Foreword

From Mr. R.P. Perera Secretary General Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO



In 2012, the focus was placed on the ongoing initiatives regarding Education for Peace and Sustainable Development and the establishment of a "South Asian Centre for Teacher Development".

On 30 January 2012, HE the President of Sri Lanka, Hon. Mahinda Rajapaksa, launched the National Action Plans on Education for Peace and Sustainable Development (EPSD), which are part of Sri Lanka's action in the context of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (2005-2014). Sequel to the launch, the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO had follow up meetings with the Secretaries of Economic Development. Education. Environment,

Health, Social Services and the Director of National Planning, to develop further the draft plan and logical framework of actions for EPSD. Continued efforts in collaboration with all concerned stakeholders will be required in the years ahead, in order to ensure proper implementation of the plans.

As part of the preparations for the establishment of the "South Asian Centre for Teacher Development" in Sri Lanka, a South Asian Ministerial-Level Symposium on Teacher Development was held in Mount Lavinia on 9 October 2012. The Hon. Ministers of Education from Bangladesh, Maldives, Nepal and Sri Lanka, as well as delegates from India and Pakistan partici-

pated in the symposium. They expressed their interest and support for the proposed UNESCO Category II Regional Centre for Teacher Development and discussed and gave recommendations for the way forward.

Further, the National Commission organized a National Forum on Education for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and in Emergencies (EiE) in collaboration with UNESCO Bangkok, the Ministry of Education, Ministry of Disaster Management, the Disaster Management Centre and other stakeholder groups.

The UNESCO Global Monitoring Report under the theme of "Youth, Skills and the World of Work" was







launched on 16 October 2012, in collaboration with the Ministry of Youth and Skills Development and other UN partners. Also, a photo class was organized in Sri Lanka in collaboration with the Asia-Pacific Centre of Education for International Understanding (APCEIU) in Seoul, Korea, to promote creativity and international understanding.

In the Culture Sector, a workshop on the implementation of the 2003 UNESCO Convention on the Safeguarding of Intangible Cultural Heritage was held in close collaboration with UNESCO New Delhi and the Ministry of Culture and the Arts. Further, the 40th Anniversary of the Convention concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and

Natural Heritage was celebrated with a seminar organized by the Ministry of National Heritage on 3 August 2012.

In the Sciences, the efforts of promoting Chemistry in Sri Lanka were carried over from the International Year of Chemistry, which had been celebrated in 2011. Continued support was also provided to the Global Forum of Sri Lankan Scientists.

Furthermore, the participation of Sri Lankan experts in a number of international workshops organized by UNESCO was facilitated, and 7 proposals for the Participation Programme of UNESCO were processed and forwarded to UNESCO Headquarters.

This report aims to provide the reader with a comprehensive overview of all activities carried out by the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO and UNESCO itself in Sri Lanka in the year 2012, as well as the visits of UNESCO delegations, grants, training programmes and fellowships awarded to Sri Lankan Officials.

Last, but not the least, the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO will continue to pursue the incorporation of its statutes by way of an Act of Parliament to strengthen its capacities.

UNESCO

The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) is a multi-lateral organization with 195 Member States. Its Headquarters are located in Paris, France.

UNESCO has the broadest mandate of all United Nations organizations:

EDUCATION is a central focus of UNESCO to promote peace and social development. UNESCO coordinates the global programme "Education for All" (EFA) with the objective of providing all children worldwide with a basic education as well as halving the illiteracy rate.

The Global Monitoring Report on the EFA goals, which UNESCO publishes annually focused on the topic "Youth, Skills and the World of Work" in 2012.

In its global network, UNESCO cooperates with approximately 9.000 associated schools in 180 countries, 700 UNESCO Chairs at universities worldwide as well as UNESCO Category I and II institutes and centers in all fields.

UNESCO promotes all aspects of education, including early childhood education, inclusive education, "Education for International Understanding", adult education, technical and vocational education. UNESCO is the coordinating agency for the UN Decade on "Education for Sustainable Development" (ESD) (2005-2014) and the UN Literacy Decade (2003-2012).

The promotion of international cooperation in the SCIENCES, is another aspect of UNESCO's mandate. UNESCO focuses particularly on global climate change, sustainable development, biodiversity and disaster preparedness and mitigation. UNESCO has six long-term programmes in the fields of water (IHP), oceanography (IOC), biospheres (MAB), geology (IGCP), basic natural sciences (IBSP) and social transformations (MOST).

UNESCO coordinates a global tsunami early warning system and promotes international cooperation in the research on pressing global questions: the water crisis, decline of biodiversity and international migration, as well as others.

UNESCO is the only UN agency with a mandate for CULTURE. The main aim of its Culture programmes is to safeguard the

world's cultural and natural heritage, and to promote the dialogue between cultures. The Conventions on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions (2005), for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage (2003) and concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage (1972) serve as the international legal framework.

In 2012, UNESCO celebrated the 40th anniversary of the World Heritage Convention and inscribed 26 new properties on the World Heritage List, including both cultural and natural sites.

The COMMUNICATION AND INFORMATION programme of UNESCO supports the development of knowledge societies around the world, that ensure freedom of opinion and speech, allow access to information, knowledge

and education for all and promote cultural diversity.

The "Memory of the World" programme of UNESCO, which celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2012, allows the safeguarding and world-wide access to culturally and historically significant documents by digitalizing the documents for future generations. With its "Information for All" programme, UNESCO sets global standards for the access to information as well as the use of the new information and communication technologies (ICT).

The "International Programme for the Development of Communication" (IPDC) of UNESCO promotes the development of infrastructure and independent media in developing countries.

EDUCATION

In 2012, SLNCU advanced several important programmes in the Education Sector. The main activities included the following:

- » Launch of the National Action Plans on Education for Peace and Sustainable Development (EPSD)
- » Preparations for the establishment of the South Asian Centre for Teacher Development
- » Launch of the Education for All (EFA) Global Monitoring Report under the theme of "Youth, Skills and the World of Work"
- » National Forum on Education for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and in Emergencies (EiE).

Education for Peace and Sustainable Development (EPSD)

The National Action Plans on Education for Peace and Sustainable Development (EPSD) were launched by His Excellency the President, Mahinda Rajapaksa, at Temple Trees, Colombo, on 30 January 2012.

The National Action Plans lay out measures to promote EPSD at all relevant levels, by addressing the five pillars of sustainable development: viz., environment, education, peace, health, economic and social development.

Follow up meetings and consultations with the Secretaries of the Ministries of Education, Environment, Economic Development, Health and Social Services, as well as the Department of National Planning took place throughout the year with the objective of further developing the action plans and

logical framework. A national level workshop to consolidate and finalize the action plans and logical framework are to be held in the first half of 2013.

South Asian Centre for Teacher Development (SACTD)

The proposal to establish a UNESCO Category II South Asian Centre for Teacher Development in Meepe, Sri Lanka, was approved by the UNESCO Executive Board during its 189th session in March 2012.

On 9 October 2012, the Ministry of Education and SLNCU hosted the Education Ministers and Government Officials from the South Asian region for the first "South Asian Ministerial Level Symposium on Teacher Development", to discuss the needs of the countries in the

field of teacher development, as well as the future collaboration in the framework of the SACTD.

Hon, Nurul Islam Nahid, Minister of Education of Bangladesh, Hon. Imad Sohli, State Minister of Education of the Maldives, Hon. Dinanath Sharma, Minister of Education of Nepal. Sh. Dinesh K. Bhawsar, Deputy Education Adviser, India, Sh. Gulab Singh, Ministry of Education of India, Mr. Adam Shareef, Centre for Continuing Education of the Maldives, Mr. Suresh Man Shrestha, Secretary, Ministry of Education of Nepal, Prof. Samina Amin Qadir. Vice Chancellor, Fatima Jinnah University for Women, Pakistan, Mr. Shigeru Aoyagi, UNESCO Office New Delhi, and Mr. Shailendra Sigdel. UNESCO Office New Delhi, attended the meeting.

They all expressed their support for the establishment of the Centre and emphasized the need for improvements of the structures for Teacher Development in their respective countries and the region.

The Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of Sri Lanka was drafted and awaits approval by the UNESCO Executive Board. Further, the terms of reference for a consultancy to conduct an in-depth needs assessment and the development of a strategic plan for the Centre in 2013, has been prepared.

Education for All Programme 10th Global Monitoring Report

The UN General Assembly has mandated UNESCO with the coordination of the Education for All (EFA) Programme.


In 2012, UNESCO published the 10th Global Monitoring Report of the Education For All Programme on the topic of "Youth and Skills - Putting education to work", placing a special emphasis on the importance of transferable skills to equip youths for the labour market.

In Sri Lanka, the report was launched on 16 October 2012 at the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Skills Development. The event was organized by SLNCU in cooperation with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Skills Development as well as the International Labour Organization (ILO), UNICEF and UNDP.

Key findings from the report include:

- » EFA progress is stagnating
- » Aid flows for education have slowed down

- » Skills deficit among young people
- » Urgent need to support poor urban and rural youth, especially women

To enhance the delivery of skills through secondary education, the report recommends to:

- » remove barriers to secondary education.
- » make secondary school relevant to the world of work.
- » provide alternative routes to early school leavers,
- » target unemployed youth,
- » support training through traditional apprenticeships,
- » make foundation skills part of entrepreneurial skills training,
- » provide second chance programmes,
- » combine skills training with assets, and
- » provide training via ICTs to reach youth in remote areas.

National Forum on Education for Disaster Risk Reduction and in Emergencies

In cooperation with the UNESCO Regional Office in Bangkok and the Ministry of Education in Sri Lanka, as part of the UNESCO-Japan Funds in Trust Cooperation "Education in Emergencies for Sustainable Development", SLNCU organized the first National Forum on Education for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and in Emergencies (EiE), from 15-17 November 2012 in Colombo.

The objective of the National Forum was to take stock of the activities in the area of Disaster Safety Education in Sri Lanka since the Tsunami in 2004. Participants included representatives of all main stakeholders in the field, including the national, provincial, district and zonal levels.


As part of the preparation for the workshop, a mapping of past and current activities was conducted through a consultancy. The findings of the mapping exercise as well as the outcomes of the National Fo-

rum can be accessed on the SLNCU website.

The final report of the outcomes and recommendations of the National Forum were shared with the Minister of Education and the Secretary, Ministry of Education and will be translated into all three languages and published in 2013.

SCIENCE

In the Science Sector, SLNCU's main focus lay on the promotion of chemistry in Sri Lanka, as well as the further consolidation of the Global Forum of Sri Lankan Scientists that was founded in 2011.

Establishment of a Sri Lankan Nanotechnology Park

The foundation stone for the Nanotechnology Park was laid on 28 June 2012 in Homagama, Sri Lanka. The initiative is supported by the National Science Foundation, Ministry of Technology and Research, SLNCU as well as the companies MAS Holdings, Brandix, Hayleys, Dialog and Loadstar.

The laying of the foundation stone marked a significant step towards the future development of Nanotechnology and Nano science in Sri Lanka. The Nanotechnology Park is expected to build on the

success of SLINTEC, the Sri Lanka Institute for Nanotechnology, which has made great progress over the past years. Thereby it will make a valuable contribution to the industrial and scientific development in Sri Lanka.

Promotion of Chemistry

Following the International Year of Chemistry which took place in 2011, SLNCU took further actions to promote chemistry in Sri Lanka in 2012. Consultations were held with the Institute of Chemistry Ceylon, the Chemical Society of the University of Colombo and the National Science Foundation.

Secretary General of SLNCU, Mr. R.P. Perera, participated in a workshop on Chemistry and Chemical Industry for the Well-being of Society in Sri Lanka, which was held by the Institute of Chemistry Ceylon in June 2012. SLNCU further promoted Chemistry Education within the Ministry of Education.

Global Forum of Sri Lankan Scientists

The Global Forum of Sri Lankan Scientists, which was established in 2011 upon the initiative of Mr. Shehan Ratnavale, former Focal Point of UNESCO in Sri Lanka and SLNCU, made significant progress in 2012. The objective of the Global Forum of Sri Lankan Scientists is to promote and facilitate the collaboration between Sri Lankan scientists in Sri Lanka and abroad in all fields of science and technology. Through this initiative, new research initiatives and industrial projects, including support in the form of funding and technological equipment will be established in Sri Lanka

Several of the initially proposed research collaborations between scientists in Sri Lanka and abroad were developed further throughout the year 2012. The most significant progress was made in projects in

the following fields of research:

- · Biotechnology,
- · Natural Products,
- · Advanced Design & Manufacture,
- Information & Communication Technologies, and
- Green Energy Technologies, especially Solar Technologies.

A Global Forum Cell has been established by the National Science Foundation of Sri Lanka to coordinate the ongoing activities of the Global Forum and provide support and information to Sri Lankan scientists looking for collaborators in Sri Lanka or abroad.

UNESCO Chair for Bioethics

A UNESCO Chair for Bioethics was established at the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH) in Angoda, Sri Lanka, under the leadership of Dr. Harischandra Gambheera in 2012, to promote bioethics in men-

tal health in Sri Lanka.

The inauguration of the Chair on Bioethics took place on 22 June 2012 in Colombo, Sri Lanka, with the participation of Hon. Maithripala Sirisena, Minister of Health, Prof. Carlo Fonseka, President of the Sri Lanka Medical Council, Prof. Russel D'Souza, Chief of the Asia Pacific Ethics Desk of UNESCO, Mr. R.P. Perera, Secretary General of the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO and Dr. Harischandra Gambheera, UNESCO Chair for Bioethics.

UNESCO Chairs assist UNESCO in the implementation of its program.

A Chair may be developed within a university department by reinforcing an existing teaching/research programme in the field of bioethics or ethics of science and technology and giving it an international dimension.

CULTURE

Workshop on Intangible Cultural Heritage (ICH)

A workshop on the implementation of the 2003 Convention for the Safeguarding of ICH, organized by the UNESCO Office in New Delhi, in collaboration with SLNCU and the Ministry of Culture and the Arts, was held from 25-29 June 2012. The workshop focused on the concepts, criteria and guidelines set forth in the convention and their practical implementation, including a field trip to Kelaniya to apply the gained knowledge to the traditional practice of clay crafting.

Two follow up workshops will be held in 2013 and 2014.

Heritage of Northern and Eastern Sri Lanka

The Ministry of National Heritage and SLNCU developed a proposal

for the nomination of a cluster of ancient Buddhist Temples, Hindu Kovils, Ports and Forts in the Northern and Eastern Provinces of Sri Lanka for inscription into the World Heritage List of UNESCO.

The proposal, which was examined by a group of experts, awaits final approval by the Cabinet of Ministers.

9th APCEIU Photo Class for International Understanding

26 November - 01 December 2012
The Asia-Pacific Centre of Education for International Understanding (APCEIU), located in Seoul, Korea, held its 9th Photo Class in Sri Lanka with the support of SLNCU. The theme of the photo class was "Finding Diverse Colors of Sri Lanka".

Three professional photographers from Korea, Mr. LEE Sung Man, Mr. LEE Chong Keun and Mr. OH Jin Woong, taught photography skills to a group of twenty Sri Lankan and three Korean high school students from ASPnet schools. As part of the week-long workshop, the group visited the UNESCO heritage sites in Galle and Kandy and prepared a photo exhibition with photos from their site visits for the last day.

The Korean delegation further included three officials from APCEIU:

Mr. KIM Jong-Hun, Head of Office of Planning and Administration, Ms. CHUNG Kyung-Hwa, Chief, External Relations Unit and Ms. KIM Ji-Eun, Junior Programme Specialist, External Relations Unit.

On 1 December 2012, Mr. KIM Jong-Hun, APCEIU, Mr. Thushara Gunathilake, Director, Aesthetics Education, Ministry of Education, and Mr. Prithi Perera, Secretary General, SLNCU, opened the Photo Class Exhibition at Hektor Kobbekaduwa Agrarian Research and Training Institute in Colombo, Sri Lanka.

To further promote the use of photography in Sri Lankan schools, APCEIU donated the 24 cameras that had been used by the students during the workshop to SLNCU, to be distributed to Sri Lankan ASPnet schools.

PARTICIPATION PROGRAMME

As main UNESCO focal point in Sri Lanka, SLNCU's support is a pre-requisite for the consideration of Participation Programme proposals from Sri Lanka. In 2012, 7 proposals were submitted to UNESCO Headquarters.

In the first stage of the selection process for the biennium 2012-2013, the following three proposals from Sri Lanka were approved by UNESCO:

Empowering Women through Education for Health, Equality and Sustainable Development

The goal of this proposal, which was submitted by the University of Sri Jayewardenepura, is to improve the health status, behavior and care seeking in the war-affected Northern Province of Sri Lanka through community based empowerment of women in the Province.

UNESCO has approved the proposal and will provide funding of USD 26,000 for the implementation of the project.

Follow up of the National Action Plans on Education for Peace and Sustainable Development

The presence of a UNESCO Focal Point in the UN Country Team (UNCT) in Sri Lanka, funded by the UNESCO Office in New Delhi, has notably strengthened the UNESCO presence in the UNCT and greatly improved the tripartite collaboration between the UNESCO New Delhi Office, the SLNCU and the UNCT.

Established in 2009 to enhance UNESCO's presence in post conflict and post disaster situations, the Focal Point's work has been greatly appreciated by the SLNCU and the UN Resident Coordinator's Office.

Initiatives of the first Focal Point, Mr. Shehan Ratnavale, including the development of a Nano Science Park, a Global Forum of Sri Lankan Scientists, and the distribution of books for conflict affected schools in the North East in collaboration with UNICEF and the Asia Foundation are ongoing and progressing well.

The Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO (SLNCU) was established in 1949. It is currently hosted by the Ministry of Education in Battaramulla, Sri Lanka.

Regular Meeting of the General Assembly of the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO on 4 January 2012

The regular meeting of the National Commission's General Assembly was reestablished in 2012. The meeting took place on 4 January 2012 at the Ministry of Education. It was chaired by Hon. Bandula Gunawardhana, Minister of Education and Chairperson of the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO.

In his opening remarks, the Hon. Minister stressed the importance of cohesion and collaboration amongst ministries to overcome the numerous challenges Sri Lanka faces today and explained the efforts being made to establish a new Category 2 UNESCO South Asian Centre for Teacher Development in Meepe, Sri Lanka. He further expressed his appreciation for the efforts being made by the Ministry of Technology and Research to establish a Nano Science Park in Sri Lanka in collaboration with the private technology sector.

Mr. R.P. Perera, Secretary General of the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO, briefed the meeting on the ongoing initiatives and efforts of SLNCU, including the following:

» The proposal for the Constitutional Act, establishing the Sri Lanka National Commission for UNESCO as an independent institution, which pursues the objective of obtaining legal status and more autonomy for the SLNCU awaits approval from the Parliament.

- » The National Action Plans on Education for Peace and Sustainable Development (EPSD) are to be launched by HE the President, Hon. Mahinda Rajapaksa, on 30 January 2012.
- The proposal that has been submitted to UNESCO to establish a South Asian Centre for Teacher Development in Meepe, Sri Lanka as a UNESCO Category 2 Institute is to be approved by the UNESCO Executive Board in March 2012.
- » The proposal for the operationalizing of a UNESCO Scholarship Fund, with the objective of advancing education of disabled and displaced children, needs to be activated.

The presentations were followed by a lively discussion, in which the members of the National Commission mandated the Secretariat to move forward with the ongoing initiatives.


