Pacific Ocean—Philippine Islands—Palawan Island—Shoals reported near South Tai Tai Island.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 244 of 1898) that the Commander of the gunboat Albay reports the existence of shoals and foulground near South Tai tai island (Ikadambuanan):—

(1) A shoal southward of Tai tai, in approximately lat. 10° 47' N., long. 119° 37' E.

(2) A shoal north-eastward of South Tai tai, in approximately lat. 10° 51' N., long. 119° 42' E.

(3) A shoal eastward of South Tai tai, in approximately lat. 10° 48' N., long. 119° 49½' E.

NOTE.—No soundings were obtained on the shoals, but the depths on the two last were estimated to be between 3 and 4 fathoms. The positions are given as on Chart No. 967, and must be considered doubtful.

The symbol for a rock with less than 6 ft. water has been placed in each of the above positions on the Chart, and as the area included by those positions is reported to contain many shoals, the words "Dangerous ground" have been written on the Chart in the locality.
