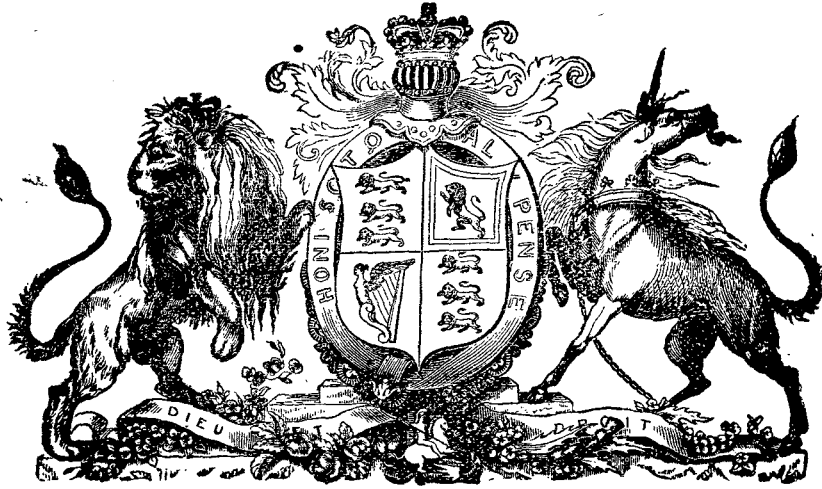

WHEREAS by section 15 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that every person having once paid toll in respect of himself or of any vehicle, animal, or boat at any place, payment at which shall have been declared by the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to clear any other place, shall, on the production at such other place of a ticket denoting such payment to have been made, pass the same without any further payment of toll, except where such person, vehicle, animal, or boat shall at such latter place have become liable to a different rate of toll :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established in respect of the Badureliya bridge, on the road from Badureliya to Kukulegama, in the District of Kalutara, Western Province, shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.
