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### LOCAL BOARD NOTICES.

I N accordance with the requirements of section 4 of the Opium and Bhang Ordinance, No. 2 of 1893, I hereby give notice that there will be one license for the sale by retail of opium within the limits of the Local Board town of Badulla for the year commencing from January 1, 1899.
