New Zealand—Stewart Island, East Coast—Amended particulars of Ward Rock.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 120, dated June 19, 1896, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 449 of 1896) that the Commander of the New Zealand steam-vessel Hinemoa has recently made an examination of the locality, and found Ward rock to consist of several pinnacles, in an area half a cable in extent, with a least depth of 334 fathoms at low water springs, and 17 to 20 fathoms close around.

It is situated with Akers point rock bearing S. 42° W., distant $1\frac{e}{10}$ mile; and south-west extreme of Bench Island S. 50° E.


