform width of 40 ft.; (2) that the gradients be reduced to a maximum of 1 in 35; (3) that the gas and water mains affected by the deviation and by the improvement of the gradient be altered, re-laid, and re-arranged where required; (4) that the cost of any alterations rendered necessary by the reduction of the gradient to the approaches of the Cathedral, St. Thomas's College, and other buildings by the side of the Alutmawata road be met by the Government: (5) that the payment of any compensation which may be claimed against the Council and shown to be reasonable shall be met by the Government. "The Council further hopes that when the docks have been completed the Tanque Salgado road may be re-opened and that the plans for the docks will be modified so as to permit of the road being continued on the sea

re-opened and that the plans for the docks will be modified so as to permit of the road being continued on the sea front crossing the entrance to the docks by a swing bridge or some other appliance of that nature.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded .-- Carried unanimously.

8. Mr. C. M. Fernando moved that the number of opium licenses to be issued for 1898, under clause 3 of Ordinance 9 of 1889, be four.

Mr. A. Alvis seconded.—Carried unanimously.

10. The Sanitary Officer's Report for the first quarter of 1897 was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

12. The City Analyst's report on the town water for July, 1897, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, May 29, 1897, at 8.30 a.m.

Present :--Hon. Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman ; Dr. Frederick Keyt ; E. Beven, Esq. ; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq. ; C. Vanderwall, Esq. ; Alexander Philip, Esq. ; J. H. Sproule, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 24, 1897, were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :--Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1896 to April 30, 1897; separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts during the same period; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of April; Progress Report of Work done by the Public Works Officer; and Health Officer's Report, also for the same month. Resolved,-That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, be forwarded, with the Minutes of this Masting to the Colonial Someture for publication in the Concernment Constitu-

with the Minutes of this Meeting, to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. Upon the motion of Mr. Sproule, seconded by Dr. Keyt, it was resolved that the Chairman be specially empowered, under the provisions of section 209 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require by notice in writing the owner or occupier of the premises in Castle Hill street, numbered 129A, 130, 131, 132, 133, 134A-D, to close the cess-pool on the said premises and to substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

Mr. Beven, pursuant to notice, moved, in view of the Health Officer's report, "that the alleys in the crowded 4. Mr. Beven, pursuant to notice, moved, in view of the Health Othcer's report. "that the alleys in the crowded parts of Kandy are in an insanitary state, and that they are a constant menace to the health of the town; that steps be taken by the Council to acquire the alleys and to pull down the rookeries thereon, and to erect in their places houses with due regard to sanitary requirements."—Seconded by Dr. Keyt. Mr. Vanderwall moved as an amendment "that a Special Committee be appointed to report on the alleys generally, and the probable cost of acquiringeach; and of erecting improved dwellings in the place of the present dwellings."—Seconded by Mr. Jonklas. The amendment was accepted by Mr. Beven, who, with the leave of the Council, withdrew his motion. The amendment was put to the vote and carried, and the following Special Committee was nominated : the Chairman, Mr. Beven, Mr. Sproule, the Provincial Engineer. Mr. Sproule, the Provincial Engineer.

5. Mr. Beven moved, pursuant to notice, "that the Superintendent of Works be directed to take steps to prevent the flooding of the part of Victoria Drive at the bend near the parsonage garden. Seconded by Mr. Vanderwall and carried.

6. Mr. Beven, with leave of the Council, amended the past motion standing in his name, and "moved that a low Kandyan wall or fence be erected on the western side of Victoria Drive, where it requires protection between the Municipal store and Ward street, and that an estimate of the cost of the work be called for." Seconded by Mr. Philip and carried.

7. Upon the motion of Mr. Jonklass, seconded by Dr. Keyt, it was resolved that the Chairman be specially empowered, under the provisions of section 209 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require by notice in writing the owner or occupier of the premises in Castle Hill street, numbered 30/31, to close the cess-pool of the said premises and to substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

8. The Chairman submitted an application from the Planters' Association, made through their Chairman, for permission to erect the porch of their New Memorial Buildings on the road reservation of Ward street. It was resolved that permission be granted, and that the portion of the reservation required for the purpose be

leased to the Association at a nominal rent of one rupee a year. 9. Applications for the Chief Inspectorship vacant by the resignation of Mr. Van Twest, were considered, and

Mr. P. F. Toussaint was appointed to the vacant post. 10. Mr. Jonklaas, with leave of Council, postponed until next Meeting of Council the motions standing in his

name regarding the supervision of scavenging, &c.

Health Officer's Report for April, 1897.

Water Supply .-- The Public Analyst reported favourably on samples of water sent to him for analysis, but in my opinion the present source of the water supply is dangerous to the public health. Bakeries.—These remain, with two exceptions, in the same insanitary state as previously reported by me. Dairies, Cattle Stands, &c.—All still remain in the same insanitary state as previously reported. Soda Water and Aerated Water Factory—This is not working properly yet, Pasture's filter being not yet

fitted up

Public Market remains in the same condition. I believe estimates are being prepared to thoroughly repair

it, but these estimates appear to take a very long time getting ready. Cattle-exposing Shed.—Ground in vicinity remains in a most insanitary condition; as pointed out by me, a proper surface drain requires to be built, also a catchpit.

Slaughter House for Bullocks, &c.—Generally kept in a filthy state, proper buckets for removing blood and offal are not supplied, nor a proper cart either. The drainage is disgraceful from the slaughter-house. Slaughter Shed for Sheep.—Most insanitary, and in a disgraceful state every way. Cooly Lines.—These remain in this usual state every time I have inspected them; the buildings, grounds in the

vicinity, &c., have been filthy in the extreme.

Public Latrines.—At Malabar street, Torrington road, and Mahaiyawa the latrines are in a sanitary state, but the general latrine accommodation is utterly deficient for the town. The latrines have been kept much cleaner during last month.

Night Soil Depot has been kept with great difficulty in a more sanitary condition than usual. Scavenging.—The streets have been kept clean during the last month, but the scavenging carts are in the same state that I have already frequently called attention to. Drains are being repaired in various places slowly, but the system of drainage in the town of Kandy is most

defective

Alleys, without exception, are filthy and insanitary in the extreme, the state of some being disgraceful. I visited every one during the past month, and was warned to attend on Special Committee about fixing sites for latrines in them, but no Committee visited them.

Fish Boulagues.—Latterly the smell from them has been awful, owing to a paucity of Inspectors, and inspection of them has to be postponed for the present. Prevailing Diseases.—No disease, as far as I am aware, is prevalent.
