MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, July 13, 1900.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 7, 1900.

Present:—Mr. H. White, Acting Chairman; Mr. F. H. Grinlinton; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. Stanley Bois; Mr. A. Forsyth; Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. H. A. Jayewardena; and Dr. Solomon Fernando.

The Minutes of June 8, 1900, having been printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of June 8, 1900, be confirmed.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. Jayewardenea sked-Why the drains of Molawatta, Chapel place, and other places in the New Bazaar Ward, for which estimates were sanctioned, have not been commenced yet.

The Chairman replied that concrete blocks for the side drains are nearly ready, and the process of laying them

will begin shortly.

- Pursuant to notice, Mr. R. H. Morgan moved "that in the Chairman's memorandum of the 22nd August, 1898, with regard to the Volunteer band, the words 'Havelock Town park' be substituted for 'Racquet Court.'
 Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.
- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the petition of the tax collectors of the Municipal Council be considered."

Mr. James Peiris seconded.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that Council do go into Committee to consider the petition."

Mr. James Peiris seconded.

[Council in Committee.]

The petition having been considered, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the petition be reforred to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. A. Forsyth, Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Mr. James Peiris -three to form a quorum.'
Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Council having resumed, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the report of the Committee be adopted." Mr. R. H. Morgan seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that in future all objections to assessment be considered. by the Standing Committee.

Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna seconde d.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the Sea street improvement and drainage scheme be undertaken at once, and that the Chairman be authorized to spend thereon the sum of Rs. 10,000 'reserved on account.'" By leave of Council the motion was amended by substituting the words "as soon as possible" for "at once."

The motion so amended was seconded by Mr. Arthur Alvis and carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved for a return showing in detail the working of the Health Department for 1899, giving full particulars of (a) income and expenditure; (b) the houses of tenements served; (c) the number of buckets, carts, bulls, and men employed, and their actual cost.

Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna seconded.—Carried.

The return was laid on the table.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias presented a petition from the residents of Old Moor street, and moved that it be read and considered.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

The petition was accordingly considered.

8 & 9. The petition from certain residents of 2nd Division, Maradana, praying for permission to erect a temporary pandal at Temple road was not presented by Mr. C. Perera.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved "that directions be given for the removal of the cross overmade

on the tramway line at the northern side of the Maradana Junction."

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded. Mr. James Peiris moved as an amendment "that the matter be referred to the Special Committee re-appointed on February 9, 1900, to consider, inter alia, rules in connection with the tramways.'
Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

11. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that an estimate be submitted to carry out the drainage scheme, Maradana District, for which provision has been made in the Budget.'
Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten seconded.—Carried.

12. Pursuant to notice, Mr. James Peiris moved "that a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. A. Perry, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Mr. James Peiris be appointed to report upon the present system of removing night soil; to ascertain how far it can be more economically and efficiently worked; and what reductions, if any, can be made in the charge for conservancy and clearing of cess--three to form a quorum."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

13. The Supplemental Budget No. 1 of 1900 was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. H. A. Jayewardena moved "that the Supplemental Budget No. 1 of 1900 be sanctioned."

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded. — Carried.

14. A report dated July 3, 1900, of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 19, 1900, for the revision of by-laws with reference to the Draft Ordinance to amend the first proviso to section 127 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, so as to provide for the exemption of buildings used for educational purposes from rates, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that the report be adopted."

Mr. H. A. Jayewardena seconded.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved as an amendment "that the opinion of the Special Committee be adopted."

Mr. R. H. Morgan seconded.—Carried.

15. A letter No. 51/10453 of June 13, 1900, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the strip of land required from the rifle parade ground for widening Parson's road, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Resolved,-That the Chairman do convey the thanks of the Council to the War Office for their liberality. 16. An application to the Governor in Executive Council to close Tanque Salgado road and divert the traffic to the Uplands road was laid before the Council.

Dr. Solomon Fernando moved "that the proposal to apply for sanction be deferred till the next Meeting of Council."

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

17. A memorandum dated July 4, 1900, by the Acting Chairman, with reference to railway crossings within Municipal limits, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved the adoption of the memorandum. Mr. F. H. Grinlinton seconded.—Carried.

18. A notification from the Chairman that Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa had vacated his seat as Member of this Council by absence from three consecutive General Meetings was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa be restored to his office."

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

19. An application from Mr. A. Weinman, Municipal Inspector for the Fort Ward, for two weeks' leave of absence from June 1, 1900, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the application be allowed."

Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

20. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to June 30, 1900, and Progress Report of Work done for June, 1900, were laid on the table.

21. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for February, 1900, were laid on the table.

22. The City Analyst's report on the town water for June, 1900, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

23. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on shops used for the sale of kerosine, poison, and gunpowder for June, 1900, were laid on the table.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, June 16, 1900, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated June 12, 1900.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; C. M. Fernando, Esq.

- The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 19 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1899 to May 31 on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table :-Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during May and register.
- 4. Read letter dated May 30, from Mr. J. Guthrie, Auditor, reporting that he had audited the accounts for March and April and found the same correct.

Resolved,—That the attention of Mr. Guthrie be directed to the resolution of the Council requiring a monthly audit of accounts.

- 5. The following correspondence was submitted and read:-
 - (a) Letter No. 13, dated May 19, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has confirmed the addition to by-law 18, chapter XV., of No. 19
 - (b) Letter No. 14, dated May 21, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating that it is the desire of the Government that the taking of the Census within Municipal limits should be managed by the Chairman, the funds being provided by Government.

Resolved,-That the Colonial Secretary be informed, in reply, that the Council accedes to the proposal that the taking of the Census should be managed by the Council as before, on the condition named.

- (c) Letter No. 16, dated June 4, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating, in reply to the Chairman's inquiry, that an Ordinance will shortly be introduced to amend section 127 of No. 7 of 1887, so as
- (d) Circular letter No. 91, dated June 9, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of a report by the Superintendent of Public Works, Grenada and St. Vincent, on the manufacture and use of
- concrete pipes for road drainage.

 (c) Letter dated June 13, from Mr. A. Philip, in continuation of previous correspondence respecting the metal despatch box allowed him for keeping Municipal papers.

Resolved unanimously,—That Mr. Philip be informed, in reply, that the Council is unable to accept the statement that the boxes supplied to Members are their individual property. The boxes are the property of the Municipal Council, and were supplied to Members for use only while holding office; there is nothing on record in support of Mr. Philip's contention, and it is within the recollection of those Members who were present at the time of the resolution. tion, to purchase the boxes was adopted that it was understood they were to be returned on vacation of office.

In accordance with notice, Mr. Fernando presented a petition from residents within the extended limits of the Municipality complaining of the extension of the Municipality, and moved that the same be referred to a Special-Committee for report.

This was seconded by Mr. Vanderwall.

The petition was read. The motion was opposed by Messrs. Beven, Sproule, and Gibbon.

The Chairman pointed out that the question of extension had been evidently fully considered at a Meeting of the Council on March 19; 1898, a Special Committee was appointed on July 16, and their report was adopted at the Meeting on November 19. He had the matter under consideration and had visited Ampitiya, and had arranged to visit other localities which had been included in the new limits.

Mr. Fernando, with leave of the seconder and permission of the Council, withdrew his motion.

7. Read report and recommendation by the Health Officer in respect of cesspits on premises Nos. 6 and 7,

King street; No. 34, Trincomalee street; and Nos. 224 to 234, Peradeniya road.

Resolved,—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owner or occupier of premises Nos. 6 and 7, King street; No. 34, Trincomalee street; Nos. 224 to 234, Peradeniya road, to empty and close the cesspits on the said several premises, and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.

8. Additional by-laws regulating water service, prepared and submitted by the Special Committee appointed, in 1899 to consider questions connected with water supply, were laid on the table. They had previously been brought before the Council at the Meeting of the Council on June 17, 1899, and referred to a Special Committee, who had

been unable to deal with them before the end of the year.

SIR,-I HAVE the honour to submit my report for the month of May.

Scavenging.—The town during the month was clean and properly scavenged.

The full complement of carts and coolies were employed for this purpose, as was ascertained by the occasional presence of an Inspector, at the muster of Mahaiyawa.

Market.—Clean and in good order.

Food Supply.—Ample and of good quality. 468 cattle, 122 buffaloes, and 294 sheep and goats were inspected dan passed during the month as fit for human consumption. Fish of good quality and fresh vegetables were always procurable.

Bakeries.—Clean and well kept.

Boutiques were periodically inspected. I found the articles exposed for sale in them of good quality and fit for the food of man,

Water Supply.—Pure and ample.

Alleys.—I am glad to be able to report that the alleys are being improved by their respective owners, in accordance with instructions given to them by me. Those at Trincomalee street are all being improved, and the alley in Castle Hill street belonging to Mr. B. de Alwis, is now in a sanitary condition, it having been altered and greatly improved.

Cooly Lines.—Same as when last reported upon. The lines belonging to the Municipality, situated in Castle Hill, should be removed to the railway approach road, where there is ample room for a permanent set of lines, and where also there is ample latrine accommodation.

Drainage. - Surface drains kept in good order. Deep drains objectionable and insanitary by reason of defective construction.

General Health.—Good. Mortality not more than the average.

(iii.) The centre of the road to be used only by carriages and hackeries.

The Chairman replied that he will call the attention of the Superintendent of Police and ask him to endeavour to improve the regulation of traffic in the bazaar.

- (2) Would it not be practicable to have the drains in the bazaar where the shops are covered with movable planks about 3 ft. wide to be used as a side walk, the planks to be removed when drains are flushed?

 The Chairman replied that it was practicable.
