*Australia—Pioneer River—Breach at East Point Spit
Beaconed and Lighted.*

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 8 of 1898) that the breach made by the Pioneer river through East Point Spit is beaconed and lighted for use, the old entrance being no longer marked.

Directions.—The Fairway buoy is placed in 3 fathoms off the edge of shoal water and lies with Slade islet, bearing north and Flat Top bearing S.E., distant 5 cables. It may be passed on either side bringing two white beacons in line bearing W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. and pass a red buoy to starboard, and between red and black buoys marking the gap in the stone wall through which the breach occurred; then haul up sharp and steer for Mt. Bassett, bringing two white leading beacons in line ahead bearing N.W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. until two white beacons on East Point come in line astern leading on a N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. course, then proceed as before.

These beacons are lighted at night.

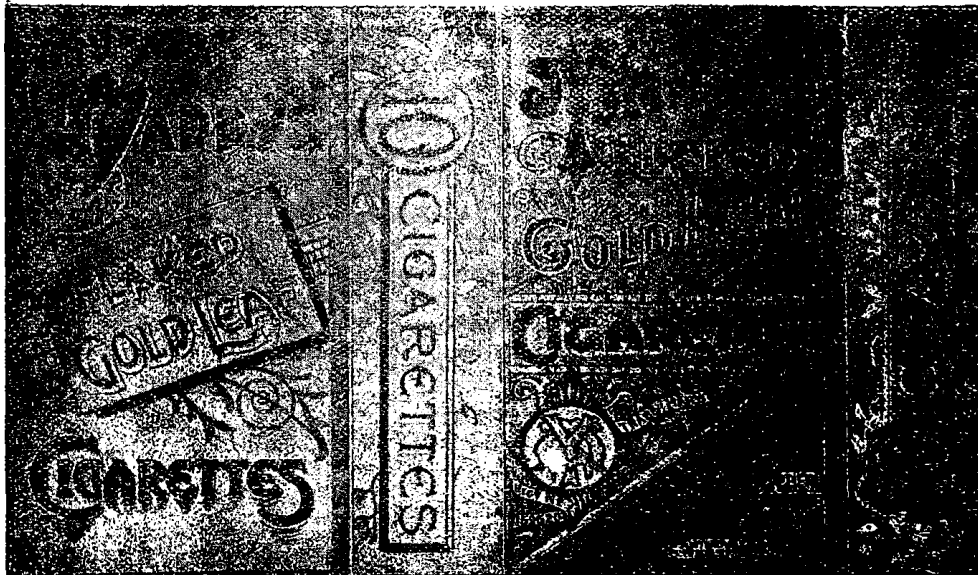
