SUEZ CANAL.

THE VICTORIA DOCK offers special advantages for the long steam vessels, and is engaged in trading between ports in the East and London, by means of the Suez Canal.

The Victoria Dock entrance is the first dock entrance arrival at on coming up the River Thames. It is situated half-a-mile below Blackwall, and by its steam vessels avoid all the bends in the more crowded parts of the river.

The depth of water on the sill of the gates is 28 feet and the capacity of the dock is adequate to the largest class of vessels.

By means of hydraulic cranes vessels are unloaded and loaded with unexampled despatch. Goods to and from the Victoria Dock are received at and delivered from the Minorities Station by frequent trains in the day.

Passengers are conveyed to and from the Dock by trains between the Fenchurch Street and Bishopsgate Stations every quarter of an hour.

REUTER'S TELEGRAMS.

FOR THE CEYLON TIMES.

London 27th August, (Noon.)

The Prussian Vanguard is between Chalons and Epernay.

The Emperor Napoleon follows Marshal Macmahon who took the direction of Vouziers but nothing is known of his subsequent movements.

A fourth German Army Corps is forming under the Crown Prince of Saxony.

The Over-Regulation Committee has issued a report declaring that although the practice is not formally sanctioned yet it has received tacit acquiescence amounting to virtual recognition by civil and military authorities and Departments.

OBITUARY.—Sir Alexander Woodford, Field Marshal, The Marquis of Hertford, General Glencairn Campbell.

London, 27th August,

(By Indo-European Telegraph.)

The Prussians officially deny that Marshal Bazaine has escaped from Metz. On the contrary his capitulation is probable from his being short of provisions.

The Prussians calculate the French loss on the 18th at 23,000 men.

Fever prevails amongst the wounded at Metz.

The Prussians are rapidly advancing on Paris.

(By British Indian Cable)

Paris, 26th August, 9-40 p. m.

Official intelligence received here states that Phalsbourg still holds out and has repulsed two Prussian assaults.

The Prussian Scouts are within ten miles of Rheims—a large Prussian force is round Verdun. The Prince Royal continues his march on Paris.

The defence Committee of Paris are taking measures for the eventuality of a siege.

(By British Indian Cable.)

Paris, 28th August, (Morning)

The Prussian movement in the Department of Aube appears to have been arrested, as the troops are falling back on Saint Dizier.

Prussian troops have arrived before Rheims.

(By Indo-European Telegraph.)

London, 28th August.

Thionville is invested.

Prince Frederick Charles has been reinforced by two Landwehr Divisions.

A new fourth German Army covers the Flank of the Crown Prince of Prussia.

Three German armies in reserve are forming.

The Chief Prussian Head-quarters is now at Saint Dizier.

(By British Indian Cable.)

Paris, 28th August, 7-5 p. m.

Official accounts received here state that the Prussian force in the Departments of Aube and Marne appears to be proceeding northwards towards Rathel and Verziers.

Prussians will not continue their march on Paris until after a battle with Marshal Macmahon.

French rumour asserts that the King of Prussia has dismissed General Steinmetz, the remnants of whole (query whose) Army has joined the Crown Prince,

London, 28th August, 8-50 p. m.

The small fortress of Viory (query Vitry) has capitulated.

Fighting is reported to be going on at Stenay near Belgium.

Belgian Troops are under orders for the frontier.

London, August 25.

A private telegram quotes Native Good Ordinary 47s.

London, 26th August, (Afternoon.)

The Coffee market is improving.
