THE INDIAN INSOLVENCY BILL.

The Straits Government are following the
example of the Imperial legislature in passing
a new Insolvency law. India is doing the
same, and from statements that have appeared
in the columns of our Indian cotemporaries
they appear to be there following the principle
of the English law in all essentials.

The leading feature of the Indian Act is
that the solvent obtains his discharge on the
surrender of his property, if his assets are
sufficient to pay eight annas in the rupee,
or if his creditors wish him to be discharged.
If the assets do not reach this amount, and
if the difference is not paid in three years, the
amount unpaid becomes a judgment debt
against the insolvent, which may be enforced
with the leave of the Court.

Several modifications have been introduced
in order to adapt the English measure to
India. Of these, the most important are the
following: The Bill makes no distinction be-
tween traders and non-traders; the chief
Insolvency Court is defined so as to include
the four High Courts and the Chief Court of
the Punjab; the Local Insolvency Courts will
be in the Regulation Provinces, the District
Courts; in the Non-Regulation Provinces,
other than British Burma and Sindh, the Com-
missioners of Divisions; in Burma the Recor-
ders; in Sindh, the Judicial Commissioner.
All orders made by the Chief Insolvency
Court in respect of matters brought before it
on appeal will be final, unless such Court
gives leave to appeal to the Judicial Com-
mittee of the Privy Council.
