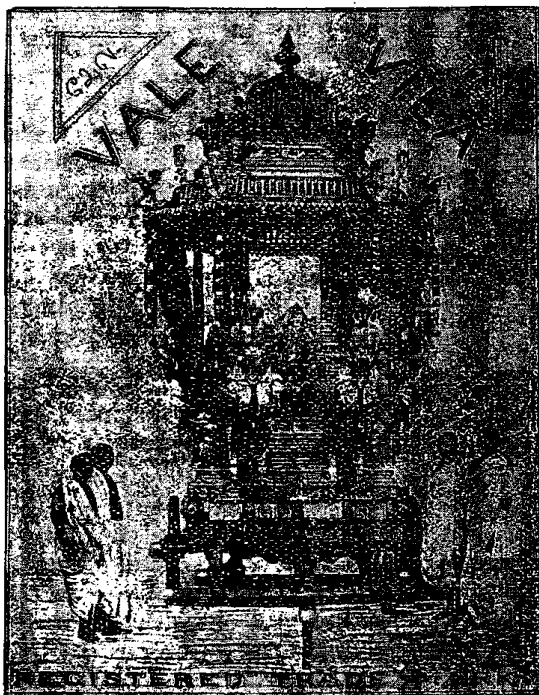

*Australia—North Barnard Islands—A new Sixth Order
Flashing Light exhibited.*

The Portmaster, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 23 of 1897) that a sixth order double flashing white light is now exhibited from the summit of the south-eastern island of the North Barnards, the focal plane being at an altitude of 292 ft. above high water level.

The light is visible in clear weather at a distance of 16 miles seaward, between the bearings of approximately N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. and S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., and shows a double flash every 10 seconds.

The structure is 10 ft. high, and consists of a circular lantern erected on a concrete base and painted white.

In the event of accident to the electric motor or flashing apparatus a small fixed light will be exhibited.

Geographical position (approximately) : lat. 17° 40' 45" S., long. 146° 12' 45" E., from Admiralty Chart.
