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## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall on Saturday, June 18, 1898, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

*Present* :—Hon. Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; Dr. Frederick Keyt; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; and A. Philip, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 21 having been correctly published in the *Independent*, they were, on motion of Mr. A. Philip, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, taken as read, and were duly confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :—Statements of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1897 to May 31, 1898, on account of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Work done during the same period; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of May; and also Health Officer's Report.

Resolved,—That the several statements be further circulated, as they have not been seen by all the Members.

Resolved also that the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, with the Health Officer's Report, to be laid before the Governor in Executive Council, and for publication in the *Government Gazette*, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

3. Return of Police employed for Municipal purposes during May was laid on the table.

4. The following correspondence was submitted and read :—

(a) Letter from Mr. J. McDonnell thanking the Members of the Municipal Council for their resolution in respect of him on May 21.

(b) Memorandum dated May 21 from Colonial Secretary forwarding copy of letter of May 21 appointing a Committee to inquire into the sanitary condition of Kandy.

(c) Letter from Superintendent of Police No. 468, dated May 25, sending report of Police Sergeant on subject of insufficiently clad people loitering on the bund.

It was ordered that the matter do lie over until a by-law dealing with it has been passed.

- (d) Memorandum dated June 2 from Colonial Secretary forwarding copy of letter to the Commanding Royal Engineer, informing him that the drains in hospital premises will be altered.
- (e) Memorandum dated June 11 from the Colonial Secretary forwarding letter dated June 4 from the Commanding Royal Engineer, stating that the representative of the Royal Engineer's Department at Kandy has been ordered to hand over the small strips of land which are required, according to the plan forwarded, for the widening of the road round the lake (Victoria drive).
- (f) Letter No. 30 dated June 15 from the Colonial Secretary stating that a communication had been received from the Commanding Royal Engineer, intimating that His Excellency the General Officer Commanding the Troops had addressed a communication to the War Office asking for its approval to the alteration of the boundary line of the Colonial Military land, in order to allow the Municipal Council to widen the road round the lake. The General Officer, pending War Office approval, has sanctioned the alteration in consideration of the Municipal authorities having agreed to divert the course of the two large surface drains which now discharge on to the grounds round the Military hospital.

Resolved,—That the receipt of the letter be acknowledged, and the thanks of the Council conveyed to His Excellency the Governor and to His Excellency the General Officer Commanding.

- (g) Letter No. 26 dated May 20 from the Colonial Secretary inquiring, with reference to the application for a level crossing near the slaughter-house, whether the road at present crossing the railway and the proposed one cannot be joined so as to make one level crossing serve both.

Resolved,—That the correspondence be forwarded to Mr. L. Creasy, Provincial Engineer, for his report and opinion.

- (h) Letter No. 27 dated May 26 from the Colonial Secretary forwarding copy of letter No. 16 of May 16 respecting removal of urine, &c., from the Kandy jails.
- (j) Letter No. 28 dated May 26 from the Colonial Secretary stating that early steps will be taken to obtain sanction of the Legislative Council to the grant of a loan for improvement of the sanitation of the town (drainage).
- (k) Letter No. 29 of June 4 in reply to the Chairman's letter of May 28, referring to a notice dated December 19, 1896, respecting a burial ground for the Convent of the Good Shepherd.
- (l) Letter No. 31 dated June 16 from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging receipt of extract from the Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting held on May 21 (Minute 15) pointing out that the delay in publication of the Minutes of March 19 would appear to be on the part of the Municipal Council, as the Proceedings were not received till April 20.

Resolved,—That it be pointed out in reply that Minutes of Meetings are not forwarded until they are confirmed. The Minutes of March 19 were confirmed on April 16 and forwarded to the Colonial Secretary on the 18th of that month. They were not, however, published till May 20.

5. Read memorandum dated June 3 and June 8 by the Health Officer respecting cesspits in nine of the taverns and liquorshops and on premises Nos. 11 and 12 in Malabar street.

Resolved, on motion of Mr. Sproule, seconded by Dr. F. Keyt, "that the Chairman be specially empowered as provided by section 209 (a) of the Municipal Councils' Ordinances, 1887, 1890, and 1896, to require the owners or occupiers of the said premises to close the cesspools thereon and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor."

6. Read memorandum by the Health Officer dated June 9 respecting the insanitary condition of the ground near the railway tunnel at Mahaiyawa.

Resolved,—That a copy of the report be sent to the General Manager, and he be requested to instruct the gate-keeper to see that people are not allowed to trespass on the railway at this place.

7. Read letters dated May 21 and June 2 from the Manager, Colombo Gas and Water Company, requesting that the position of the 5 arc and 200 incandescent lamps, determined on for lighting of the town, be marked on the plan sent, and the plan returned duly signed and sealed as the official copy of the Kandy Municipal Council's electric lighting scheme.

Resolved,—That the Chairman, Mr. Creasy, and Mr. Philip be appointed a Special Committee to carry out the request of the Manager of the Gas and Water Company.

8. Mr. Beven, in accordance with notice, asked—What the death-rate per month in the Municipality was during 1897.

The Chairman replied that the Registrar-General's quarterly return of Vital Statistics gave the following figures:—First quarter 11.8; second quarter 16.6; third quarter 28.2. The return for the fourth quarter had not yet been published.

9. Mr. Philip inquired, pursuant to notice, with reference to the report of the Special Committee adopted by the Municipal Council on March 20, 1897, why, as approved and recommended, the watercourse (necessary for the effectual drainage of the Municipality, that crosses Katugastota road at the "bridge," or large brick arched culvert, has not yet been properly straightened and planted up carefully and thickly on both sides with bamboo roots along the banks of the stream, the rank and noisome jungle vegetation being felled, burned, and dug up during the dry season at the beginning of the year.

The Chairman replied that the report of the Special Committee had been sent to the Standing Committee to have effect given to it. An estimate had been passed for the improvement of Lady Anderson's road, and work described in the annexed memorandum by the Superintendent of Works had been done under that estimate on the water-course in question:—

*Memorandum by Superintendent of Works.*

During March and April the channel was widened and deepened, rocks blasted, and the sides planted with bamboos (2 cart loads of roots having been transported for the purpose).

The brushwood along the edges of the channel was removed, but not from the banks up to the edge of the road, as landslips would probably result. As soon as the bamboos have grown up the other brushwood, chiefly lantana and wild cane could be cleared away. Stray cattle have, however, done damage to the growing bamboos.

Last week permission was obtained to remove some roots of bamboos from Victoria drive, and these are in course of being planted.

10. Mr. Philip inquired, in pursuance of notice, whether Members of the Municipal Council are not entitled to a perusal of all documents or papers submitted to or laid on the table at General Meetings.

*Reply by Chairman.*—Members are entitled to perusal of such papers.

11. In pursuance of notice, Mr. Beven moved "that the contract with the Gas and Water Company for lighting the Municipality with electricity be not signed until permission has been obtained from the Governor in Executive Council to levy a lighting rate of half per cent. on the annual value of all property within Municipal limits."

Seconded by Mr. Vanderwall. On being put to the Meeting the following votes were recorded :—

12. Mr. Philip moved, pursuant to notice, "that a Special Committee be appointed to consider the revised by-law, section 26 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, with connected papers, and to report to the Council whether Government should be asked to re-consider it."

Seconded by Mr. Sproule and carried.

The following Special Committee was then appointed, viz. :—Messrs. Sproule, Vanderwall, Jonklaas, and Philip—two to form a quorum.

13. Read the report by the Special Committee appointed on March 19 to secure a site for a public latrine at the end of Trincomalee street near the junction of Lady Gordon's road (see Appendix A).

Proposed by Mr. Philip, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, "that the report be approved, adopted, and appended to the Minutes."

14. Read draft reply framed by the Special Committee appointed at the Meeting held on May 21 to the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 18 of April 28.

On the motion of Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Jonklaas, it was resolved "that the draft reply be adopted and forwarded to the Colonial Secretary."

#### APPENDIX A.

Recommendation by Special Committee appointed at the General Meeting, Municipal Council, Kandy, on March 19, to secure a site for a public latrine as indicated in Minute.

Kandy, May 24, 1898.

We beg to recommend, after personal inspection, and a perusal of the annexed memorandum by the Secretary, Municipal Council, who accompanied us, that a site for a public latrine be acquired on the land pointed out adjoining Katugastota road, and above the Mahaiyawa railway station.

We further think that all the land described in the memorandum should be purchased from the owner at the price named (Rs. 200) for Municipal purposes. By so doing the Municipal Council will be in a position to greatly improve the sanitary state of that locality.

#### *Secretary's Memorandum.*

The main portion of the land is situated to the west of the Katugastota road. The premises belong to O. L. Casie Lebbe, bears assessment No. 281, Katugastota road. A narrow strip of the same property lies to the east of Katugastota road between that road and Lady Gordon's road. The portion to the west of the road has a road frontage of 28 ft., and extends back some distance to the Matale railway line. The west portion of it lies considerably below the level of the Katugastota road. The land is planted with a few jak trees and kitul.

O. L. Casie Lebbe objects to sell the portion only of the land required as a site for a latrine, as it would deprive him of the road frontage, and render the rest of the land of little value to him. He has produced the deed in his favour, and is ready to transfer the whole property, including the narrow strip along Lady Gordon's road, for a sum of Rs. 200.

#### Health Officer's Report for May, 1898.

*Water Supply.*—The sources of the Kandy water supply still remain open to pollution, such will be the case till all the land from which the water supply comes is purchased by the Municipal Council.

*Drainage.*—The public drains remain in the same bad state as already reported on.

*Alleys.*—The alleys of Kandy remain in an insanitary state.

*Laundries.*—Notices have been served on dhobies, and some laundries have been whitewashed, and some dhobies have been prosecuted. I hear a Special Committee was to visit all the laundries, which I still consider to be in an insanitary state. Many houses are not suited for laundries, and many more places for the dhobies to wash their clothes require to be built.

*Latrines.*—The public latrines have been kept in a sanitary state.

*District Court and Kachcheri Latrines.*—I consider these latrines, as I have many times reported, to be insanitary, and the drainage from them to be disgraceful.

*Scavenging.*—The new contractor appears to be doing his best. Kandy was kept fairly clean during May.

*Night Soil Depôt at Katugastota.*—This place was kept in a sanitary state.

*Bakeries* are in a sanitary condition.

*Dairies* are kept in a sanitary state.

*Cattle Stalls.*—Nearly every cattle stall is now in a sanitary state.

*Stables.*—All stables in Kandy are kept in a sanitary state.

*Cooly Lines* were kept in a fairly sanitary state during May.

*Fish Boutiques.*—Several cases were taken against boutique-owners for selling rotten fish; heavy fines were inflicted.

*Taverns.*—I visited every one of them, none were in a sanitary state; most of them are now being improved.

*Slaughter Houses* were kept in a sanitary state.

*Cattle.*—I had great difficulty in getting the butchers to supply cattle fit to be slaughtered during the month. I had to reject many cattle and sheep.

*Public Market.*—The various food supplies sold in this building were good. The building is in need of a thorough overhauling, repairing, and repainting.

*Infectious Diseases.*—Chickenpox is and has been prevalent in the Police Barracks at Bogambara and at the barracks in Brownrigg street for some time. I suggested vacating the infected buildings and having them thoroughly cleansed, repainted, and colourwashed; also having a building specially set apart for infectious cases for the police. Should an epidemic, such as smallpox, cholera, or plague, break out in these barracks, I consider that in their present sanitary state the results would be most serious.

(q) 40 cubes earth cutting forming new drains; 2 squares of invert of drain cemented.

(r) Cart hire on transport of planks.

(s) 9 squares of drain rendered in cement plaster, Temple street.

(t) 17 cubes of earth cutting.

(u) 1 square of invert of main sewer repaired.

(v) 33 lineal ft. of outlet barrel drain rebuilt on premises No. 27, Peradeniya road; 10 cubes of earth cutting; 2 cubes of dry rubble masonry pointed with cement for retaining wall and steps; mining and blasting; transport of stone; clearing weeds, &c., from land at head of lake.

(w) Mining and blasting stone for building culvert and transporting; 3 cubes of paving of culvert and side wall built; 22 lineal ft. of masonry arch constructed; 67 cubes of earth cutting for filling in roadway over culvert; 8 cubes of rubbish excavated and removed on roadway; 2 cubes of parapet wall built.

(x) Tarring 2 canoes; cost of 2 canoes.
