Australia—North-west Coast—Sunken Rock in Mary Anne Passage.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 375 of 1898) that information has been received through the Board of Trade that the master of the steamvessel Flinders reports having touched hard bottom, near which a depth of 2 fathoms was obtained, in a position with Great Sandy (Beagle) island bearing E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., distant 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles; and eastern of two sandbanks above water S.S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

Approximate position: lat. 21° 12' 15" S., long. 115° 31' 30" E.

The symbol for a rock with less than 6 ft. water on it, with the words "Flinders rock" written against it, has been placed on the Chart in the above position.

Australia—Gascoyne River—Babbage Island—Temporary Alteration in character of Light.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 390 of 1898) that on and after March 11, 1898, the light on Babbage island would be temporarily altered until further notice from an occulting to a fixed light.

Approximate position: lat. $24^{\circ} 53' 20''$ S., long. $113^{\circ} 38' 45''$ E.

Australia—Esperance Bay—Woody Island—Rock North-east of Island.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 395 of 1898) that information has been received through the Board of Trade that on January 29, 1898, the ss. Time, proceeding to Esperance bay from the eastward through the Recherche archipelago, when abreast of Woody island, struck on an unknown rock.

This rock (time rock) has been placed on the Admiralty Charts as a rock with less than 6 ft. on it, with Woody island summit bearing S. W., distant $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile, and Black island N. W.

Approximate position: lat. $33^{\circ} 57' 5''$ S., long. $122^{\circ} 1' 50''$ E.

Caution.—This approach to Esperance bay is unsurveyed and should not be used; vessels should enter only through Causeway or Western channels.

China Sea—Gulf of Siam—Pulo Dama—Shoal reported Northward of Group.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 399 of 1898) that the Captain of the ss. Donal reports, when to the northward of the Pulo Dama group, and about $9\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-westward of Tree rock, his vessel appeared to take the ground, but without stopping her way. An examination of the spot, however, showed a uniform depth of $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms sand. This shoal must therefore be considered doubtful.

It has been placed on the Admiralty Charts in approximately lat. $9^{\circ} 57' 30''$ N., long. $104^{\circ} 19' 10''$ E.

China—Wei Hai Wei—Leu kung tau Island—Rock reported off North Point.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 401 of 1898) that the Captain of a Chinese ship reports the existence of a rock with only 19 ft. water on it lying 2 or 3 cables to the northward of the north point of Leu kung tau island.

Approximate position, North point: lat. $37^{\circ} 31' N.$, long. $122^{\circ} 11' 10'' E.$

Eastern Archipelago—Sumatra, West Coast.

(1) *Pulo Katang Katang—Intended Flashing Light.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 416 of 1898) that during August, 1898, a flashing light of the 4th order would be exhibited on pulo Katang Katang.

Katang Katang light will show a white flash of five seconds, duration every thirty seconds, elevated 65 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles.

Approximate position: lat. $1^{\circ} 55' S.$, long. $100^{\circ} 35' 15'' E.$

(2) *Sungi Bramei—Alteration in Light.*

Also that during the same month, the period of Sungi Bramei light would be altered from thirty to five seconds, and will in future show one short white flash of great power every five seconds.

During alterations a provisional white fixed light of the 6th order will be exhibited.

Approximate position: lat. $1^{\circ} 2' 40'' S.$, long. $100^{\circ} 22' 10'' E.$

Eastern Archipelago—Salayar Strait—Pamatata Island Light exhibited.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 418 of 1898) that on and after July 1, 1898, a 5th order light would be exhibited on the north coast of Pamatata island.

Pamatata is a white fixed light, elevated 148 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 miles.

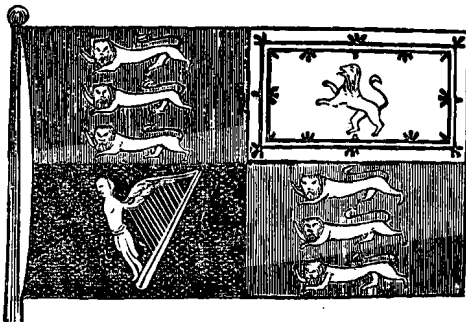
