Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—China Buckeer Light.

In continuation of Notice to Mariners No. 123, dated May 12, 1900, issued by this office, the Port

Officer, Rangoon, has given further information, dated August 31, 1900, that the light on China Buckeer will be discontinued on November 15, 1900, and a light will be exhibited from a lightvessel anchored 2 miles to the south-east (true) of the present China Buckeer lighthouse.

The light will be group flashing alternate red and white flashes every 45 seconds, each flash being of 5 seconds' duration and visible 12 miles.

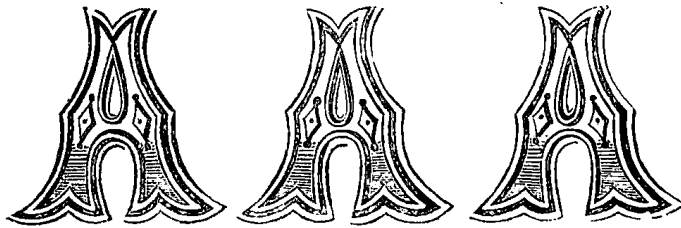
The lightvessel will be painted red with one mast, at which is hoisted a black cone and the words "China Buckeer" painted on each side.

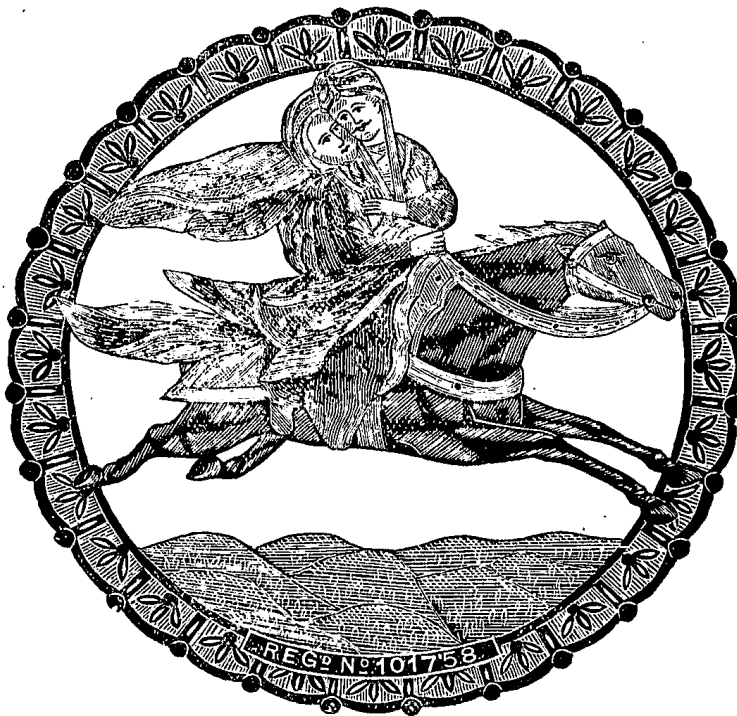
