#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India. Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 1st section of the Ordinance No. 13 of 1887 it is enacted amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to prohibit in any river, canal, lake, or inland water of this Island the use of certain kind of nets to be in such Proclamation specified:

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the gunny bag mode of catching fish, or the use of ran-dela or kulu-dela or ara-dela, within the limits of the Angulu-eliya, a portion of the Panadure river, as specified in the schedule hereto annexed.
