

வைத்திய கலாநிதி சகுந்தலாதேவி சற்குணசீலன் 1948ம் ஆண்டு கொழும்பில் பிறந்தார். அவருடைய பெற்றார்களான கதிரிப்பின்னை சின்னத்தம்பியும் அவர் மனைவி பாக்கியமும் தங்களது சொந்த ஊரான இளவாலையில் உள்ள சித்திரமொழியில் குடியேறினார்கள். சகுந்தலாவிற்கு சச்சிதானந்தன், திருநாவுக்கரசு என்கின்ற அண்ணன்களும் தவமணிதேவி, சாரதாதேவி என்கின்ற சகோதரிகளும் இருந்தனர். இவர்களில் சகோதரி தவமணிதேவி தவிர மற்றைய மூவரும் அமரராகி விட்டனர்.

சகுந்தலா சிறுமியாக இளவுறை கன்னியர்மடப் பாடசாலையில் சேர்ந்து கல்விகற்றார். பல்கலைக்கழகம் செல்லும் கனவை நனவாக்க காங்கேசன்துரை நடேஸ்வராக் கல்லூரியில் இணைந்தார். அங்கே அவருடன் கல்விகர்ற மிகச் சிறந்த ஒட்டப்பந்தய வீரரான சற்குணசீலனுடன் காகல்வயப்பட்டார். பின்னர் கொழும்பு கல்லூரிக்க பல்கலைக் கமகக்கின் மரு<u>த்த</u>ுவக் தெரியப்பட்டு அசிரியராகக் மருத்துவரானார். கடமையாற்றிய சற்குணசீலன் உயர் கல்விக்காக இலண்டன் வந்தார். குறுகிய காலம் இலங்கையில் கடமையாற்றிய சகுந்தலா இலண்டன் வந்து சற்குணசீலனை மணந்து திருமதி சற்குணசீலன் ஆனார். தனன்ஜெயன் என்கின்ற ஆண்மகவுக்குத் காயாரானார்.

கிறந்த மருத்துவர் என்கின்ற புகழுடன் எந்த நேரத்திலும் யார் கேட்டாலும் உதவுகின்ற மனிதநேயம் மிக்கவராக அவரைத் தெரிந்த அனைவராலும் போற்றப்பட்டார். தான் கல்வி கற்ற நடேஸ்வராரக் கல்லூரி போரின் விளைவான உயர் பாதுகாப்பு வலயத்தின் சிக்கலால் காணாமல் போகின்ற சூழலுக்கும் காலகெகியில் அமிந்து போகம் நிலைக்கம் கள்ளப்பட்டது. சகுந்தலா கணவருடனும் எனைய நண்பர்களுடனும் இணைந்து பழைய மாணவர் சங்கத்தின் ஊடாக புதிய இடத்தில் நடேஸ்வராவைச் செயற்பட வைத்தார். இதே போலவே தமிழப்பாடசாலைகள் விளையாட்டுச் சங்கக்கிலம் ஸ்கொட் நிறுவனத்திலும் கணவருடன் இணைந்து செயற்பட்டார். அவருடைய செயற்பாடுகளின் பெறுமதியை அந்தந்த அமைப்புக்களின் பிரதிநிதிகள் மரணச்சடங்கில் ஆற்றிய இரங்கல் உரைகள் சான்று பயிரும்.

Sakunthala was a remarkable individual. She was talented, generous, kind, caring and thoroughly interesting. It is with sadness to think of those people who never had the good fortune of meeting her. I will miss her greatly, but along with everyone here, treasure her memory forever.

Are there any words worthy enough to write about our beloved Sakunthala? That was the big question that crossed my mind before I started writing.

I have known Sakunthala and her husband Seelan for nearly five decades. As a member of Nadeswara College Old Students Association (UK), as a friend and most of all as a classmate of Sakunthala and Seelan, I feel privileged to write a few lines about her and also to share my memories with you.

I recognised that Sakunthala was an ultra quiet but studious girl at Nadeswara during our high school time together. Following school, we all took different paths in life. However, I discovered that Sakunthala turned out to be very forward, extroverted and charity conscious when I met her again a few years later. Accidentally, when I was in living in Manchester I met Seelan and Sakunthala (who was working in Bury) and we re-established contact. My daughter Shamila and her son Jeyan were just toddlers and we used to discuss their milestones and future education. After recent events, that all seems like such a long time ago now.

Sakunthala would have been overwhelmed by the beautiful flowers on the day of her final journey; She would have been overwhelmed by all the support Seelan and Jeyan have received since her passing away. Most of all she would have been overwhelmed by all of her friends and family who are here today to celebrate her good life on her 31st day of her passing away.

My wife Thamayanthy and I had the opportunity to spend time with her very recently because the last Nadeswara College Executive committee meeting was held at my house on 26 May. Sakunthala is well known to prepare a variety of dishes for every function we hold. As usual Sakunthala walked in with a huge dish of chicken curry for the members to enjoy after the meeting. She even brought several loaves of bread to make sandwiches; such was the generosity of her spirit. We enjoyed a pleasant evening, full of laughter while reminiscing of old times and looking to future events. She was the last person to leave our house with Seelan at midnight, with pot plants that my wife gave her, as they are both keen gardeners. My wife and I feel very privileged along with other Nadeswarans who were present that night to have shared those last few enjoyable moments in her company. Sakunthala, school time sweetheart of Seelan, had her last supper at my home which is both a bittersweet and unforgettable memory for me. My wife and I were greatly shocked to hear of her admittance to hospital the next morning of 27 May at St. George's.

We still cannot absorb the fact Sakunthala will no longer be in our company, entertaining us with her hospitality and making us laugh by cheekily eating idiyappams with one hand. It is these little eccentricities unique to Sakunthala and our friends that will be sorely missed, but I take comfort knowing that she will be remembered always with fondness and praise.

At every annual Nadeswara College Sports Day in this country, Sakunthala would be the only noticeable figure amongst all of us for her 'Busy Bee' activities. She worked tirelessly in the fresh food cooking area until the time of leaving the grounds. Such was her devotion and loyalty to her beloved aima mater.

Sakunthala, in our last meeting of 26 May you mentioned a couple of things and in the 2005 Nadeswara College Old Students Association souvenir programme, you also wrote in your President's message of your vision. We promise you that we will endeavour to work towards your legacy and we feel that fulfilling your wish is the most wonderful tribute we can offer you.

Sakunthala has gone home now, guided by her faith and by the light of those she has loved and lost. Now, she is with them once more, leaving those of us who grieve her passing with memories she gave, the good she did and the dream she kept alive.

Nadeswarans will greatly miss you forever as I feel that your absence leaves a deep void that cannot be filled by anyone else.

Personally, my wife Thamayanthy will miss you terribly because you both used to talk about medical matters over phone for hours. Tears rolled down her eyes when she saw those two pot plants on your window sill after you had passed away. They have already grown. The same way your memories will grow and thrive among our family members.

Sakunthala, you held such a unique down to earth character, ready to help anyone at any time and you will always hold a special place in our hearts.

May your soul rest in peace.

During the meeting she smartly presented a case for SCOT to continue supporting an organisation for handicapped children in the Vanni, which she and her husband have personally visited some time ago. This is just an example of the care and dedication Sakunthala showed towards alleviating poverty and uplifting Tamil speaking people in Sri Lanka.

SCOT has lost a devoted member who stood by the values of our organisation; above all we have lost a good friend and a model human being.

May the good Lord grant her eternal life and her soul Rest In Peace.

Message From

Divisional Director Clinical Heamotology - Asford Hospital

At this moment of great sadness, it is a real honour for me to have the opportunity to pay tribute to, and give thanks for, the achievements of a dear friend and respected colleague. I do this on behalf of Ashford and St Peter's Hospitals but also at a much more personal level as I worked closely with Sakunthala almost every day for almost 20 years; and so I know first hand the true extent of her dedication to service on behalf of her patients. Each day she would be seen on the wards, in the clinics and in the laboratory actively engaged with staff and patients, and towards the end of each day there was an almost ritual sound of hurried footsteps accompanied by warnings that she "would miss her bus again!" She worked with us as one of a tightly knit team of four senior haematologists sharing equally in both the clinical case load and the on call responsibilities. In fact she would often give her time well beyond this commitment and be found to have popped into the hospital at weekends when she was not on call and even on occasions when she was supposed to be on annual leave. She made herself extraordinarily accessible to patients and regularly broke our golden rule of not giving out her home telephone number or pager contact to patients and relatives.

Over the years we all came to know her very well in other ways. We heard daily reports of her various domestic incidents ranging from trips to A&E with Jayan following minor cricket injuries, to the accidental burning down of her kitchen, to the successes and failures of her various garden purchases made during her annual trips to the Hampton Court Flower Festival. I know how deeply she relied on the support given freely to her by Seelan to be able to do her work as she wished as well as to manage her home responsibilities not least her work alongside him within the Tamil school and sports societies. I also know how incredibly proud she was of their son, Jayan, from her regular bulletins about his progress through school and college, and now in his working life. We often heard too about her extended family in Sri Lanka and worldwide including Switzerland, Canada and Australia and we learnt how much she enjoyed her many trips to visit relatives and friends abroad over the years.

At work her friendly, unassuming, approachable style, the style that gave her such a strong connection to her patients, could also sometimes disguise her professional seniority, her expertise as a clinical haematologist and her very high standards of practice excellence in both diagnostic morphology and in planning patient treatment and care. Within our team she provided particular leadership in several areas: in providing continuity for complex inpatient care, in developing a strong laboratory / clinical service interface, and in supporting the large anticoagulation service. She was known outside her Trust in the wider region as an accomplished haematologist. Many of you will know she often worked during her leave undertaking locum consultant posts at various hospitals across the UK,

often carrying these out to support her charitable works, and all the feedback we subsequently received from these attachments was strongly positive - sometimes even to the extent of trying to poach her away from Surrey! Throughout her career she had a special interest in teaching and training including medical students and laboratory scientists, but perhaps most of all the encouragement of junior doctors — and it is a testament to her as an inspiring teacher and role model that I know of four current consultant haematologists in London teaching hospitals who had their first haematology experience at graduate level working alongside Sakunthala at Ashford Hospital.

Last week I received many calls and messages expressing sympathy but also appreciation of her service and talents. These came not only from consultant and clinical staff in the hospital, but also from the wider Trust community including administrative and support service staff who all knew Dr Seelan. Our Trust Chief Executive and Chief Nurse both made time to visit the haematology department during the week and the Chairman of the Trust, Aileen McLeish is here with us today. I have been contacted by some of her previous colleagues from Ashford now living elsewhere including Tony Newman-Smith who telephoned from Lincoln and my own predecessor Dr Annabelle Baughan now based in the South of France in Marseille. I have heard from doctors in several other Trusts in the region where Sakunthala was particularly well known, including St Helier's Hospital, the Royal Marsden Hospital and East Surrey Hospital. There have been some very consistent themes linking these messages including reference to her beautiful personality, to her incredible dedication to patients, to stories of her personal support to colleagues at moments of difficulty in their own lives, and to an appreciation of her real talent in drawing together not only her own immediate and extended family but also the wider hospital and community families to which she belonged. On a different level, there was frequent mention of her famous fish cakes and other culinary contributions to the various departmental parties and celebrations which will clearly be much missed.

My memory of Sakunthala is that she was always busy, always positive, always compassionate, and that she always demonstrated great dignity and professionalism. She lived a life of service genuinely dedicated it to others; I believe she lived that life to the full; and I believe she lived it well.
