Local and General.

Weather. We are having very strange weather for July. About a fortnight ago we had a heavy shower of rain of over two inches at Vaddakkudi. After that for a few days we had a very heavy blow from the south west, followed the past week by light winds and local showers. According to the Ceylon Observer we have had more rain in the past six months than the mean for 32 years.

Jaffna College. The young man coming out from America for this institution is a Mr. Ward not Mr. Wade as printed in our last issue.

Geography of Ceylon. A new and revised edition of the Geography of Ceylon has been published by the Christian Literature Society of Colombo. There is a good map (in colour) of the Island and outline maps of all the Provinces besides several illustrations. The

chapters on physical features, natural characteristics, races and religions, and historical outline, are full of interest and will be found very useful. The edition is a great improvement on previous editions and the low price (30 cents) brings it within the reach of all.

Obituary. On Saturday morning last Mrs. Harriet Mills Champion, wife of the youngest son of Rev. G. Champion and daughter of Dr. and Mrs. C. T. Mills of Maneyay, passed away to her eternal home. She was ill but for a few days and her death was unexpected. She was married less than a year ago and was looking forward to a long life of happiness and usefulness, but the Lord called and she went rejoicing in full assurance of faith and love. The family are sorely afflicted and have our loving sympathy. The funeral services were largely attended and were conducted by Rev. B. H. Rice and W. P. Nathaniel.

Student Mission. The annual meeting of this mission will be held at Tellipally this evening, the 24th inst., commencing at 6.30 p.m. All are most cordially invited to be present. Messrs. Mathias Chittampalam, Proctor T. S. Cooke, and J. K. Sittampally, Esq., are expected to address the meeting.

Mr. John C. Muttiah, the proprietor of Raja Town estate, who has been in Jaffna for the last year, leaves for his estate by the steamer of Aug. 4th.

Clerical Examination. An examination for admission as Govt. Clerks will be held on the 25th September next. Jaffna will be one of the centres of examination.

Postal. The post master of Jaffna has recovered from his illness, and gone for a change to the residence. The preliminary proceedings taken against the Singhalese clerk for extracting Rs. 245 from a postal packet, have not yet been closed. The papers have been forwarded to the Court at Matara to examine the sender of the money.

District Court. The number of criminal cases committed for trial before the District Court has considerably increased, and the District Judge was fully engaged for the last four days last week, including Saturday in hearing criminal cases. The civil work of the Court suffers in consequence, as criminal work takes precedence over civil.

Police force for Koddikamam. Instructions have been given to the head men, by the Government Agents, to ascertain the probable risk that could be recovered from the house holders residing within a radius of two miles from the Koddikamam Market, with a view to establish a police force there.

The late Mr. P. W. Conolly. The news of his death in England was known in Jaffna on Monday the 13th inst. Mr. Conolly was one of the Judges who made themselves popular in Jaffna. The Jaffna Law Library owes its origin to Mr. Conolly. The Jaffna Bar with Mr. Kanagasalai Advocates as their spokesman, did honor to Mr. Conolly's name, by placing on the records of the District Court the expression of regret at the death of one of its eminent Judges. The District Judge Mr. Sanders spoke highly of Mr. Conolly's attainments and acceded to this request of the Bar members.

Young Jaffna. Mr. A. M. C. Tampoe University scholar, has passed his Ceylon University Entrance Examination. He is at present in Germany to learn German, and French for his civil service examination in August, 1904.

Steamers. Both the steamers "Lady Havelock" and "Lady Gordon" having gone to the Maldives on special service the "S.S. Amia" has been chartered by the company for service round the Island. This arrangement is greatly inconvenient to the public, because the "S.S. Amia" is quite inadequate for the work.

The Jaffna Steam Navigation Company. The steam boat "Jaffna" is expected to arrive here about the first part of August next. A European Captain has been engaged to work the steam boat, and the first trip on arrival here will be to the island of Delft, which has been arranged by the company trusting that all persons interested will travel in it paying a bonus of Rs. 4 per head. This will be a pleasure trip.

Harringe. Mr. P. Moses, chief clerk P. C. Jaffna, was married on the 15th inst. The ceremonies were conducted on a grand scale. Mr. Moses is very popular in Jaffna and he was the recipient of many presents including a valuable purse. We wish Mr. Moses and his bride long life, happiness and prosperity.

—The British Empire has increased by over 267,000 square miles since the King came to the throne.
