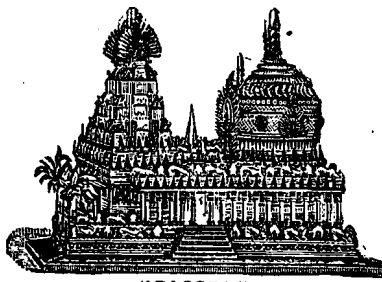

### BENGAL.—No. 143.

*Pacific Ocean—Solomon Islands—Reef to the South-Eastward of Bauro (San Cristoval) Island.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 271 of 1898) that information has been received through the Board of Trade that Mr. H. A. Lever, Master of the ship Imberhorne, reports that when about 72 miles to the south-eastward of Owa Riki, Bauro (San Cristoval) Island, his vessel, drawing 22 ft., struck on a reef, the extent of which was not ascertained, in lat. 12° 5' S., long. 162° 39' E.

This reef (Imberhorne) has been placed in this position on the Admiralty Charts.
