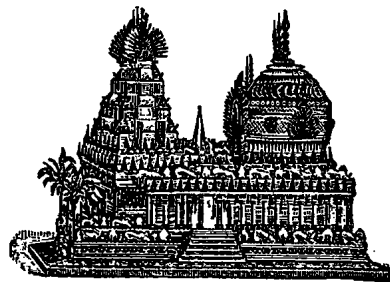

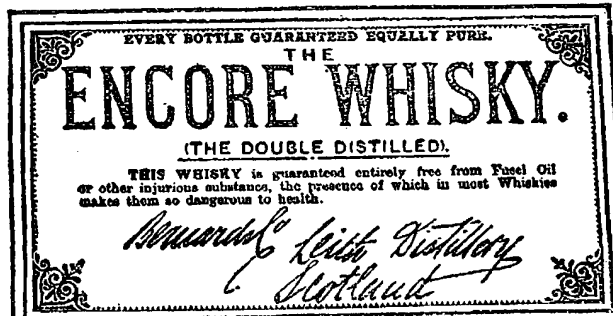

NOTICES TO MARINERS.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the following Notices to Mariners be published for general information.

BENGAL.—No. 144.

Red Sea—Jiddah—Shoals Eastward of Abu Harit, Buoys, Beacons.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 284 of 1898) that information, dated April 27, 1892, has been received from Commander Stanhope, H.M.S. Melita, of the existence of the following shoals lying to the eastward of Abu Harit :—

- (1) A shoal with a depth of 2 fathoms on it lies with Inner Gateway south beacon, bearing N. 31° W., distance 5½ cables, and Sheikh Boulyon (Marabut) N. 49° E.
- (2) A shoal with a depth of 6 ft. on it lies with Inner Gateway south beacon, bearing N. 32° W., distance 5¼ cables, and Sheikh Boulyon N. 51° E.
- (3) A shoal with a depth of 3½ fathoms on it lies one-third of a cable about N. 5° W. from the preceding (2).
- (4) A shoal with a depth of 2 fathoms on it lies with Inner Gateway south beacon, bearing N. 38° W., distance 4½ cables, and Sheikh Boulyon N. 53° E.
- (5) A shoal with a depth of 2 fathoms on it lies with Inner Gateway south beacon, bearing N. 77° W., distance 1¼ cable, and Sheikh Boulyon N. 64° E.
- (6) A shoal with a depth of 3 ft. on it lies with Inner Gateway south beacon, bearing N. 63° E., distance 3 cables, and Sheikh Boulyon N. 59° E.
- (7) A shoal with a depth of 6 ft. on it lies with Inner Gateway south beacon, bearing S. 89° W., distance 5½ cables, and Sheikh Boulyon N. 57° E.
- (8) A shoal with a depth of 1½ fathom on it lies with Inner Gateway south beacon, bearing N. 70° W., distance 5½ cables, and Sheikh Boulyon N. 52° E.

The red buoy marking the south extremity of Bas-el Sunni reef has been replaced by a floating raft with a red triangular structure surmounted by a staff and ball. The white beacon marking the south side of Middle Gateway has disappeared.

Approximate position, Inner Gate south beacon: lat. 21° 27' 50" N., long. 39° 9' 25" E.

Variation, 2° westerly in 1898.

Tasmania—Tamar River.—Red Sector shown from Lowhead Lighthouse.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 288 of 1898) that on May 1, 1898, an additional light would be

established at Lowhead lighthouse 20 ft. below the main light to show a sector of fixed red light visible in clear weather at least a distance of 7 miles, between the bearings of S. 84° E. and N. 86° E., over the Hebe reef.

Approximate position: lat. 41° 3' 25" S., long. 146° 48' 45" E.

Japan, West and North-west Coast—Zozo no seto and Hamada—Exhibition of Lights from Lighthouses erected in these localities.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 307 of 1898) that the following lights would be exhibited from lighthouses recently erected in the under-mentioned localities :—

(1) Tobase sima light is a fixed white light of the 6th order, exhibited at an elevation of 101 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from N. 59° W., through north, to S. 22° E., from a distance of 8 miles.

The lighthouse, which is cylindrical, painted white and about 22 ft. in height, stands on the southern point of Tobase sima, Zozo no seto.

Approximate position: lat. 32° 34' 40" N., long. 130° 29' 5" E.

(2) Tera sima light is a fixed light with white and red sectors, exhibited at an elevation of 27 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles; the light shows red from S. 70° E. to S. 37° E. over Shirase, and white from S. 37° E., through south and west, to N. 1° E.

The light is shown from a stone cylindrical beacon, painted black, erected on the extremity of the reef extending north-eastward from Tera sima, Zozo no seto. The light is unwatched, and therefore unreliable.

Approximate position: lat. 32° 35' 35" N., long. 130° 28' 15" E.

(3) Uma shima light is a 5th order group flashing light, showing two flashes every fifteen seconds, exhibited at an elevation of 109 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 16 miles. It shows white from north to N. 23° E., red from N. 23° E. to N. 26° E., and white from N. 26° E., through east and south, to S. 52° W.

The lighthouse, which is cylindrical, painted white and about 25 ft. in height, is situated on the western extremity of Uma shima in the approach to Hamada anchorage.

Approximate position: lat. 34° 54' 15" N., long. 132° 2' 30" E.

Variation, 4° westerly in 1898.
