

FROM THE EDITORS' PENS

Dear fellow ROTARIANS

We go back exactly 12 years to July, 1989 and quote Dr. John A. Howard, a past President and Counsellor of the Rockford Institute in Rockford, Illinois, U.S.A. in The Rotarian under the title "Let's live our motto".

"Service above Self" is a phrase and a concept to which Rotarians willingly and proudly pledge allegiance. The genuineness of the commitment is evident in the remarkable array of civic projects and programs of help, support and scholarship sustained by Rotary Clubs throughout the World.

Even so, as with any ideal, it is useful to back off once in a while and think about the meaning and significance of this bond that joins us with other Rotarians everywhere.

Some of you may have read Viktor Frankl's "Man's search for mean-

Digitized by Noolaham Foundation. noolaham.org | aavanaham.org ing." It is one of those rare words which gives us insight into the depths of our being with an unforgettable power and clarity. Frankl was a Jewish Physician, interned on Auschwitz, one of Hitler's death camps that exhibited the extreme in man's inhumanity to man. No horror story in fiction has ever invented greater cruelty.

As desperate as his life was, Viktor Frankl's professional training and dedication remained intact. As a Physician, he detected a phenomenon that amazed him. It became evident that those who retained their physical stamina longest were not the ones who used brute force to take food and clothing from weaker inmates. Rather the survivors tended to be those whose daily life was characterized by kindness, helpfulness, and reassurance to others. The longer he observed that desperate prison community, the more powerfully this cause - and - effect relationship between compassion and physical endurance registered itself as a certainty.

Having somehow survived his imprisonment, Frankl went on to design and establish a school of psychiatry which he called logo-therapy. In contrast to psychiatry treatment that tries to help the patient understand what happened in the past to cause his disorientation, Frankl's emphasis was directed to the future. It was not so much a question of "How did I get this way?" but rather "How am I going to choose to live my life from here on?" Frankl insisted that man's greatest freedon is in choosing how he will respond to his circumstances. No matter how hopeless and inhumane the situation, an individual can still retain his true dignity, exercising the wisdom and compassion that are the grandeur of his being. A man of science, Frankl discovered and proclaimed as a medical truth that to "Love thy neighbour as thyself" is not just a religious mandate; it is a necessity for health and wholeness.

Let us remind ourselves of this special mission of Rotary International and, as Rotarians acknowledge the central element for wisdom in our motto of "Service above self"; while we make a living by what we get, we make a life by what we give.

Largestichung in Rotary *

- O Worldwide, 163, Rotary clubs have more than 200 members each. The clubs are located in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, India, Japan, New Zealand, Puerto Rico, the United States, and Uruguay. Of the clubs of this size, 143 are in the USA.
- Nine clubs, all in the USA, have more than 500 members each. Besides San Antonio, they are Seattle, Washington, 710; Fort Worth, Texas, 656; Indianapolis, Indiana, 561; Houston, Texas, 558; San Diego, California, 528; Birmingham, Alabama. 528; Denver, Colorado, 521; and Cincinnati, Ohio, 506.
- While the USA has the largest clubs, cities in other countries claim the greatest number of clubs. Scoul, Korea, leads with 159 Rotary clubs and a membership topping 4,500. Tokyo, Japan, has 138 clubs with more than 9,100 Rotarians. Taipei, Taiwan, is another city with more than 100 clubs 107.
- O By another measure of size, five countries with at least 1,000 Kotarians each have an average Rotary club size of 50 members or more. Italy is first, with an average club size of 57.2 members; it is followed by Switzer land, 54.6; Sweden, 54.4; Japan, 52.2; and the USA, 51.5.
