Abdul Pakir Jainulabudeen Abdulkalam, this was the name of Indian's 11th president, who is called A.P.J. ABDUL KALAM in short. He was born to Mr. Jainul Abdeen and Mrs. Ashiamma. Dr. Abdul Kalam came from a modest family. He worked as a paper boy to support his father. He had 4 brothers and one sister. He was born on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1931 in the Temple City of Rameswaram.

He graduated from Madras University with Physics as his main subject. He wanted to be a fighter pilot. He studied aerospace engineering, later on he completed his PhD and become a scientist. He was involved in India's civilian space and military missile development programmer. Hence he is known as, 'The missile man of India'. Once he was asked whether he would like to be known as a teacher, a missile man, a scientist, a president or a statesman. Dr. Kalam replied that "I would like to be a teacher". On 27<sup>th</sup> July 2015, he breathed his last breath while giving a lecture to the IIM students. Not only India, but the whole world was filled with sorrow for this great man's death. We can rightly say that Dr. Abdul Kalam is an epitome of simplicity and humanity.

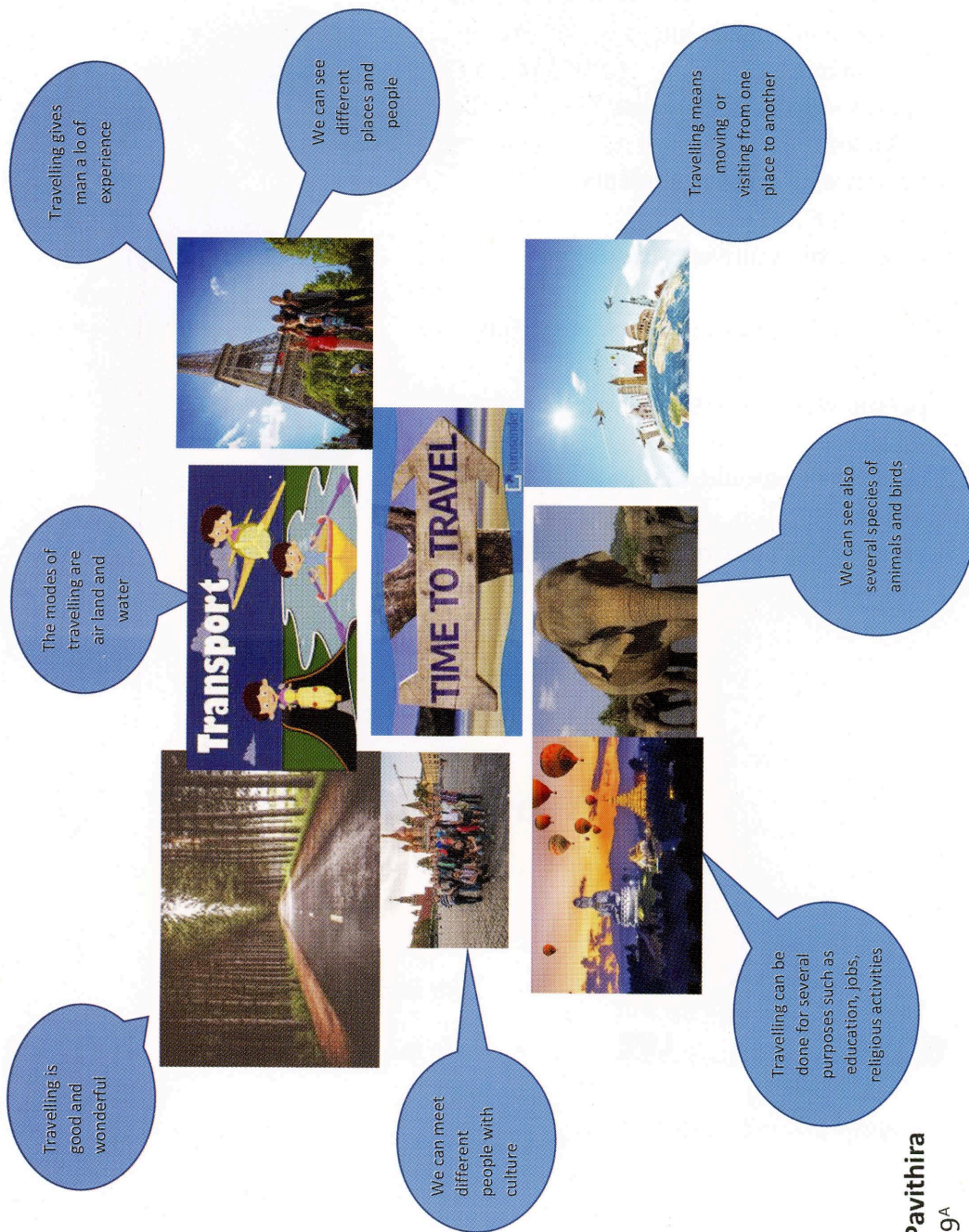

Some models were displayed in the Physics section. Some new inventions were there and the young inventors explained about them.

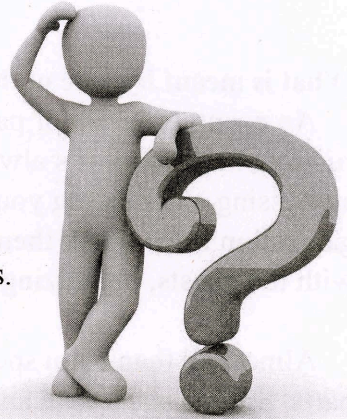

# Think Green

**Here are just a few ideas about reduce, reuse and recycle**

## Reduce

- Think before you print or photocopy! Print and copy as little as possible.
- Edit on screen not on paper.
- Use E-mail to minimize paper use.
- When you print or copy, does it double side.
- Circulate documents instead of making individual copy for everyone.
- Turn off unused or unneeded lights.
- Use natural lighting instead if electric lighting whenever possible.
- Select cold water for washing clothes.
- Don't use power strips to turn on all computers and dust equipment at once.

Plastic containers can become food box. Storage papers can become wrapping paper. The ways of reusing things are unlimited. All you need is to be creative.

## Recycle

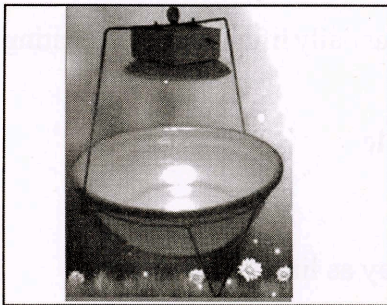
Production of recycled paper uses only half the water and  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the energy than newspaper.

Use mailed sheets for interface mail instead of envelopes. When using an oven, minimize door opening while it is in use. Shade outside air conditioning units by trees or other means.

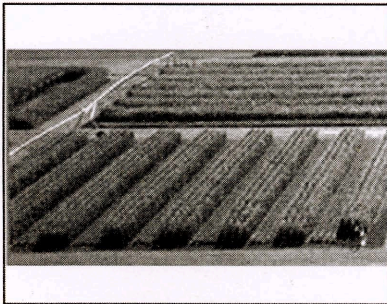

# Some strategies of organic farming in Sri Lanka



## Pheromone trap

It is used to trap male fruit fly and male melon fly. This trap attracts these fly within 2km. After being trapped these flies die of starvation.



## Inter cropping

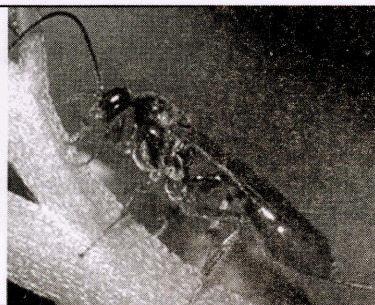
Capsicum is cultivated with long bean as an inter crop. By this practice, we can manage the leaf curl complex problem in capsicum. At the same time, the land utilization is also increased. Capsicum is the main crop in this practice, as it gets the partial shade by the long bean crop, it keeps the wetness in the soil. So less water could be used for the crop. Another advantage is that, being a legume, the long beans fix nitrogen in the soil



## Wormiculture

Worms help to decompose plant matter, aerate the soil and leave behind a rich fertilizer with castings. Thus worms in organic farming give a boost to the producing capacity of the soil.

## Attracting beneficial animals



One of the best ways to get rid of pests and harmful insects is to invite their natural predators. Bats and birds are the two most obvious choices. Lady bugs also can eat harmful insects.

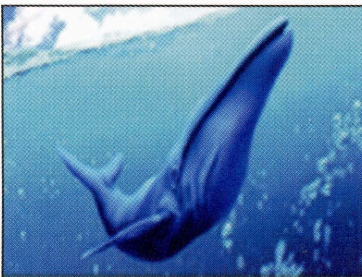
## Polar Bears

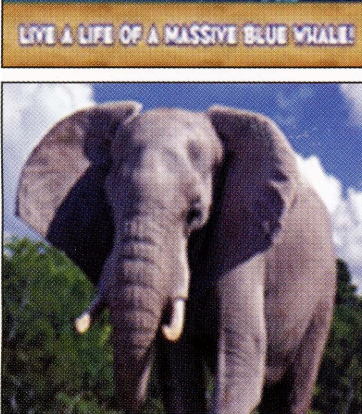
## Lions

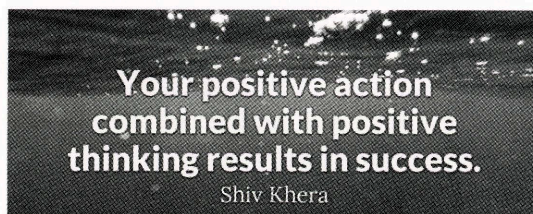

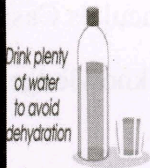

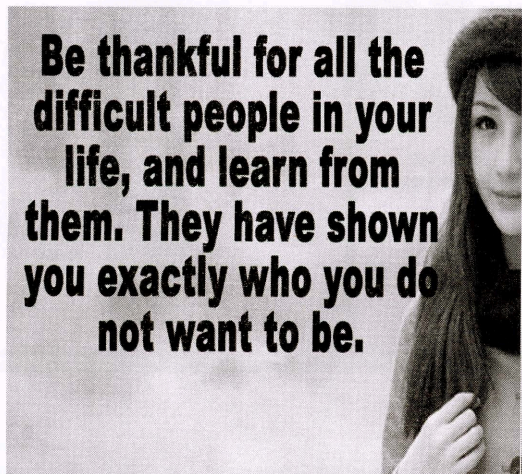
Since books are written in the best language, by editing and re-editing, the language the reader acquires is the best. So naturally the improvement of reader's language ability depends on the books he or she reads.

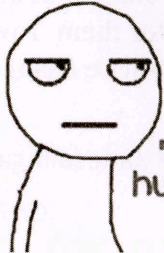

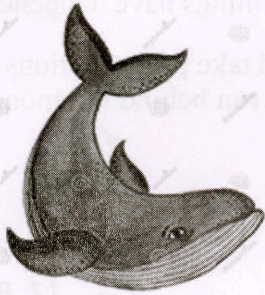
