## LÓCAL BOARD NOTICES.

In accordance with the requirements of section 4 of the Opium and Bhang Ordinance, No. 2 of 1893, I bereby give notice that there will be one license for the sale, by retail, of opium within the limits of the Local Board town of Badulla, for the year commencing from January 1, 1899. It will be put up to sale by public auction at the Badulla Kachcheri at 9.30 A.M. on Monday, December 12, 1898, and it will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance, and under the following conditions, viz.:—

- 1. The place licensed shall be subject to inspection, and that no riotous or disorderly conduct be allowed to occur therein.
- 2. The place licensed shall not be kept open for sale of opium at any time before the hour of 6 in the morning or after 9 in the evening.
- 3. The licensee shall cause to be painted or affixed in some conspicuous part of his shop his name, the number of the shop, and the words "Licensed to Sell Opium by Retail."
- 4. No person other than the licensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium under his license, either as agent or servant of such licensee, unless the name of such agent

or servant be registered in the office of the Local Board, Badulla, with the sanction of the Chairman.

5. The purchaser of the retail license will be granted a license to sell opium and to possess not exceeding 50 lb. of opium.

6. The purchaser of the town license will be allowed the licenses for sale of opium in such other places in the Province as the Government Agent thinks fit on payment of Rs. 100.

7. The sale will be for ready money as required by section 6 of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1889.

8. In the event of any re-sale realizing a smaller amount than that at which the highest bidder at the previous sale had been declared the purchaser, such highest bidder shall be liable for the difference, which shall be recoverable by action in a Court of Requests.

9. The holder of the license for the sale, by wholesale or retail, of opium who sells or allows any person to sell opium to any person apparently under the age of fifteen years will have his license cancelled as well as be prosecuted.
