India, West—Sind Coast—Kurrachee Harbour—Buoy withdrawn, Light exhibited.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 649 of 1898) that the red conical buoy moored about a cable to the westward of the Petroleum Depot pier head has been withdrawn and a red fixed light exhibited at the pier head.

Approximate position: lat. 24° 48' 55" N., long. 66° 58' 25" E.

New Zealand—Cook's Strait—French Pass—Sandbank.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 660 of 1898) of the existence of a sandbank discovered by Mr. McLeath, Master of the ss. Penguin, situated at the eastern entrance to French Pass, Cook's Strait.

This bank is composed of fine sand and shells, with patches of dwarf kelp. Its length within the 3-fathom line is a quarter of a mile E.N.E. and W.S.W., and a quarter of a cable broad, the least depth being 2½ to 2¾ fathoms, low-water springs. From the eastern limit of 3-fathom line the south extreme of Reef Point bears E.N.E., distant 3¾ cables, and Collinet Point S.E. ¼ S.

Approximate position: lat. 40° 55' 10" S., long. 173° 51' 45" E.

It is intended to mark this bank by a buoy.

There is a channel with 8 to 10 fathoms, one cable wide, between the west end of the bank and Reef Point, and another, 2½ cables wide, with 9 to 12 fathoms water, between the east end and Collinet Point.

Red Sea—Massawa Channel—North Bluff—Beacon destroyed.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 665 of 1898) that the beacon on North Bluff, Massawa channel, has been blown down, but that it is proposed to replace it. Approximate position: lat. 17° 17' N., long. 38° 56' 30" E.

Pacific Ocean—Philippine Islands—Luzon—Lagonoi Gulf—Reef discovered.

Notice to mariners No. 667 of 1898, issued by the British Admiralty, is re-published:—

Information has been received from the Board of Trade that Mr. H. Smith, Master of the ss. Charterhouse, reports that his vessel, drawing 21 ft., grounded on a reef hitherto unknown in the southern part of the gulf of Lagonoi, east coast of Luzon, with Albai Volcano bearing S. 10° W. (true), distant about 11 miles.

This reef (Charterhouse) has been placed on the chart with P. D. against it, in approximately lat. 13° 26' N., long. 123° 45' E.

Australia, South—Tasmania—Hobart Approach—D'Entrecasteaux Channel—New Beacon erected.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 669 of 1898) that a beacon painted black has been erected in 16 ft. low-water springs between Three Hut and Long bay beacons, D'Entrecasteaux channel.

From it Long bay beacon or pile bears N. 5° E., distant 1 mile, and north extreme of Simpson point N. 53° E.

Approximate position: lat. 43° 15' 20" S., long. 147° 16' 5" E.

Australia—Cairns Harbour, Trinity Bay—Depth of Water in Entrance Channel.

The Portmaster, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 19 of 1898) that the available depth of water in the dredged entrance channel to Cairns harbour is 13 ft. 6 in. at low-water springs.

The depth available at any time is to be obtained by adding 13 ft. 6 in. to the height shown on the dial of the tide-gauge at the Fairway Beacon, instead of 12 ft. 6 in. as hitherto.
