PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. West Ridgeway, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the 27th day of July, 1897, issued under the provisions of section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," a Police Force was duly established in the town of Anuradhapura, in the North-Central Province, within the limits in the said Proclamation set out and described:

And whereas by section 34 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that for the purposes of creating a fund from which the expenses of the Police Force payable by each town not created a Municipality are to be defrayed a tax shall be payable on the 31st day of March, on the 30th day of June, on the 30th day of September, and on the 31st day of December in every year, for the quarter ending on the said days, respectively, on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever within every such town, to an amount equal to such percentage on the bona fide annual value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements, as the Governor,



with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint, except in cases where such amount shall fall below the sum of twenty-five cents per quarter, in all which excepted cases twenty-five cents per quarter shall be assessed and payable: Provided, that such tax shall not in the aggregate exceed the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in such town, except as aforesaid, and which sum it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time to determine and appoint: Provided, further, that buildings appropriated to religious worship and such as are placed in charge of military sentries shall be exempted from the payment of such tax:

And whereas the town of Anuradhapura aforesaid has not been created a Municipality:

And whereas the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has determined and appointed that the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in the said town of Anuradhapura is Rs. 1,567-82:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that for the purposes aforesaid the tax payable on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever in the town of Anuradhapura aforesaid, within the limits specified in the schedule to the Proclamation dated the 27th day of July, 1897, aforesaid, shall, save in such excepted cases as aforesaid and in the case of such buildings which are exempted from the payment of such tax as aforesaid, from and after 1st day of January, 1898, be at the rate of four per cent. on the boná fide annual of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements aforesaid.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-eight.

y-laws of the Local Board of Badulla under the Butchers' Ordinance.

- 1. No animal shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-houses situated at Maligawatta and Mediriya except between the hours of 3.30 and 5.30 P.M.
- 2. The place appointed for the exposure of cattle before slaughter shall be the building known as the cattle pound, and situated on the grounds adjoining the police station.

3. Every licensed butcher shall produce for inspection, before the officer authorized by the Board to inspect cattle any animal or cattle he desires to slaughter.

Such Inspector shall note on the voucher produced for each head of cattle his opinion, whether the said head of cattle is unhealthy or diseased, or not. With every head of cattle brought to the slaughter-house the voucher so endorsed shall be produced.

A written permit to slaughter, signed by the said Inspector, shall be produced with each sheep or goat brought for slaughter.

- 4. The animal or cattle for which a permit to slaughter has been given as aforesaid shall then be taken by the butcher to the slaughter-house, accompanied by the Inspector or person deputed therefor, and there slaughtered in his presence.
- 5. Should the meat of any animal slaughtered appear to the Inspector or person deputed to be unfit for human food, it shall be his duty to at once secure the lungs and liver and cause the butcher to produce them and the meat before the nearest medical officer; and if such officer shall be of opinion that the meat is unfit for human food, to cause the same to be forthwith buried or destroyed, and to report the matter to the Chairman, Local Board
- 6. Every butcher or person using the slaughter-house or cattle pound shall pay fees according to the schedule annexed:—

For use of Slaughter House.

Cattle, each head ... 40
Sheep and goats, each ... 30
For slaughtering under special license elsewhere than at slaughter-house ... 50

THE following rules framed by the Village Committee of the subdivisions 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the Koddiyar pattu division of the Trincomalee District, under the provisions of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," and approved by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

RULES made under section 16 of the Ordinance No. 24 of 1889 by the Committee of the subdivisions 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the Koddiyar pattu division of the Trincomalee District.

Every male inhabitant between the ages of 18 and 55 of the subdivision shall be liable to contribute labour annually, not exceeding ten days' labour in any one year, in respect of all the purposes mentioned in sub-sections (1), (2), (13), (16), and (17) of section 6 of the Ordinance No. 24 of 1889, viz., the construction, maintenance, and protection of village paths, bridges, edandas, ambalams, madams, spouts, wells, watering and bathing places, &c.

2. It shall be the duty of every headman to inform the committee whenever it is necessary to call out labour for one or more of the purposes enumerated in rule No. 1, and on receipt of such information the committee shall, after inquiry, prepare a list setting forth the nature of work or works and the probable cost and the names of the villages interested, and shall determine the number of days' labour to be imposed in respect of each work.

3. Wherever a school teacher has been provided by Government at the request of the inhabitants of a village, it shall be the duty of the inhabitants of the villages interested (which villages shall be defined in manner provided

by rule No. 2) to construct and keep in repair the school building.

4. Wherever a school and teacher have been provided, the parents or guardians of children shall be bound to send such of their children as are between 7 and 13 years of age in the case of Moors, and between the ages of 5 and 13 in the case of Tamils and Sinhalese, to the school provided, for five days at least in each week for nine months of the year, provided that the school is within three miles of the house of such parent or guardian.

5. No person shall kill or take fish by means of poison, dynamite, or

other explosives.

6. The use of kraals is forbidden in any river, lake, lagoon, canal, or other waters.

7. No drag-nets, such as karaivalai and adasavalai, shall be used in any

of the waters mentioned in the Schedule A annexed.

8. Bulls intended to be reserved for breeding purposes shall be submitted for the approval of the committee, and if approved, a certificate of approval

shall be given by the Chairman to the owner.

9. On or before the 15th January in each year, every owner of cattle shall give to the police vidane of the village wherein he resides a list of all the cattle in his possession, showing the sex, age, colour, and brandmarks of each, distinguishing buffaloes from black cattle. Any cattle-owner failing to furnish a list within the time specified shall be liable to a fine of 50 cents a head of all cattle not reported by him, and if such owner fails to furnish the list when thereafter demanded by the police vidane, he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten rupees.

10. On or before the 1st March in every year every police vidane shall send to the President of the Village Tribunal a register of all cattle in his division, framed from the cattle owners' lists. Any police vidane neglecting, without sufficient reason, to furnish a register within the time specified shall

be liable to a fine not exceeding ten rupees.

11. All cattle shall be branded before attaining the age of eighteen months. Any unbranded cattle exceeding the age of eighteen months found at large may be seized and taken to the President of the Village Tribunal, by whom such cattle may be sold if not claimed within thirty days and the charges for securing the same may be paid.

12. If the village vidane has any doubt as to the ownership of any animal brought before him to be branded, he shall refer the question to the

- 13. Black cattle once branded with the communal brand shall never be re-branded, or have their brandmarks altered, added to, or obliterated. Buffaloes may be re-branded when the marks become illegible; but this shall only be done in the presence of the village vidane, who shall report the circumstances to the committee within one week.
- 14. Every person who shall acquire any head of cattle in any way, except by inheritance or unless it be born in his penfold, shall obtain a cattle voucher in the Form B in the schedule annexed hereto, to be executed by the village vidane within whose jurisdiction the village of the person

from whom the cattle is acquired is situated. Such certificate shall be issued subject to the rules laid down by the Government Agent. If the cattle thus acquired does not bear a communal brand, the purchaser or person acquiring it shall produce it before the village vidane, who shall cause it to be branded with the brand of the village where the person acquiring resides, and shall report the circumstances within one week to the committee.

15. All agreements for the future sale of cattle shall be in writing, and

signed by the parties concerned in presence of the village vidane.

16. Cattle bearing altered or defaced brandmarks and stray cattle shall be produced by the headman of the village in which they are found before the President, who shall, if there is no satisfactory proof of ownership, cause them to be sold, and shall credit the proceeds to the communal fund; provided that if any person shall within six months of the sale prove his title to the animal to the satisfaction of the said President, it shall be competent for him, with the approval of the Government Agent, to order the payment to the claimant of the proceeds of the sale after deducting all costs incurred.

17. No cattle shall be removed from one village to another or from one pattu to another between the hours of 6 P.M. and 6 A.M. without the written

permission of the village vidane.

18. Any person losing an animal shall within seven days of the loss report the same with full particulars to the vidane of his village. The vidane shall forward a list of lost animals every fortnight to the udaiyar of his division. The udaiyar shall make a list of lost animals in his division, and shall forward it monthly to the Kachcheri through the Vannia, sending at the same time a copy to the President for publication.

19. When a head of cattle possessed on a voucher dies or is missing for a space of one month, the owner thereof shall return the voucher within two weeks to the Kachcheri, or to the udaiyar, who shall forward it to the

Kachcheri, without delay.

20. To prevent cattle trespass, landowners shall fence and watch their fields and hen and surround their gardens with a fence or ditch, and cattle owners shall tie or pen their cattle at night, and in the day shall suspend a stick across their necks or tie them together in pairs, and shall suspend wooden bells to the neeks of buffaloes.

21. No cattle shall be tethered upon any cart road or in such a manner

as will allow them to stray on the road.

22. Cattle seized for trespass and not claimed from the local headman within forty-eight hours shall be sent to the President. If unclaimed within fourteen days, the President or Chairman shall sell the same at public auction after due notice.

23. The carcases of all cattle that have died of disease shall be buried by the owners thereof without loss of time. The village headman shall bury

carcases of which the owners are absent or cannot be ascertained.

24. No cattle shall be removed from any village where there is cattle

disease.

- 25. Every proprietor of cattle or herdsman shall separate every diseased head of cattle belonging to him or in his charge from the common herd and put it into a secluded place to be determined by the village vidane, and disinfect such place by fire or otherwise as the committee may direct; and it shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Committee to cause any head of cattle suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, which is found not properly segregated, to be destroyed and buried at the expense of the owner.
- 26. Every proprietor of cattle or herdsman who has a case of murrain or other cattle disease among his cattle shall report the same to the village vidane or udaiyar without delay, and such vidane or udaiyar shall report the same forthwith to the Vannia.
- 27. The boundaries of all private lands shall be marked by fences, ditches, or stones, according to the custom of the subdivision. Such boundaries shall be put up by the owners of both sides thereof. Any person ordered by the committee so to mark the boundary, who shall refuse or neglect to comply with the order, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 28. No person shall alter, deface, or wilfully injure any such boundary.
 29. Persons residing on either side of a road shall not put dirt, rubbish, timber, mats, copperah, arecanut, or any other commodity in or upon the same or commit nuisance, and they shall not keep carts standing on the road longer than is necessary for the loading or unloading of the same.

30. Proprietors of paddy fields shall see that all the public paths leading

through their fields are not less than 3 ft. in width.

31. No person shall obstruct any village path, road, river, water-course, lake, or ela, or through carelessness or malice injure any village path, road, river, water-course, lake, or ela, or other village property.

The paths between several villages in the district shall be kept clear by the joint labour of the villagers; the people of each village shall clear the path leading from it to the limit prescribed by ancient custom. It shall be the duty of the police vidanes to see that the paths are kept clear, and to call out labour when necessary.

33. No persons infected with any contagious disease shall wash them-

selves or their clothes in any public bathing place.

34. No person shall be oul a village ela, village well, or spring of water used for drinking purposes by the inhabitants of any village.
