GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following regulations and by-laws made by the Local Board of Kalutara, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by sections 5 and 12 of "The Cemeteries Ordinance, No. 5 of 1898," in respect of the general cemeteries known as Hamidiriya cemetery, situated at Palatota in Kalutara South, and Ahupiyannawa cemetery, situated in the village Deđiyewela at Kalutara North, in the District of Kalutara, Western Province, are hereby published for general information, and the existing regulations dated December 23, 1886, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 4,764, and those dated May 26, 1884, published in the *Government Gazette* 4,591, are hereby cancelled and withdrawn.

REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS.

1. All applications for graves are to be made to the keeper of the cemetery at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial of the body for which the grave is required.
2. The keeper must intimate the line to be followed by a funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one come at the same time the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves:
3. Should it be necessary, for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by the other, and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before another can be commenced.
4. The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his commands are to be obeyed.
5. No grave shall be less than 4 ft. in depth or at a distance of less than 4 ft. from any other. No grave shall be re-opened within a year, nor vault within six months, from the date of the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent Police Magistrate.
6. No dead body shall be buried without the permission of the cemetery-keeper; such permission shall not be granted till all fees due have been paid.

Provided that paupers dying in the Government Civil Hospital shall be buried free of charge by the hospital contractor or servants under the direction of the cemetery-keeper.

8. On the production of a certificate signed either by a Minister of the Christian religion, or by the Mudaliyar of the district, or a Justice of the Peace, or a member of the Local Board, that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees herein prescribed for the digging of a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

9. Parties may choose the person to perform the burial service, and the fee agreed upon shall be paid to him by the parties concerned.

10. All burial and cremation grounds not proclaimed as general cemeteries under Ordinance No. 12 of 1862 now in use, or what it may be hereafter desired to use, must be registered in the office of the Local Board.

11. Burial or cremation grounds shall be liable to inspection at any time by the Chairman of the Local Board or any person deputed by him, or any officer of Police not below the rank of Sergeant.

12. A register of burials in each such burial or cremation ground must be kept on the proper standard form (G. A.—M 20). Such forms may be obtained on application to the Local Board. The register so kept shall be open to inspection by the Chairman, Local Board, or any person deputed by him, or any officer of Police not below the rank of Sergeant.

13. All registered burial and cremation grounds must be kept properly fenced and kept free from jungle and clean to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Board.

IT is hereby notified that an examination under the Regulations of August 26, 1891, for gentlemen in the Civil Service will be held in the Council Chamber on Monday, July 25, 1898, at 11 o'clock A.M.

The *vivá voce* examination in the native languages for officers in the Public Works Department will be held at the same time and place.

Candidates are requested to send in their names not later than the 16th proximo.

Gentlemen in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking up the Sinhalese or Tamil languages.

But if a contractor submits a security bond which does not bear the name or stamp of the lawyer who drafted it, he will be required to pay a fee of Rs. 10-50 to the Attorney-General for approving each bond.

9. The security bond should be furnished within two weeks of acceptance of tender being notified.

10. All alterations or erasures in tenders should bear the initials of the tenderers, otherwise the tenders will be treated as informal and rejected.

2. Tenders should be submitted in duplicate, the original being forwarded to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and the duplicate direct to the Hon. the Auditor-General, both being required to be forwarded at the same time.

3. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, or to the Medical Officer in charge of the respective hospitals, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form, and the tender and the schedules attached thereto each signed in the presence of two respectable witnesses. Each tender should be for provisioning one hospital only.

4. Every tenderer will be required to make a deposit (on applying for forms) of half the amount of security for hospitals where Rs. 400 or under are required, and Rs. 200 for hospitals where security over Rs. 400 is required; and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned after the contract has been signed. The deposit must be made at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and the deposit receipt must be produce to the officer issuing the form as his authority for making the issue. In stations where there are no Kachcheries the deposit must be made to the Medical Officer in charge of the hospital.

5. Provisions should be of the best quality, approvable by the Medical Officer of the hospital.

6. When required, samples must be deposited.

7. The successful tenderers will be required to give cash security as given opposite the name of each station, and to sign the bond given in the tender for the due fulfilment of each contract within a fortnight from date of notification of acceptance of the tenders. The amount deposited for tender forms will form part of the cash security, which will be deposited in the Colombo

Kachcheri to credit of the Hon. the Treasurer. Those contractors who are required to furnish security to the extent of Rs. 500 and over may have their securities lodged in fixed deposits, if they so desire, in any one of the local Banks which they must elect, the deposit being in the name of the Hon. the Treasurer. It is left to the option of the successful tenderer to substitute at any time thereafter for cash deposited by him approved title deeds and to enter into a fresh security bond at his expense.

8. In case any person makes any alterations in his tender before forwarding it, such alteration should invariably bear his initials; otherwise the tender will be treated as informal and rejected.

9. Any further information can be obtained on application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
