#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, September 19, 1896, at 8.30 a.m.

Present:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; Dr. Frederick Keyt; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; B. de Alwis, Esq.; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 15 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :-General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on 2. The following documents were laid on the table:—General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund, also separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1895 to August 31, 1896; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Report of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of August; and Health Officer's Report.

Resolved,—That the several documents, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, together with Health Officer's report, for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. Read report by Health Officer on the state of the privies in premises No.1 and 105 A to I, Trincomalee street. Proposed by Mr. J. H. Sproule, seconded by Dr. F. Keyt, "that the Chairman be empowered, under clause 33 (209 a) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to give notice in writing to the owners and occupiers of the afore-mentioned premises to close their present pit latrines and substitute others on the dry-earth system. This was carried unanimously.

Read letter from the Colonial Secretary, No. 16 of August 29, 1896, respecting the disposal of silt from the lake, and the necessity for a loan.

Proposed by Mr. Gibbon, seconded by Mr. Sproule, "that the Chairman be authorized to write and point out to His Excellency the Governor that the object of the loan asked for is to enable the Council to expedite the work of removal of silt from the lake, and the deposit of it in the hollows near the present Club-house, and that it be pressed on His Excellency's attention that the Council is not in a position without such loan to undertake the work."—Carried unanimously.

5. Dr. F. Keyt brought to the notice of the Council the offensive state of the latrine at the entrance to the

Kandy railway station.

Resolved,—That the Secretary do communicate with the Station Superintendent on the subject, with a view to his taking steps to abate the nuisance complained of.

Confirmed this 17th day of September, 1896.

- (a) 4 manhole covers repaired and clearing iron gratings.
- (b) 307 lines sides and drains cleared; 8 cubes metal transported for Colombo street repairs; 3.50 cubes gravel transported for Colombo street repairs; 40 squares Colombo street repairs executed.
  - (c) 165:30 lines side drains and jungle cleared on Alutgantota road.
  - (d) 259.26 lines side drains and jungle cleared, Udawattakele road.
  - (e) 40 lines side drains and jungle clearing done on Haloluwa road.
- (f) Shifted tiles for leaks; white and colour washed walls; improved and raised walling and trellis to verandab; fixed door and window frames in Secretary's residence.
  - (g) Repaired gutters and pipes and general repairs; includes daily watchers for store and latrines.
  - (h) Repairing wire fences on esplanade.
  - (j) Weeding and attending plants, Kirk street; trimming fences; repairing plant fences where necessary.
  - (k) Value of a file and padlock for general use.
- (1) Improving Gonawatta ferry approaches by blasting rocks on an agreement with Mr. Wilkinson of Kondasalle estate.
- (m) 150 lines clearing sides and drains Lady Longden, Lady Gordon, and Lady MacCarthy roads; building latrine near railway line, portion payment, and providing a box for same.
  - (n) Watchers employed Lake road and Victoria drive.
  - (o) Repairs to steamboat and dredger.
  - (p) Recreation ground daily coolies; working mowing machine and general upkeep.
- (q) 25 cubes earth excavation for foundation; 405 ft. of side drain built up in Colombo street; 400 ft. curbing, Colombo street; 25:40 cubes metal broken and used.
  - (r) Commenced framing, planing planks, and fitting generally.
  - (s) Paid compensation for deviation.
- (t) 25 cubes excavating for improving site of lines; built brick wall to line verandahs and whitewashed the lines; repairing road and sodding; fence improved.
  - (u) Flushing barrel drains where necessary three times a week and general upkeep.
  - (v) Clearing Castle Hill quarry for mining operations in connection with works for No. 2 and 21 estimates.
  - (w) Built a 2 ft. culvert; extended another 6 ft.; 7 cubes filling; 42 lines road extended.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on September 26, 1896, at 2.30 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman (E. Elliott, Esq.), Dr. Anthonisz, Dr. Attygalle, and Messrs. W. E. de Vos, W. Abeyesundere, N. Dias Abeyesinhe, D. G. Goonewardene, and C. L. M. Abdul Carim.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

2. Submitted petition from Inspector D. D. de Silva Nagahawatta, praying to be re-instated in office as collector of taxes in Ward No. 3, or to be granted an increase of pay as Inspector.

Resolved,—That the salary of the Inspector be increased to Rs. 40 a month, to take effect from the day he

ceased to be collector.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. De Vos asked, "The Council not having been consulted by the Chairman in the matter of the programme that was issued for the reception of His Excellency the Governor on his recent arrival at Galle, to ask why he did not think it proper to do so."

The Chairman replied that the programme was laid down by the Government Agent and not by the Chairman of this Council. The particulars in it which concerned the Council were arranged by the Standing Committee, which

met on August 18 last.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. Goonewardene asked, "When it was His Excellency the Governor int imated to the Chairman his wish to confer with the Councillors, and why it was that no notice was given of such intimation to some of the Councillors, thus preventing them from being present at such conference."

The Chairman replied that all due notice was given that was possible to be given within the short interval between the time of the Governor's intimation that he desired to confer with the Council and the time for the levée.

The conference was an informal one.

5. Submitted a memorandum from the Chairman in regard to the working of the latrines in private houses in the Fort.

Resolved,—That the memorandum be generally approved, and that Government be asked to allow the Council to occupy the Moon Bastion to lodge the coolies needed for working the latrines.

- 6. Read letter from the Colonial Secretary to the Government Agent, dated September 1, 1896, forwarded for the information of the Council directing that officer to acquire the land in China Garden required for erecting a latrine.
- 7. In terms of section 88 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, Mr. H. E. H. Hayes was elected a member of the Standing Committee in place of Mr. F. W. Johnson.
- 8. Submitted report dated September 24, 1896, from M. Cochran, Esq., City Analyst, on an analysis of water from the Fort stands.

Resolved,—That the water-rate be not levied for the present, and that inquiry be made from the General Manager of the Ceylon Railways what quantity of water he will require, and what he is willing to pay for it.

- 9. The Council resolved that no fresh assessment of property be made for the year 1897, but that in terms of section 139 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, the assessment contained in this year's book be adopted with such alterations as may be deemed necessary. The Sub-Inspectors to undertake the work of revision and to submit the same for the consideration of the Member of the Ward. Sub-Inspectors to be remunerated for their work.
- 10. Submitted Sanitary Officer's Report for second quarter, 1896; Progress Report brought up to August 31, 1896; Accounts brought up to August 31, 1896.
