#### PROCLAMATIONS BY THE LIEUT.-GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Edward Noel Walker, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### E. NOEL WALKER.

WHEREAS by section 6 of "The Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, frame and establish such port rules, not inconsistent with the said Ordinance, as he may think necessary for any of the purposes in the several sub-sections of the said section specified:

And whereas certain port rules were duly framed, established, and promulgated for the Port of Colombo for the purposes of the said Ordinance by a Proclamation dated the Twentieth day of December, 1894:

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 23 of 1884 it is further enacted that whenever by any law or Ordinance of this Colony power is given to "the Governor in Executive Council," or to "the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council," or "to the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council," to make any rules or regulations under such law or Ordinance, such power shall be deemed to include the power of altering, amending, adding to, or repealing any rules or regulations so made:

And whereas it is expedient that rule 6 of the rules promulgated by the said Proclamation dated the Twentieth day of December, 1894, should be repealed:

Now know Ye that We, the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal rule 6 (appearing in the schedule hereto) of the rules promulgated by the said Proclamation dated the Twentieth day of December, 1894.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-nine.

#### SCHEDULE.

6. Any person may leave or go on board of any vessel arriving within the port having a qualified medical officer, upon a certificate being given by that officer to the pilot that such vessel is at the time of her arrival free from all contagious or infectious disease, and that she has been free from such during the voyage.

SIR,—WITH reference to Sir J. West Ridgeway's despatch No. 370 of 11th November, I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of a despatch addressed to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by Her Majesty's Minister at Brussels, enclosing copies of notes exchanged on the 5th January with the Belgian Government, recording the inclusion of Ceylon in the temporary commercial arrangement concluded on the 27th July last between Great Britain and Belgium, together with a copy of a notice on the subject published in the "Moniteur Belge" of the 11th January, and of the Blue Book in which the notes have been presented to Parliament.

MY LORD,—I HAVE the honour to forward herewith copies of my notes, and originals of the Belgian notes, which I exchanged yesterday with Monsieur de Favereau, as instructed by your Lordship's despatch No. 141 of this series, of December 27, 1898, recording the inclusion of Ceylon and of Lagos in the commercial temporary arrangement concluded between Great Britain and Belgium on 27th July last.


