Dalrina Burah- is the daughter of the late Baba Askin Dane Suhood and Dane Engsie Sukhla. She is the sister of B. D. Suhood, the First Malay Commercial Pilot (1958) Armond Sukhla, Wita Rahim, Teruni Goonetillaka and Roshan wijesinghe, she is the wife of the late Hadjie Burah and mother of Tarini.

She had her early education at the Presbyterian Girls School where she excelled in sports becoming the senior champion (1948 - 1950) Games Captain and the First Malay to be Head Girl and then Captain of the School "Do You Know Contest Team" She joined Bishop's College in 1951 and became Senior Champion in that year and

the first Malay Prefect of that School. She was selected to represent the Muslims in Colombo to read a message of goodwill in Arabic at the Colombo Plan Exhibition. She was also the first Malay Montessori Trained Teacher (1954) and the first Malay President (1981) of the Housewives Association of Kandy. where she organized a raffle in aid of the Intensive Care Unit, luncheon for the Home for the Aged, distribution of dry rations and clothing's for the refugees of the ethnic disturbances and the flood victims in Kandy. She has also trained Muslim girls in house-keeping, sewing, cookery and English and found them iobs abroad.

As the President of the Kandy Malay Association Women's

Bureau she organized a raffle in aid of the Cancer Ward and drugs, wheel-chairs and kitchen sinks were donated to this ward.

She happened to be the first Asian to be employed at Revlon, London.

After the demise of her husband, she left Kandy to settle down in Colombo permanently. She is the present General Secretary of the S.L.M.A. Rupee Fund rendering a dedicated and devoted service to the Malay community especially the poor children, youth and the aged. She is 67 years and still takes an active part in the welfare of the Malay Community in Colombo and suburbs.

EJAAN BETUL DALAM BAHASA MELAYU CORRECT SPELLING OF MALAY WORDS -

I wish to thank Saudara Farook Thaliph for providing us with a list of Malay words for items found in the household. I entirely agree with his sentiments that if we do not do something to preserve our language we will surely lose whatever we have. Kalau hilang Bahasa nanti hilang Bangsa.

At the moment the Terang is the only source of information available to our children who aspire to sit the GCE Ordinary level Examination. As such we should as far as possible avoid misleading them. I noticed several spelling mistakes in the list of words in Saudara Thaliph's article and I wish to give a list of corrections. In doing this I do not in any way intend to disparage all that Saudara Thaliph has done and is doing to preserve our language. I fully agree that we should preserve the Malay that we speak in Sri Lanka. But this should be only for purposes of speech. Sri Lankan Malay has never been written in the Roman Script before. All our manuscripts which our ancestors produced have been in the Gundul script. Therefore when we adopt a new script let us follow the procedure adopted by our cousins in the rest of the Malay world.

I give below the correct spelling of the words in Saudara Thaliph's article that have been inadvertently misspelled.

Please remember that the letter T in Bahasa is always soft such as tulis-write, taruh-place, tidur-sleep. It is not necessarily to use the for the soft t. Therefore it is wrong to say theekar. The letter i is pronounced as in "pin" and not as in "find" and therefore it is not necessary to use ee to say plate "piring" and not peering. The English sound $ext{ch}$ is rendered by the letter $ext{c}$. Therefore to wash is $ext{cuci}$ and not $ext{chuch}$ or $ext{chochi}$.

The letters **oo** is not used in bahasa and its sound is rendered by the use of the letter **u**. Bagus good and not bagoos. Pukul to hit and not pockool.

Do Mosques Today Play a Pivotal Role?

If one studies the role of mosques at the time of Prophet Muhammed (SA) and compares, it with the role played by present day mosques, one will surely observe a big difference. In the time of the Prophet (Sal) the mosque was not only a place of worship, but also a place for performing all duties which are performed in the way of God. All social, cultural and political activity even Jihad (war) was initiated and launched from the mosque. No Muslim familiar with the history and traditions of the Prophet (Sal) can deny

In mosques there are presently groups propagating Islam to the gullible masses by replacing the Quran with publications of their own version and interpretation of Islam. This is in stark opposition to Prophet (Sal) order that he fell behind firstly the Quran and secondly his traditions for the guidance of the Muslim community. Worse still mosques have also now become the battleground to settle increasing sectarian difference in the once united Muslim community.

Believers will only do a few Islamic customs and they will not have any iman (faith) left. The Quran will be read only. They will not even know the commands and prohibitions. Their only thought will be about eating and drinking. They will forget Allah (God). They will worship money only. They will become women slaves. Mosques will be many, jamaaths (congregations) will be few, men will be women like, dresses thin (transparent). women domineering. They will not be contented with earning little they will not be satisfied with earning much."

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A HISTORY OF THE PHILIPPINES

The history of Philippines is the story of a nation of many different groups of people living in more than 7000 Islands and Islets. For most of the country's history. these groups were geographically isolated from each other. They were separated not only by sea. but also by rivers and mountains ranges. Most of the land is mountainous and volcanoes are ded through out the country, and the settlements are on the plains between the mountains along the coast. The busy port of Manila on Luzon is the capital and largest city. Mindanao is the second largest island containing the highest mountains in the Philippines.

The new theory that Malays were the original inhabitants indemic to the Malay World or Malayo - Polynesian World, as now been substantially confirmed and proved beyond doubt by the precious discovery of the fossil of the "Java Man" and other evidential criteria. Therefore writings based on the old theory will have to be

treated as dismissed. The earliest known people on the Philippines lived in the Tabon caves on Palawan during pre historic times. The earliest known migrants to the Islands were the Negritos, who arrived about 50,000 years ago. But most modern Filipinos are descended from Indonesians and Malays, who began to settle in the Philippines about 3000 BC pushing the Negritos in to the forests and the mountains. The rest of the population is descended from recent immigrants. They include Chinese. Spaniards. Americans, Indians and Japanese. In the Philippines the Malays settled down in almost all the Islands. They had a systems of administration based on the social unit called "Barangay" from the Malay term "Barangay" meaning a boat. The "Barangay" were generally small and most villages boasted of only 30 to 100 and their population varied from 100 to 500. Most communities were

coastal or reverine in orientation. This was due to the fact that the principal sources of protein came from the seas and the rivers, the people relying more on fishing than on hunting for sustenance.

Each "Barangay" or community was independent and had its own ruler called Raja or Datu. The "Barangay" Chieftain was not only a ruler but also the judge and legislator, adviced by a council of elders. Most members of the community were

related to one another by blood or marriage. Besides kinship. common economic interests and shared rituals formed the bases for community cohesion. The "Barangay" was a social rather than a political union, each one a separate entity with only informal contacts with one another. Although they lived in fragmented society the people of these island belonged to the same Malay race. They spoke different dialects belonging to the Philippines branch of the Malayo - Polynesian language family.

Some critics may say that the Slendang has been disposed with, due to the wearing of the saree which is more graceful and satisfies all the essential requirements of a woman's attire in keeping with Islamic and Malay Cultural patterns. Yes, indeed, but with the ever changing 'Saree wearing style; the length of the saree has been reduced (probably due to the cost or being excessive to cover so little).

Why this aversion to wearing the Slendang by our Malay sisters? Why subscribe to 'Body Exposure ' western styles of dress ?
