Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, June 27, 1896, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

- The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 16 were read and confirmed.
- Read memorandum dated June 9, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of a letter intimating the nomination of Mr. W. D. Gibbon as a Councillor in the place of Mr. T. N. d'Esterre, who has left the Island.
- The following documents were submitted:—Separate Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1895 to May 31, 1896, in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Report of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of May; also Health Officer's Report. General Statement of accounts not submitted owing to the Accountant's absence through illness.
Resolved,—That the several documents, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, with Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, together with the Health Officer's report, for publication in the *Gazette*.

- Submitted papers which had been circulated relating to remarks made by the Accountant on the account for March regarding issues of kerosine oil.
Resolved,—That the papers be submitted to a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. J. B. Siebel, E. Beven, and W. D. Gibbon.
- It was proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Mr. J. B. Siebel, that tenders be invited for the lighting of Kandy by electricity, and that the Surveyor-General be asked to have surveys made to show the amount of fall in the river between Getambe and Halloluwa, and also in the Hal-oya stream.
On being put to the Meeting this was unanimously carried.

7. Read letter No. 9, dated June 24, from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to the Chairman's letter of April, 27, relating to the disposal of the silt to be removed from the lake, and stating that the Governor is disposed to hand over to the Municipality, for public purposes, the lands belonging to the Crown between the lake and the market, on condition that the lands be levelled up.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on June 27, 1896, at 3 p.m.

Present :—The Chairman ; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G. ; Dr. J. Attygalle ; F. W. Johnson, Esq. ; C. P. Hayley, Esq. ; W. Abeyesundera, Esq. ; W. E. de Vos, Esq. ; D. G. Goonewardena, Esq. ; N. Dias Abeyesinha, Esq. ; and C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. Hayley asked, "Whether the Acting Superintendent of Works has made any report to the Chairman regarding the Bikke reservoir and the land belonging to it, and if so, to move that such report or reports be laid on the table of the Council."

The Chairman laid on the table a letter from the Acting Superintendent of Works, dated May 1, 1896, and explained that there was a question as to the boundary of the land acquired, and he had asked the Surveyor-General to have it defined on the ground. It might be necessary to acquire another small strip to keep off intruders, but the by-laws passed for protection of the reservoir were stringent, and would be enforced.

3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked, "With reference to my motion made on January 18 last, to begin building the retaining wall of the Kepu-ela, and the amendment thereto by the Chairman to the effect that in 'view of the state of the finances it is inadvisable to incur any further liability at present,' how it is that within four months from that time, on the recommendation of the Acting Superintendent of Works, the Chairman gave his ready assent to the work being taken on hand? My proposal was a modest one to build at least $\frac{1}{2}$ or 200 ft. of the embankment. The present contract is to build 400 ft. at a cost of more than Rs. 1,000, yet the one was rejected and the other sanctioned."

The Chairman replied that personally he did not approve of the building of the wall in question, as he considered the improvement of the whole canal and the entrance of the flood from the Gintota river should be comprehensively dealt with ; but as he could not carry the Standing Committee with him, he raised no objection to the building of the wall, as proposed and urged by the Member putting the question, and not at the instance of the Acting Superintendent of Works, whose action had been limited to the preparation of an estimate to carry out the views of the Standing Committee. Further, that the postponement on sanitary grounds at the Member's instance of the completion of the Pettigallewatta canal during the dry season as intended had made funds available for other purposes, which at the beginning of the year it was intended to spend on that work by preference.

4. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked "if the drive from Havelock place to the police station, which was sanctioned by the Council in November, 1894, has been completed, as gravel has been laid on the centre portion of the drive about 10 ft. wide, the road being about 30 ft. in width, and if it is the intention to use 10 ft. on either side of the gravelled portion as grazing ground for cattle ; also to ask for the cost of the work up to date."

The Chairman laid on the table a statement of expenditure incurred on account of the road, and explained that the road had been gravelled to the usual width, and which was sufficient for all the traffic likely to use it.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved "that the question of the salary of the Superintendent of Works be re-opened."

(b) Repaired superficially 378 squares of road ; trimmed sides 29 lines ; cleared side drains 678 lines ; used 16 cubes of metal ; cut branches of 1,739 trees ; filled ruts in all the Fort streets and in Circular road ; opened 90 yards road at Bataduwa.

(c) Repaired bridges on Wakwella road ; used two planks ; re-fixed sixteen planks of Bope bridge ; paid for twelve mendora planks ; repaired foot-bridge over the Kepu-ela ; bought a winch ; repaired Bope bridge.

(d) Rethatched refuse meat market ; repaired Talbot town and Warawatta latrines ; built drains to District Court and Pettigala latrines ; repaired sea-bathing place, fish auction shed, and betel shed near District Court ; bought twelve kegs of 28 lb. each of silicated paint.

(e) Repaired Leyn Baan street and Lighthouse street side drains ; filled up a breach in the main drain, Lighthouse street ; paid for stone slabs.

(f) Paid compensation for land taken up for a drain ; prepared kitul spouts ; provided 1,000 stone slabs for the Pettigala-ela work ; repaired two drains near the fish market ; clearing drains ; building retaining wall to Kepu-ela ; built two culverts.

(g) Railings to Fort new gate ; paid for ten cubes stone ; repair of fire engine ; built a platform opposite Green market.

(h) Cost of materials to screen trees from the wind ; cost of labour ; cost of new iron chains and padlocks.

(j) Built a new latrine at Pettigalawatta.

(k) Repaired seven scavenging carts, three water carts, two latrine carts ; bought four wheelbarrows.

(l) Gravel for China Garden new road.
