PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 6 of "The Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor may, from time to time, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, frame and establish such port rules, not inconsistent with the said Ordinance, as he may think necessary for any of the purposes in the several sub-sections of the said section specified, provided that such port rules shall be promulgated by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* at least one month before the same shall take effect:

And whereas the Port of Colombo was brought within the operation of the said Ordinance by a Proclamation dated the Sixth day of January, One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-six, and certain port rules have been duly framed, established, and promulgated for the said Port of Colombo:

And whereas a port rule was made and established for the Port of Colombo for the purposes of the said Ordinance by Proclamation dated the Twenty-first day of June, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-six:

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 23 of 1884 it is further enacted that whenever by any law or Ordinance of this Colony power is given to "the Governor in Executive Council,"

or to "the Governor, with [the advice of the Executive Council," or to "the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council," to make any rules or regulations under such law or Ordinance, such power shall be deemed to include the power of altering, amending, adding to, or repealing any rules or regulations so made :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation promulgate the following port rule in lieu of the port rule promulgated by Our Proclamation dated the Twenty-first day of June, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-six, which is hereby repealed.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eleventh day June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-eight.

THE following rules and orders made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, where special precautions have been and are necessary, are published for general information in lieu of the rules promulgated annually for several years.

Rules.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be, and it is hereby limited to sixteen days, namely, from 19th July to 3rd August, 1898, inclusive. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named, or staying beyond the period here prescribed, shall be guilty of an offence.

2. It shall be lawful for the Police authorities or any Police Magistrate at any place on the line of march to prohibit from proceeding all persons who, by reason of disease, infirmity, weakness, advanced age, youth, want of supplies, or other sufficient cause, are considered unfit to undertake the journey, or who appear likely to fall ill and endanger the health of others; and to require such persons to find security to ensure their obedience to the orders so given. In default of such security being found, it shall be lawful for the said Police authorities or Police Magistrate to detain such persons in custody for a period not exceeding three days.

3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

4. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices;
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

5. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

6. Any pilgrim tethering or keeping cattle in any place other than that assigned by the Police shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any pilgrim who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

10. All pilgrims shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any pilgrim declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

11. The number of pilgrims for the pilgrimage of the year 1898 is restricted to 1,000, viz., 170 pilgrims for the Colombo band, 166 for the Kandy band, 166 for the Galle band, 166 for the Kurunegala band, 166 for the Batticaloa band, and 166 for the Badulla band.

12. No person shall take part in the pilgrimage of the year 1898 without having first obtained a ticket from the Government Agent of the Western Province for the Colombo band, or from the Government Agent of the Central Province for the Kandy band, or from the Government Agent of the Southern Province for the Galle band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Western Province for the Kurunegala band, or from the Government Agent of the Eastern Province for the Batticaloa band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Uva for the Badulla band.

13. Every pilgrim shall show his ticket when required to do so by any officer of Police, or by any officer appointed to enforce the observance of orders under the Ordinance aforesaid.

Regulations under Section 5 of Ordinance No. 16 of 1897 (to come into effect from July 1, 1898).

Any person claiming a rebate of duty paid on kerosine oil used as the source of motive power in any oil engine shall, at the time of making such claim, furnish the Principal Collector of Customs with a certificate setting out the place where the engine was used, a description of the engine including the name of its maker and its horsepower, the period for which rebate is claimed, the number of hours during which the engine was employed in such period, and the quantity of oil used during those hours as the source of motive power in such engine.

2. Every such claim shall be made quarterly or half yearly, and no such claim shall be made for any period less than one month.

3. Every such claim certificate shall be signed by the person making the claim or by some person having actual knowledge of the facts, and shall set forth that to the knowledge of the claimant or of such other person the quantity of oil upon which a refund of duty is claimed was used during the period stated for the number of hours stated as the source of motive power in the oil engine described in the certificate.

4. The Governor, on the recommendation of the Principal Collector of Customs, may appoint any person to inspect any engine described in any certificate, and to make any test or tests necessary for the verification of any statement in the certificate or affidavit, and the person making the claim for refund shall provide all labour, fuel, and other material necessary for the conduct of such test.

5. Any person claiming a rebate as aforesaid shall from day to day write in a book kept only for that purpose, in the form hereunder given, an account of the number of hours during which the engine was used in each day, and the quantity of oil consumed in such time, and shall, whenever required, produce such book for inspection to the Principal Collector of Customs or the person appointed by him under the fourth section of these rules:—

6. The Principal Collector of Customs may require such other evidence as he may deem necessary to satisfy him that the quantity of kerosine oil upon which the refund of duty is claimed was actually used as the source of motive power in the oil engine described in the certificate.

7. The Principal Collector of Customs, on being satisfied that the quantity of kerosine oil was actually used for the period stated as the source of motive power in such oil engine, shall refund the duty upon such quantity to the person claiming the refund.

BY-LAWS.

1. *Government Agent to determine number of Passengers.*—The Government Agent, or any officer thereunto authorized by the Government Agent, shall determine the number of passengers to be carried in every carriage prior to issuing the license required by law, and the registered number of the carriage shall be painted in a conspicuous part (to be determined by the Government Agent) of such carriage, and shall be at all times plainly and distinctly visible and legible, provided, however, that such painting may be dispensed with at the discretion of the Government Agent.

An infant carried in arms or on the lap, or one child not so carried but under eight years of age, shall not be deemed a passenger; but two children under eight years of age not so carried shall be considered an adult passenger, and so on in the same proportion for any number of children.

No person to whom any license shall have been granted shall refuse to carry the full number so determined, or shall carry more than the said number.

2. Every carriage shall have and carry two good and sufficient lamps, one on either side of the driver, ready for lighting, and the same shall be lighted, if the carriage be used, between the hours of 6.30 P.M. to 5.30 A.M.

3. *Inspectors to inspect Carriages on Government Agent's written authority; if Carriage, &c., unfit for use, Owner to be noticed not to hire.*—Some suitable person being thereto authorized by the Government Agent in writing, shall, at least once a month, or oftener if such person deem necessary, inspect all carriages licensed to ply for hire within the limits of the Local Board of Kurunegala, and the horse or horses used in drawing such carriage, and shall submit a report thereof to the Government Agent. If any such carriage or horse or horses shall at any time upon such inspection be found unfit for public use, notice in writing of the same shall be given by the Government Agent to the owner of such carriage; and after such notice he shall not use, or suffer to be used, or let to hire, such carriage until the same, or the horse or horses used in drawing the same, shall have been declared by the Government Agent to be in a fit condition.

4. *Government Agent to appoint Stands.*—The Government Agent shall appoint places as public stands for licensed carriages, and may from time to time, by resolution, abolish or alter, as he shall see fit, the number and situation of the said stand.

5. *Notice to be given of opening of Stands.*—When such public stand shall be appointed the Government Agent shall cause due notice thereof to be given by beat of tom-tom, or in such other public manner as to him may seem fit, that the same will be opened for public use on a date to be fixed in the said notice.

6. *Position to be taken by Carriages at Stands.*—Every carriage, on its arrival at any public stand, shall be drawn to the end of and be last of the rank of any carriages already occupying such stand; and at every stand all carriages shall be arranged only in single rank.

7. *Table of Fares to be affixed inside Carriage.*—The table of fares fixed by these by-laws, printed or inscribed on a card or plate, shall be affixed inside in some conspicuous part of every carriage plying for hire, and such card or plate shall be left so affixed and legible and undefaced during all the time the carriage shall ply or be used for hire.

8. *Owner of Carriage bound to let same for hire; Fare payable on demand.*—The owner or driver of any licensed carriage shall be bound and compelled at all times to let such carriage for hire, whether the same be on the stand during the hours appointed or at the residence of the owner after such hours, to any person applying for the same, to proceed therefrom to any place on any carriage road within the Local Board limits,

unless the said carriage, or the harness, or the horse used in drawing the same, shall be unfit for use, or unless he has some other like reasonable cause for refusing; provided, however, that any person so applying for such carriage shall, upon demand being thereto made, immediately, and before such carriage is used, pay to the owner or driver the fare authorized by law.

9. *Carriage exempt from operation of these By-laws.*—No carriage which shall be let to hire on special agreement only, or bespoke at the residence of its owner for a day or a longer or a shorter period, shall be subject to the operation of these by-laws, so long as its term of engagement remains unexpired.

10. *Maximum distance to be travelled.*—All licensed carriages shall be compelled to carry passengers from any public stand to any place within the limits of the Local Board, provided, however, that any horse let to hire shall not be compelled to travel more than 10 miles between the hours of 6.30 A.M. to 7 P.M.

11. *Fares.*—The following shall be the rates and fares for carriages, hackeries, and jinrickshaws licensed to ply for hire under the Ordinance No. 17 of 1893:—

(b) Unless and until such person shall be examined by the Health Officer, and shall be declared to be free from infection with the plague.

2. No person shall be allowed in any port to tranship from any vessel coming from an infected port to any other vessel unless and until such person shall be examined by the Health Officer at the port of transshipment, and shall be declared to be free from infection with the plague.

To be delivered at the Public Works Department Store, Mullaittivu, measured and bagged.

To be delivered at the Public Works Department Store, Vavuniya, measured and bagged.

2. Tenders should be submitted in duplicate, the original being forwarded to the Director of Public Works and the duplicate direct to the Hon. the Auditor-General, both to be forwarded at the same time.

3. The tenders are to be made on forms which will be supplied upon application at the office of the Government Agent, Jaffna, and the Assistant Government Agents, offices, Mannar, Vavuniya, and Mullaittivu, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form.

4. A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required before any form of tender is issued; and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

5. Cash security will be required for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of the security, and all other necessary information, can be ascertained upon application at the office of the Provincial Engineer, Jaffna.

6. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
