Eastern Archipelago—Celebes—Opening of the Ports of Kwandang and Belang to General Trade.

The following extract of a despatch (No. 55, Revenue) dated March 24 last, from the Secretary of State for India, and of its enclosures, on the subject of the opening of the ports of Kwandang and Belang in the Residency of Menado (North Celebes) to general trade, is published for general information:—

"In accordance with an Ordinance of the Governor-General of the Netherlands Indies of January 7, 1898 the harbours of Kwandang and Belang in the Residency, of Menado, in the Celebes Islands, will be open to general trade from April 1, 1898.

"These harbours have hitherto been merely visited by coasting vessels, but as their importance has increased owing to the development of commerce, it has been considered that the time has now arrived when they may be opened to vessels of all nations, and when the regulations which are incident to all trading ports, such as the appointment of a Harbour Master, &c., may be put into practice."

India, West—Malabar Coast—Intended exhibition of New Light and discontinuance of certain Lights during 1899.

The Presidency Port Officer, Madras, has given notice (No. 18 of April 26, 1898) that—

D 1

(1) On a date to be hereafter fixed, a triple flashing white light, giving three flashes every 10 seconds, will be exhibited from a white masonry lighthouse to be erected on a rock near to the Kaph ruined battery—latitude $13^{\circ} 13' N.$, longitude $74^{\circ} 44' E.$, approximately. The light will be 140 ft. above the sea, and will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 miles in all directions seaward. It will be known as the Kaph light.

(2) On a date, to be hereafter fixed, a fixed white light will be exhibited from a white masonry tower, to be erected on the southern end of the enclosure known as the Marine yard at Mangalore—latitude $12^{\circ} 52' N.$, longitude $74^{\circ} 50' E.$, approximately.

The light will be 33 ft. above the sea, and will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles in all directions seaward.

(3) On the Kaph light being exhibited, the white fixed light now displayed at Mangalore will be discontinued. Tower will not be removed.

India, East—Madras Coast—Intended Exhibition of New Light and discontinuance of certain Lights during 1899.

The Presidency Port Officer, Madras, has given notice (No. 19, dated April 26, 1898) that—

(1) On a date, to be hereafter fixed, a double flashing white light, giving two flashes every 10 seconds, will be exhibited from a white masonry lighthouse, now in course of erection on the Golconda coast, between False Point Divi and Point Divi—latitude $15^{\circ} 47' N.$, longitude $80^{\circ} 59' E.$, approximately. The light will be 140 ft. above the sea, and will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 miles in all directions seaward. It will be known as the Kistna light.

(2) On the date of the exhibition of this light the fixed white light, now displayed on Point Divi, will be discontinued, but its tower will be maintained as a landmark.

(3) On a date to be hereafter fixed, an occulting white light will be exhibited from a white masonry tower, to be erected on the coast immediately to the northward of the entrance to the Masulipatam river—latitude $16^{\circ} 9' N.$, longitude $81^{\circ} 10' E.$, approximately. The light will be 33 ft. above the sea, and will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles in all directions seaward.

(4) On the date of the exhibition of this light, the fixed white light, now displayed from the flagstaff at Masulipatam, will be discontinued.

India, South—Ceylon, South-west Coast—Point de Galle Harbour—Alteration in position of Kadda Rock Buoy.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 224 of 1898) that the bell-buoy marking Kadda rocks has been altered in position as under-mentioned:—

Kada rocks bell-buoy is now moored in 12 fathoms, $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from outer Kadda rock, with Point de Galle lighthouse, bearing N. $17^{\circ} W.$, distant 9 cables, and the tower on Watering point N. $58^{\circ} E.$

NOTE.—Commanders of steamvessels should keep a position clear of the buoy until the Pilot shows his flag (white, red and white), horizontal, when it is safe to steer for the Pilot's canoe. If under sail the canoe is distinguishable by the letter P on it, with the Pilot flag shown above; should the buoy be out of position, the usual signals from the flagstaff will be made.

South head light is a fixed white light, elevated 152 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles. It is shown over an arc of 220° or from about N. $7^{\circ} W.$, through north and east to S. $33^{\circ} W.$, except where obscured by the land.

The light is shown at the base of the signal staff.

Two white leading lights are shown occasionally at the discretion of the Harbour Master, when it is considered safe for vessels to cross the bar.

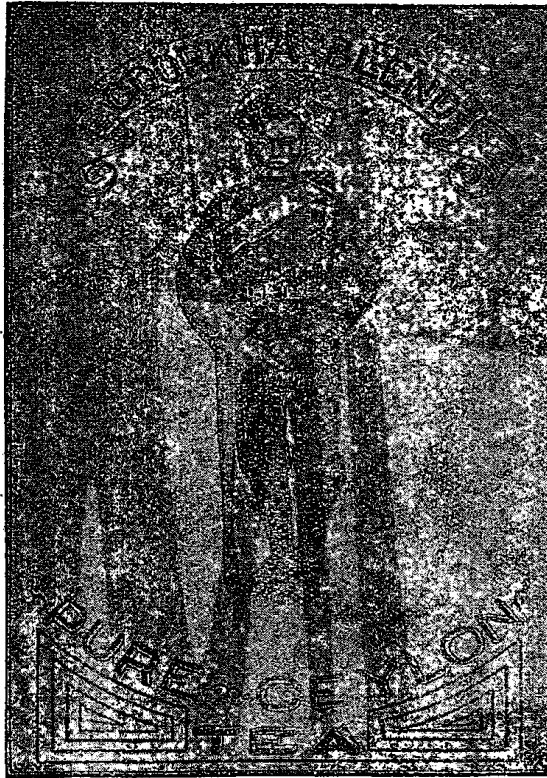

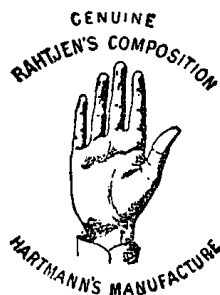
