
CELEBRATING INDEPENDENT CINEMA IN THE PENINSULA

Jaffna is the capital city of the Northern Province of Sri Lanka, located on a peninsula of the same name. It is probably the only city in the world named after a musical instrument. 'Yalpanam' derives from an ancient musical instrument call 'Yazh' (Tamil; Yaal). It is a harp with the tip of the stem of the instrument was carved into the head of the mythological animal Yali.

The Jaffna International Cinema Festival is a non-partisan platform to explore contemporary forms of creative expression in cinema. Our main aim is to celebrate independent cinema in the peninsula, whilst creating an understanding of other cultures, promote harmony and mutual understanding through cinema. The festival promotes and encourages young filmmakers by screenings of their debut films and short films. We invite film enthusiasts, Sri Lankan and International, to visit Jaffna to experience the independent cinema of a new generation.

It is an honour and pleasure to welcome all of you to the Third Jaffna International Cinema Festival. After watching great film festivals, as someone who is incurably addicted to visual but miserably insufficient in creating them in films, I always return to my refuge in poetry with suppressed jealousy. Each great film is like a new language framed by nuanced and subtle world views. Watching them is like acquiring a new language in 90 or 120 minutes.

The idea of the global or international film festival has its origins in post-world war Europe. The conceptualization and presentation of festivals have been, predictably, influenced by Europe. However, it is important to remember that there were parallel film society movements in various parts of the world. These movements were spearheaded by film aficionados, film activists, writers, journalists, filmophiles and film makers.

There are hundreds, if not thousands, of great film festivals taking place each year in all parts of the world. The importance of the "holy trinity" of Venice, Cannes and Berlin is gradually being shifted to other places. And more and more alternative film festivals devoted to crucial themes such as human rights, indigenous resistance, and environmental activism are challenging the traditional role and mode of film festivals. There are festivals on Wheels or Travelling festivals too.

With its wonderful combo of local, global and diasporic the ICF offers a unique perspective and

curator excellence. Within a short time, what the Jaffna International Cinema Festival has achieved is significant. In his interview with a Canadian film and audiovisual journal some time ago, Dharmasena Pathiraja, this year's life time achievement award winner, and a cinematic magician with a mission, wondered how he survived as a filmmaker in Sri Lanka. Film making here is very challenging to say the least. Organizing an international festival is, at times, Sisyphean.

Cinema, like all art, is part reality and part dream. A society without good cinema is a society without dreams. Without cinema, we cannot dream. Without dreams we cannot be a coherent society.

The continued success of the Jaffna International Cinema Festival is dependent on all of us and our moral, and material support. And yes, our dreams too.

for introducing an award for the best national short film at the festival.


We hope that this festival will become a strong platform to experience various forms of moving images and visual arts that function as a witness, representation and historical documentation.

Further to pursuing a diploma in Film Making at the Sri Lanka National Film Corporation, Sri Lanka, he obtained his Master of Fine Arts in film-making from the Chung-Ang University in South Korea as a Korean Government Scholarship Holder (KGSP). Flying Fish, his debut film was nominated for the Tiger Awards at the International Film Festival of Rotterdam and was invited to more than 30 international film festivals around the world. He is currently working on this third film.



LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

In the fifties and sixties when Sinhala cinema was coming into its own with Lester James Pieris making a path breaking contribution to the aesthetics of the Sinhala film, Dharnasena Pathiraja entered the scene with a distinctive style and cinematic vision of his own. Pathiraja's vision shared little with Pieris' either in style or the subject matter. More concerned with the lower middle class than with the decadent aristocracy, whom Pieris focused on, Pathiraja's early films also captured an emerging ethos in cultural production: a language of the 'masses'.

This language idiom is expressly at the cross roads of a consciousness about the texture and complexities of the postcolonial state of Sri Lanka and of reaching out to an international audience. This consciousness has been his strength, and the audience has instinctively realized this as part of a new wave. Critics and the public have hailed him as the enfant terrible of the '70s.

Pathiraja began making films in the late '60s and '70s and took the film world in Sri Lanka by storm



with his astonishing new wave style in the tradition of Post-war European cinema. His debut film Sathuro (Enemies), a ten-minute short film won the Film Critics' and Journalists' Award in 1972. It was chosen as one of the best 10 films at the Bilbao Short Film Festival (Spain) in '72. His first full-length film, Ahas Gawwa (One league of Sky) bagged all the prestigious film awards at the Film Critics' and Journalists Awards, Sri Lanka. His Tamil film Ponmani (1977) was a powerful counterpoint to the main Stream Indian Tamil cinema.

From there onwards he began to make other award winning films and several tele features and documentaries. His films have been shown at prestigious films festivals around the world, including Moscow, London, Italy, India, and Singapore and have won acclaim. A graduate of the University of Peradeniya, he obtained his PhD in cinema studies from Monash University, Australia. He has taught at several universities in Sri Lanka and has been a pioneer in introducing film and television as a discipline to the curricula. He continues to teach and train emerging film makers and artistes at various institutes within the country.

He has also served on the jury of several international film festivals. In 2000, Pathiraja was awarded the 'Golden Lion' for his life time contribution to Sri Lankan cinema and in 2003 the first ever retrospective of his films was held at the Singapore International Film Festival followed by retrospectives at other international film festivals. Since then, retrospectives of his films have been held in several festivals, which include, Vessoul, France, Jogja Netpac Festival and others. In honouring his commitment to cinema, the Jaffna International Cinema Festival presents the Lifetime Achievement Award 2017 to Dr. Dharmasena Pathiraja.

RETROSPECTIVE



Dr. Dharmasena Pathiraja

Pathiraja graduated from the University of Peradeniya, Sri Lanka with an Honors Degree in Sinhala and Western Classical Culture in 1967. Subsequently, he began work as a lecturer in Drama and Performance Arts, and later obtained a PhD in Bengali cinema from Monash University. He learnt the language of cinema from the film society movement, which was very popular in Sri Lanka in the early sixties. He also recognized their sociopolitical limitations in a country which was heading for a period of deep turmoil. He was influenced by radical activists like Jean-Luc Godard and Third Cinema filmmakers like Fernando Solanas and Glauber Rocha. He is a recipient of several national awards and a nominee of many international festivals including Golden Prize , Moscow International Film Festival (Eya den loku lamayek, 1975), Silver Screen Award for Best Asian Feature Film, Singapore International Film Festival (Mathu Yam Dawasa 2002), Golden Hanoman Award. Jogja-NETPACE Asian Film Festival (Swaroopa 2014).

Agnès Varda

An honoree of the prestigious Honorary Oscars of 2017 awarded to 'honor extraordinary distinction in lifetime achievement, exceptional contributions to the state of motion picture arts and sciences, or for outstanding service to the Academy,' Agnes Varda was born in 1928 in Brussels, Belgium as Arlette Varda. The only female director of the French New Wave, she has been called both the movement's mother and its grandmother. Varda not only made films during the nouvelle vague, she helped inspire it. Her self-funded debut, the fiction-documentary hybrid 1956's La Pointe Courte is often considered the unofficial first New Wave film: when she made it, she had no professional cinema training (her early work included painting, sculpting, and photojournalism).

Her seminal work in 1962 Cleo from 5 to 7, a bold character study that avoids psychologizing, announced her official arrival. Over the coming decades, Varda became a force in art cinema, conceiving many of her films as political and feminist statements and using a radical objectivity to create her unforgettable characters. She describes her style as cinecriture (writing on film) and it can be seen in formally audacious fictions like Le Bonheur and Vagabond as well as more ragged and revealing autobiographical documentaries like the Gleaners and I and the Beaches of Agnes.



The relationship between mother and son is fraught with tension and silence. Having grown up in Italy, the boy is a cultural hybrid, which his mother struggles to understand, as she fights to live in a country to which she does not want to belong.

He has made several experimental short films before creating the 2013 web series a zerobudget project about his community in Italy.

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
